

QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT PERIOD ENDING 30 SEPTEMBER 2025

HIGHLIGHTS

Lazio Project ('Lazio')

- Geothermal lithium in brine project awarded a prestigious A\$3.62 million grant by the Italian Ministry of Environment and Energy Security (**MASE**) in partnership with RINA SpA (**RINA**) and the University of L'Aquila (**UNIVAQ**).
- Technical work completed includes well and platform design, with a reservoir assessment led by STEAM Srl (**Steam**) ongoing.
- RINA continues to conduct the Pre-Feasibility Study (**PFS**) for the Lazio Project's processing facilities, which is to be followed by the draft Environmental Impact Assessment (**EIA**) for the processing facilities.

Gorno Project ('Gorno')

- Argent Partners continued to lead the process of securing a sale and/or attracting a strategic partner following 100% consolidation of interest in Vedra Metals Srl (**Vedra**).

Corporate

- Strategic changes to the Board structure and management, with the appointment of Mr Peter Edwards (Chairman of the Victor Smorgon Group) as non-executive Chairman and Mr Geraint Harris as director and CEO.
- Successful non-renounceable pro-rata entitlement offer raised \$3.43 million from Victor Smorgon Group and \$4.39 million in total (before costs) following completion after the period end.
- Group cash balance of A\$3.83 million reported as at 30 September 2025.

Altamin Limited (ASX: AZI) ('Altamin' or 'the Company') is pleased to provide its Quarterly Activities Report for the period ended 30 September 2025 ('Quarter').

Lazio Project

Altamin continued to advance the Lazio Project according to its planned development timeline under its team of highly experienced owners and consultant's team, who have combined expertise in Italian permitting regulations, geothermal energy, sulphate of potash (**SOP**) and lithium project development.

Lazio is an exciting and unique development opportunity aligned with the objectives of Italy's revised Mining Decree (August 2024), the EU Critical Raw Materials Act (**CRMA**) and the UN's Sustainable Development Goals. Altamin is aiming to recover critical raw materials (lithium and boron) and potassium from the high-temperature geothermal brines at the site located approximately 30km north of Rome.



The processing route at Lazio envisages using the renewable energy from the high-temperature Cesano geothermal brines to drive a conventional mechanical evaporation process without the need for surface evaporation ponds. This has the potential to deliver significant energy cost savings, while providing a closed-loop, environmentally superior process for recovering the valuable materials from geothermal brines with significant advantages compared to other production from brine extraction technologies.

