Farm Pride Foods Limited (ASX:FRM)

QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT AND APPENDIX 4C

Farm Pride Foods Limited (“**Farm Pride**”, “**Company**”) is pleased to provide the following update to shareholders for the quarter ended 31 March 2026 (“**Quarter**”).

During the Quarter, the Company had net operating cash inflows of \$1.756m, including net receipts from customers of \$27.408m.

The Company continued to enhance its farming, biosecurity, production and grading operations by investing in its infrastructure with cash outflows from investing activities of \$1.888m for the Quarter. The largest outflow was spent on the development of a new hen rearing farm in central Victoria, with a rearing capacity of 600,000 hens per annum.

The Company continues to face a challenging environment with pricing pressures due to increased available egg supply and higher costs. These higher costs include the increase in fuel costs which has and is expected to continue to result in higher transport, packaging, feed and other costs.

In order to mitigate these pressures and costs, the Company remains focused on capital expenditure and operational improvements to increase efficiency and reduce costs.

Following the end of the Quarter, the company successfully renewed those portions of its financing facility with National Australia Bank that were up for renewal.

Payments included in Item 6.1 of the accompanying Appendix 4C relate to the Director’s fees, the Managing Director’s salary and other items as disclosed in the accompanying Appendix 4C.

Financing update

Farm Pride advises that subsequent to the quarter end, a \$2 million invoice financing facility which was due to expire on 30 April 2026 has been extinguished and increased against the Company’s Asset Limit Facility.

CFO resignation and appointment

Farm Pride advises that Mr Tony Enache has resigned as Chief Financial Officer (CFO) and Mr Michael Edelstein will commence in the role as CFO on 4 May 2026.

Michael Edelstein is a seasoned financial executive with significant experience in corporate finance and strategic planning having worked across South Africa, the United Kingdom and Australia. He has a strong track record of supporting growth businesses through financial leadership, operational discipline and strategic execution.

Mr Edelstein’s previous roles include Chief Financial Officer of EduCo, an EQT portfolio company, where he led a successful exit process, and Chief Financial Officer of The Arinex Group, an Airtree and Skip Capital portfolio company.

Mr Edelstein holds a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Cape Town.

The Board thanks Tony for his assistance with the turnaround of the Company’s financial position over the last 3 years in the role as CFO and wishes him all the best in his future endeavours.
