2 Resolutions

Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a **non-binding** ordinary resolution the following:

'That, the Remuneration Report be adopted by Shareholders, on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Note: a vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Resolution 2 – Re-election of Director – Eric (Jin Huei) Lim

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

'That, Eric (Jin Huei) Lim, who retires in accordance with Clause 14.2 of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, retires and, being eligible and offering himself for re-election, is re-elected as a Director, on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.'

Resolution 3 – Election of Alternate Director – Aaron Sim Kwang Liang

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

‘That, pursuant to and in accordance with Clause 14.4 of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, Aaron Sim Kwang Liang, an Alternate Director who was appointed by the Board of Directors in accordance with Clause 16.7 of the Constitution on 3 June 2025, retires and being eligible, is elected as an Alternate Director of the Company, on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.’

Resolution 4 – Ratification of prior issue of Placement Shares

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

‘That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the prior issue of 26,923,077 Placement Shares issued under Listing Rule 7.1 on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.’

Voting exclusion

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of:

- (a) **Resolution 4:** by or on behalf of any person who participated in the issue of the Placement Shares, or any of their respective associates.

The above voting exclusion does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way;
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting prohibition

Resolution 1: In accordance with sections 250BD and 250R of the Corporations Act, a vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report, or a Closely Related Party of such a member.

A vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on this Resolution, and:

- (a) the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if this Resolution is connected with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

If you purport to cast a vote other than as permitted above, that vote will be disregarded by the Company (as indicated above) and you may be liable for breaching the voting restrictions that apply to you under the Corporations Act.

In order for your proxy to be valid, your Proxy Form (and any power of attorney under which it is signed) must be received by the Proxy Cut-Off Time. **Proxies received after this time will be invalid.**

Please note that:

- (a) a member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (b) a proxy need not be a member of the Company; and
- (c) a member of the Company entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise, but where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

The available Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides that an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, if it does:

- (a) the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed);
- (b) if the proxy has 2 or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution – the proxy must not vote on a show of hands;
- (c) if the proxy is the chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on – the proxy

must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and

- (d) if the proxy is not the chair – the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed).

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- (a) an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the company's members;
- (b) the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting;
- (c) at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded, or is otherwise required under section 250JA on the resolution; and
- (d) either the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting or the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting.

2.5 **Chair's voting intentions**

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention. In exceptional circumstances, the Chair of the Meeting may change his/her voting intention on any Resolution, in which case an ASX announcement will be made.

If the Chair is your proxy, either by appointment or by default, and you have not indicated your voting intention, you expressly authorise the Chair to exercise the proxy in respect of Resolution 1 even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of the Company's Key Management Personnel.

2.6 **Submitting questions**

Shareholders may submit questions in advance of the Meeting to the Company. Questions must be submitted by emailing the Company Secretary at bdonovan@arguscorp.com.au no later than 5 business days before the Meeting.

Shareholders will also have the opportunity to submit questions during the Meeting in respect to the formal items of business. In order to ask a question during the Meeting, please follow the instructions from the Chair.

The Chair will attempt to respond to the questions during the Meeting. The Chair will request prior to a Shareholder asking a question that they identify themselves (including the entity name of their shareholding and the number of Shares they hold).

3. **Annual Report**

In accordance with section 317 of the Corporations Act, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to discuss the Annual Report, including the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2025.

There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to:

- (a) discuss the Annual Report which is available online at <https://magres.com.au/investors-media/#reports> or on the ASX platform for “MAU” at www.asx.com.au;
- (b) ask questions about, or comment on, the management of the Company; and
- (c) ask the auditor questions about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chair about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than five business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's Annual Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so.

4. **Resolution 1 – Remuneration Report**

4.1 **General**

In accordance with section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report for the year ended 30 June 2025 in the Annual Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out the remuneration policy for the Company and the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors. If Resolution 1 is not passed, the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

If the Company's Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more (**Strike**) at two consecutive annual general meetings, Shareholders will have the opportunity to remove the whole Board, except the managing director (if any).

