Our sustainability focus addresses our commitment to deliver positive economic, environmental, and social outcomes including in the areas of sustainable procurement and agriculture.

The following policies regarding sourcing and use of Soymeal in poultry feed production have been put in place to ensure that Ingham's products meet the requirements of its customers:

- Inghams is committed to using soy supply chains that are certified deforestation and conversion-free on a mass balance basis.
- Ingham's uses Soymeal produced in Argentina and the United States of America sourced from several suppliers.
- Soymeal suppliers to Inghams supplying from Argentina have implemented a technology-based traceability monitoring program to ensure compliance with our commitment. The program is independently audited and assured by Control Union.
- Soymeal from Argentina is sourced from processing facilities accredited with the Round Table on Responsible Soy (RTRS) Chain of Custody.
- Soymeal from the United States of America is under the US Soy Sustainability Assurance (SSAP) certification.
- The proportion of Soymeal in poultry feed varies and depends on factors such as raw material availability and value, animal welfare and nutrition requirements and sustainability factors.
- Imported Soymeal must be imported via permits issued by the Department of Agriculture Fisheries and Forestry (DAFF) with Approved Arrangements that that are certified disease and contamination free.