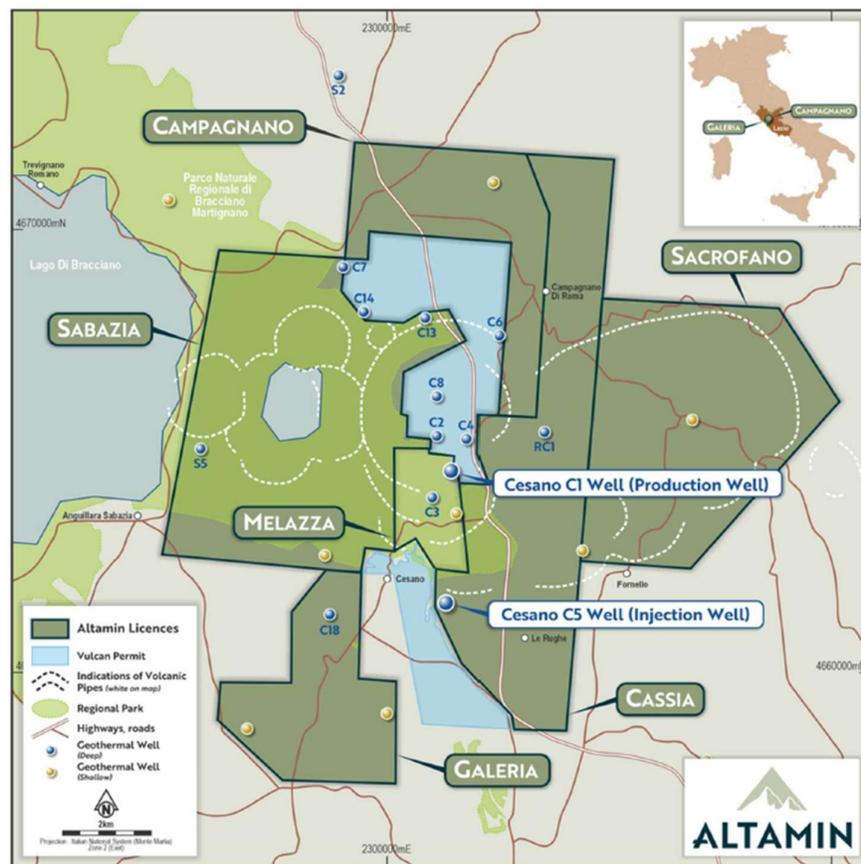


Figure 1: Lazio Project Exploration Licences

A\$3.62m of Grant Funding for Lazio Project

During the Quarter, Altamin Limited announced its participation in a successful research project grant submission made under the Italian Ministry of Environment and Energy Security's Mission Innovation 2.0 program. Together with RINA and UNIVAQ, Altamin secured approval for Mission Innovation eligible expenditure of EUR 2.825 million (A\$5.045 million¹), of which EUR 2.027 million (A\$3.62 million³) is refundable in aggregate to the project partners for eligible expenditure. All expenditure relates to Altamin's Lazio Project.

The funding will be applied to the innovative *Geothermal Brines for Innovative Supply of Critical Raw Materials (BRAIN)*² project to test scale-up of an innovative process to demonstrate the possibility of obtaining commercial-grade SOP, lithium and boron combined production using a unique geothermal energy powered process pathway.

The studies for the BRAIN project will include a full EIA which will form part of the future permitting work required for the Lazio project.

A lifecycle assessment (LCA) will also be conducted to evaluate environmental impacts for alignment with the EU’s “Do No Significant Harm” (DNSH) principles and Italian environmental laws, enhancing the Lazio project’s sustainability credentials.

The BRAIN project has potential to increase European self-sufficiency in Critical Raw Materials (CRMs) and improve the overall sustainability of raw material extraction by moving away from traditional, high-impact mining and processing operations.

The BRAIN project aims to have a lasting impact on Italy’s CRM and strategic materials supply chains by fostering innovation in brine extraction technologies to offer higher recovery efficiencies, lower environmental impact, and scalability over conventional methods. If successful, it will set a benchmark for sustainable and efficient CRM extraction.