Where a resolution on the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at two consecutive annual general meetings, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders at the second annual general meeting a resolution on whether another meeting should be held (within 90 days) at which all Directors (other than the Managing Director, if any) who were in office at the date of approval of the applicable Directors' Report must stand for re-election.

The Company's Remuneration Report did not receive a Strike at the 2024 annual general meeting held on 27 November 2024. If the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at this

Meeting, Shareholders should be aware that if a second Strike is received at the 2026 annual general meeting, this may result in the re-election of the Board.

The Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders as a whole to ask about, or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

4.2 **Additional information**

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

Given the personal interests of all Directors in the outcome of this Resolution, the Board declines to make a recommendation to Shareholders regarding this Resolution.

5. **Resolution 2 – Re-election of Director – Eric (Jin Huei) Lim**

5.1 **General**

Clause 14.2 of the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 both provide that a Director (excluding the Managing Director) must not hold office without re-election past the third annual general meeting following that Director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Clause 14.2 of the Constitution provides that a retiring Director is eligible for re-election.

Mr Eric (Jin Huei) Lim (*Non-Executive Chairman*) was last elected as a Director at the Company's 2022 annual general meeting held on 28 November 2022. Accordingly, Mr Lim retires by rotation as a Director at this Meeting and, being eligible and offering himself for re-election, seeks re-election pursuant to Resolution 2.

If Resolution 2 is passed, Mr Lim will be re-elected as a Director of the Company with effect from the conclusion of the Meeting.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, Mr Lim will not be re-elected as a Director of the Company.

5.2 **Eric (Jin Huei) Lim**

Mr Lim is currently a senior executive officer with Standard Chartered Bank and holds the position Head of Wholesale Banking Finance, Southeast Asia. Prior to joining Standard Chartered, he has held positions with OCBC Bank, General Electric and a number of executive positions in the US and Asia Pacific region including Finance Director of GE Money Japan and Global Financial Planning and Analyst for GE Commercial Finance (Healthcare Financial Services). He has also had extensive audit experience with GE Corporate Audit leading a variety of engagements ranging from process to financial audits.

Mr Lim is qualified with an MBA and a Bachelor of Accounting degree.

Mr Lim does not currently hold any other material directorships, other than as disclosed in this Notice.

If re-elected, the Board considers Mr Lim not to be an independent Director by virtue of his substantial shareholding in the Company.

Mr Lim has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

5.3 **Board recommendation**

The Board (other than Mr Lim who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) supports the re-election of Mr Lim for the following reasons and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2:

- (a) Mr Lim's significant experience in the banking and financial markets are important additions to the Board's existing skills and experience; and
- (b) Mr Lim has an in-depth knowledge and understanding of the Company and its business, and his continuing role as a member of the Board will benefit the Company.

5.4 **Additional information**

Resolution 2 is an ordinary resolution.

6. **Resolution 3 – Election of Alternate Director – Aaron Sim Kwang Liang**

6.1 **General**

Clause 14.4 of the Constitution provides that Directors may at any time appoint any person to be a Director, either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Directors. In addition, Clause 16.7 of the Constitution provides that Directors may appoint any person to be an Alternate Director and an Alternate Director is subject to the provisions of the Constitution which apply to Directors.

Clause 14.4 of the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 both provide that a Director appointed either as a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Directors must not hold office without re-election past the next annual general meeting of the Company following the Director's appointment.

Mr Aaron Sim Kwang Liang (Aaron Sim) was appointed as an addition to the existing Directors, in the role of an Alternate Director to Mr Hian Siang Chan (*Non-Executive Director*) on 3 June 2025. Accordingly, Mr Sim retires at this Meeting and, being eligible, seeks election pursuant to Resolution 3.

If Resolution 3 is passed, Mr Sim will be elected as an Alternate Director of the Company to Mr Hian Siang Chan with effect from the conclusion of the Meeting.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, Mr Sim will not be elected as an Alternate Director of the Company to Mr Hian Siang Chan.

