X2M delivers strong start to the 2026 Financial Year

Quarterly Activity Report and Appendix 4C

1Q FY26 Highlights¹

- Revenues of \$2.1 million, up 25% on the previous corresponding period (pcp)
- Gross profit of \$0.9 million, up 10% on the pcp
- Operating costs were \$1.7 million, up 3% on the pcp
- Adjusted EBITDA² loss of \$0.6m was an improvement of 7% on the pcp
- Enterprise/government customers increased to 86, up 13% on the pcp
- Net cash outflows from operating activities for the quarter were \$1.67 million
- Total cash as at 30 September 2025 was \$1.8 million
- Net debt reduced from \$5.5 million at 30 June 2025 to \$0.7 million by 30 September 2025

Australian Internet of Things (IoT) technology company **X2M Connect Limited** (ASX:X2M) ("X2M" or "the Company") provides its quarterly activity report and Appendix 4C for the period ended 30 September 2025 (1Q FY26).

X2M CEO Mohan Jesudason said: "New contracts secured in the latter part of FY25 and during this quarter have provided strong momentum heading into the remainder of FY26, with key operational metrics aligning well and establishing a solid platform for growth. Pleasingly, of the contracts signed to date, approximately \$4 million in revenue remains to be recognised over the remainder of FY26.

"Operationally South Korea has been the standout with Taiwan ready to deliver product into the renewable energy sector and the UAE building a strong pipeline of prospects with encouraging early success.

"Underlying this is a stronger balance sheet following a successful capital raise early in the quarter and materially reduced debt level through debt-to-equity conversions and debt repayments.

Collectively these developments place the Company in a good position for the remainder of FY26."

Operational overview

During the second half of the FY25 financial year, X2M expanded its product range, repriced core offerings and expanded channels to market. Collectively this has had a positive impact on sales results with mandates already secured for revenues in excess of \$6 million to be recognised in this financial year. For reference, last year's full year revenue was \$6.5 million. Of the contracts secured to date, \$4 million is yet to be recognised. Circa \$2.5 million of this is expected to take place in the second quarter with some flow over into the following quarter ensuring continued momentum over the next couple of quarters.

X2M's \$3 million public safety contract with the City of Seoul for 100,000 personal 'Help Me' public safety devices is progressing with deployments expected to commence in December and completion scheduled for the 3Q FY26. The City of Seoul has announced its intention to roll out 1 million of these devices over time. The scope of this project has been expanded, is now valued at \$3.3m and will now be deployed across 2Q and 3Q FY26.

The company entered the United Arab Emirates early in the last financial year in a partnership with Dicode. X2M is contracted for a software-based SaaS business model with each 100k devices added expected to generate future annual EBITDA of approx. A\$0.4 million. The term of the agreement is ten years and Dicode intends to expand this offering beyond the UAE into the broader Middle East region. Dicode has now commenced commercial rollouts in the UAE for remote monitoring of gas meters and we are extending the solution to address cooling water meter monitoring. X2M and Dicode exhibited at WETEX 2025 in Dubai, an event run by the Dubai Electricity and Water Authority and attended by approximately 70,000 people.

In Taiwan, where the Company earlier launched "Hive.AI by X2M", a data aggregation and AI enablement platform for renewable energy operators, a good prospect pipeline has been developed with first sales now secured.

Financial overview

SaaS and maintenance revenues for the quarter were \$0.33 million.

X2M achieved total revenues for 1Q FY26 of \$2.1 million, up 25% (1Q FY25: \$1.7 million), reflecting strengthening markets in South Korea and Taiwan.

The gross profit for 1Q FY26 was \$0.92 million, up 10% on the pcp (1Q FY25: \$0.84 million). This primarily reflected the increased revenue in South Korea.

Operating costs for 1Q FY26 were 3% up on 1Q FY25. This was primarily a result of costs associated with capital raising and debt restructuring.

The adjusted EBITDA³ loss was \$0.6 million versus a loss of \$0.7 million in the pcp.

Net cash outflows from operating activities during the quarter were \$1.6 million versus \$1.1 million in 1Q FY25. This was largely due to timing of payments to the ATO and cash advances in South Korea.

Net cash outflows from investing activities were \$0.7 million for the reporting period, mainly driven by continued investment in capitalised development.

Net cash inflows from financing activities were \$2.5 million, mainly attributable to funds received from Placements and repayment of debt.

Total cash at 30 September 2025 was \$1.8 million.

Related party payments in Appendix 4C section 6.1 of \$108K represent director's fees and salary payments.

Enterprise and government customers

X2M's enterprise and government client base continued to rise steadily, reaching 86 at 30 September 2025, up 13% on the pcp⁴. X2M continued to win repeat orders during the quarter. These customers collectively deploy a broad range of devices from water and gas meters to smart homes onto the X2M platform, which in turn, drives the Company's SaaS and recurring revenue base.

Placement and Entitlement Offers

X2M completed a number of balance sheet strengthening activities during the quarter raising \$5.4 million in new capital through a Placement and Entitlement Offer.,

Funds raised substantially strengthened X2M's balance sheet, allowing significant reduction in the Company's debt, while also positioning X2M well for its next growth phase including business expansion and product enhancements across its growing addressable market opportunities.

Net debt as at 30 September 2025 was \$0.7 million, substantially down from \$5.5 million at 30 June 2025.

Outlook

X2M CEO Mohan Jesudason said: "We entered the FY26 financial year with good momentum built on solid business gains and it is good to see this playing out in the results for the quarter. We expect to see this momentum continue into the second quarter as we deploy contracts already secured and with a significant pipeline of new prospects."

X2M Connect Limited (ASX:X2M) is an Australian technology company that has developed and commercialised a patented proprietary Internet of Things (IoT) solution which delivers productivity improvements, cost savings and improved public safety to enterprise and government clients in the utilities sector. The strategy is to stay focused on the utility sector where X2M has proven performance and tap the growing artificial intelligence, renewable energy generation and battery storage markets' demand for data collection, analytics and device control.

X2M's technology connects devices such as water, gas and electricity meters and other utility sensors to the internet, enabling data exchange and the remote control of these devices. The collection of large volumes of data from meters or sensors and our ability to go back and control devices also provides the basis for artificial intelligence or machine learning applications to build upon our platform. The Company generates revenue from the sale of hardware and monthly subscription fees under Software as a Service arrangements.

X2M now has connected more than half a million devices to its IoT platform and distributed intelligence solution, providing real-time information and control to a steadily increasing customer base operating over multiple communications technologies.

X2M's current focus is on servicing the utility sector in the Asia-Pacific region, where it has a significant number of government and enterprise customer relationships already in place. The addressable market across the region is large and importantly, the addressable market within X2M's existing customer base is also large with penetration growing. Going forward, X2M will look to continue its global expansion, with subsidiaries already operating in Japan, South Korea, Taiwan and China.

X2M has recently extended its focus into the Middle East by licensing its platform to Dicode Smart Connect Electronics LLC, a Dubai based business.