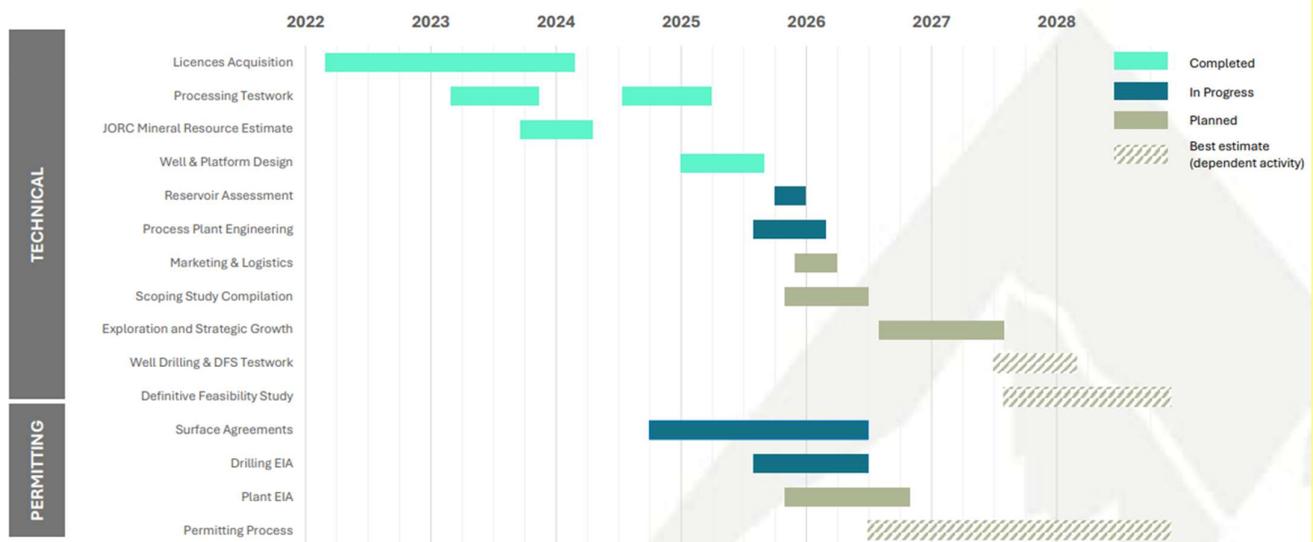
Development Activities

The Lazio development timetable continues to be advanced with key technical, permitting, and strategic workstreams progressing in line with the project plan (refer to Figure 2).

During the Quarter, Altain’s geothermal consultants, Steam Srl, commenced the geothermal reservoir assessment, which will be a key component of the upcoming scoping study. The drilling and surface well facilities design is also part of Steam’s mandate and will be incorporated in the EIA to support an application for a drilling permit.

The PFS for the processing facilities continues to be prepared by RINA and that will be followed by a draft EIA for those facilities. Both RINA and Steam have deep expertise in preparing EIA applications for projects in Italy.

Gorno Project

Environmental Impact Assessment

The final Ministry of the Environment and Energy Security (**MoE**) decree in relation to the EIA for the Cime Exploration Licence remains pending, however there are no fatal flaws foreseen in the opinion of assisting consultants. Management continues to maintain safety and security and continue environmental and baseline environmental monitoring activities, in collaboration with environmental consultant groups Ramboll and Hattusas.

Strategic Equity & Sale Process

As previously reported, London-based Argent Partners are engaged to lead the strategic equity and/or divestment process of Gorno required as a condition of the sale agreement with Appian Italy B.V. (**Appian**), which resulted in Altamin achieving 100% ownership of the Gorno Project by acquiring Appian's 29.85% interest in Vedra.

Corporate

Board & Management Refresh

During the Quarter, Mr Peter Edwards joined the Board as non-executive Chairman. Peter brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to the Company and represents the Company's majority shareholder, Victor Smorgon Group.

Mr Geraint Harris was also welcomed back to the Company as director and CEO. Having previously led the Company in developing the Lazio project and advancing the Gorno project, he has a deep technical knowledge of Altamin's assets and its key stakeholders, as well as operating a project in Italy. Over his 30-year career he has held senior positions across multiple commodities, geographies and operations.

To ensure the Board retains its agile, streamlined focus, Mr Alexander Burns resigned as Executive Chairman. Non-executive director Mr Marcello Cardaci also resigned from the Board.

Accelerated Non-renounceable Entitlement Offer

During the Quarter, Altamin initiated an accelerated non-renounceable pro-rata entitlement offer (ANREO) at an offer price of \$0.025 per share to raise up to approximately \$6.46 million (before costs).

The offer was strongly supported by the Company's largest shareholder, Victor Smorgon Group, which committed to take up its full entitlements of approximately \$3.43 million in the institutional component of the offer.

The retail component of the offer closed after the Quarter end, with additional proceeds of \$0.96 million, for a total of \$4.39 million (before costs) raised.

The funds raised will be predominantly applied towards project development and related activities at the Lazio Project, and to maintaining the Gorno Project.

Cash Balance

Group cash as at 30 September 2025 was A\$3.83 million as shown in the attached Appendix 5B Quarterly Cashflow Report. This balance includes proceeds of the institutional component of the ANREO.

Capital Structure

At the date of this report there are a total of 750,014,754 ordinary shares, 24,700,000 unlisted options and 2,250,000 performance rights on issue, following the issue of 38,446,377 ordinary shares on completion of the retail component of the ANREO, as announced 17 October 2025.

Financial and Additional Information

The attached Appendix 5B Quarterly Cashflow Report provides an overview of the Company's financial activities for the quarter ended 30 September 2025 on a consolidated basis.

Exploration expenditure for the period was \$0.42 million (item 1.2(a) of the Appendix 5B).

The total amount paid to executive and non-executive directors of the entity and their associates for the quarter (item 6.1 of the Appendix 5B) was \$251,924 for salaries, superannuation and directors' fees, including lump-sum payments due on the termination of the Executive Service Agreement of Mr Alexander Burns.