6.2 **Aaron Sim Kwang Liang**

Mr Sim is the Managing Partner of White Dot Group Inc., a firm in management and advisory services for mining companies across Australia and Southeast Asia. With over 25 years of experience in financial advisory, Mr Sim focuses on corporate and wealth management solutions tailored to ultra-high-net-worth individuals.

Mr Sim has held senior banking relationship roles at UBS, UOB and DBS Bank in Singapore. Mr Sim holds a Bachelor of Commerce degree from the University of Otago, New Zealand.

Mr Sim does not currently hold any other material directorships, other than as disclosed in this Notice.

The Company confirms it took appropriate checks into Mr Sim's background and experience and that these checks did not identify any information of concern.

Mr Sim is considered by the Board (with Mr Sim abstaining) to be an independent Director. Mr Sim is not considered by the Board to hold any interest, position or relationship that might influence, or reasonably be perceived to influence, in a material respect his capacity to bring an independent judgment to bear on issues before the Board and to act in the best interests of the entity as a whole rather than in the interests of an individual securityholder or other party.

Mr Sim has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as an Alternate Director.

6.3 **Board recommendation**

The Board (other than Mr Sim who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) supports the election of Mr Sim as an Alternate Director to Mr Hian Siang Chan and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

6.4 **Additional information**

Resolution 3 is an ordinary resolution.

7. **Resolution 4 – Ratification of prior issue of Placement Shares**

7.1 **General**

On 19 August 2025, the Company announced that it had received firm commitments for a single tranche share placement to raise A\$35 million (before costs) through the issue of 26,923,077 Shares (**Placement Shares**) at an issue price of \$1.30 per Share (**Placement**).

On 26 August 2025, the Company issued the Placement Shares to sophisticated, professional and institutional investors without prior Shareholder approval using the Company's available placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 4 seeks the approval of Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 to ratify the issue of the Placement Shares.

7.2 **Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.4**

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions to Listing Rule 7.1 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, effectively uses up part of the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1. This reduces the Company's capacity to issue further Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12 month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

Listing Rule 7.4 provides an exception to Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in a general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rule 7.1), those Equity Securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of Listing Rule 7.1.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 4 will be to allow the Company to retain the flexibility to issue Equity Securities in the future up to the 15% placement capacity set out in Listing Rule 7.1 without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 4 is passed, 26,923,077 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit under Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of Equity Securities it can issue or agree to issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, 26,923,077 Placement Shares will continue to be included in the Company's 15% limit under Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue or agree to issue without obtaining prior Shareholder approval, to the extent of 26,923,077 Equity Securities for the 12 month period following the issue of those Placement Shares.

7.3 **Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.5**

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to the ratification of the issue of the Placement Shares:

- (a) The Placement Shares were issued to sophisticated, professional and institutional investors, none of whom is a related party or Material Investor of the Company (**Placement Participants**). Argonaut Securities Pty Limited and Shaw and Partners Limited (together, the **Joint Lead Managers**) acted as Joint Lead Managers to the Placement. The Placement Participants were identified through a bookbuild process, which involved the Joint Lead Managers seeking expressions of interest to participate in the Placement from existing contacts of the Company and clients of the Joint Lead Managers.
- (b) A total of 26,923,077 Placement Shares were issued using the Company's available placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.
- (c) The Placement Shares are fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.
- (d) The Placement Shares were issued on 26 August 2025 at \$1.30 each.
- (e) The proceeds from the issue of the Placement Shares have been or are intended to be applied towards:
 - (i) in respect to the Company's Lady Julie Gold Project:
 - (A) infill and extensional drilling;
 - (B) feasibility study optimisation work;
 - (C) early site works and key contractor hires;
 - (D) flexibility to purchase long lead items; and
 - (ii) general working capital.
- (f) There are no other material terms to the agreement for the subscription of the Placement Shares.

(g) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

7.4 **Additional information**

Resolution 4 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.
