Aspire Mining Limited (ASX: AKM) (**Aspire** or the **Company**) is pleased to present its Quarterly Activities Report for the period ending 31 March 2026 (the **Quarter**).

## Company Highlights

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- **Aspire holds a 100% interest in the Ovoot Coking Coal Project (OCCP)**, which has:
  - Mining Licence MV-017098 which is valid until August 2042, and able to be extended twice for additional 20-year terms;
  - JORC (2012) compliant **Total Coal Resource of 219.4 Mt** and **Total Coal Reserve of 130.1 Mt** supporting a forecast 31-year mine life from commencement of production and **NPV<sub>10</sub> exceeding US\$1.5 billion<sup>1</sup>**; and
  - Key statutory approvals in place to support the planned mining, processing, transportation and logistics infrastructure construction and operation.
- **Aspire maintains a healthy balance sheet**, with cash of approximately US\$3.7 million at the end of the Quarter and no debt outstanding.

## Quarter Highlights

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- **EPC Contract Advancement:**
  - CHPP 30% Design Review was conducted in Tangshan, China in early February 2026;
  - CHPP 50% Design Review meeting conducted in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia in early April 2026; and
  - Gobi Infrastructure Partners LLC (**GIP**) was engaged as the Main Subcontractor, who will be responsible for design expertising (localisation) and onsite construction in Mongolia.
- **Murun – Uliastai Highway Project Tendering:**
  - Tender for the Murun–Uliastai Highway Project submitted on 6 January 2026;
  - Aspire was formally invited by the Public-Private Partnership (**PPP**) Centre of Mongolia (**PPP Centre**) following successful review of its submission to negotiate the PPP Agreement on 23 March 2026. Negotiations for the PPP agreement are ongoing within the statutory timeline; and
  - Aspire attended and featured at the “Public-Private Partnership: Investment Opportunities Week” event jointly organised by the Ministry of Economy and Development (**MED**) and the Mongolian National Chamber of Commerce and Industry (**MNCCI**) between 20-23 April 2026.
- **Project Funding:**
  - Supported China Export & Credit Insurance Corporation’s (**Sinosure**) due diligence process to progress Supplier’s Credit Insurance for the EPC contract for CHPP and ERT coal handling infrastructure; and
  - Advanced debt finance preparations, including securing Bank of Mongolia approval to issue USD-denominated Over-the-Counter (**OTC**) bonds and engaging corporate brokers.

## OCCP Development

Aspire advanced its key infrastructure projects during the Quarter, with a primary focus on the Murun–Uliastai Highway Project tendering process and advancing CHPP detailed design with CCTEG-IEC.

- **CHPP and ERT Infrastructure:** The EPC contract with the International Engineering Company of China Coal Technology and Engineering Group Corp (**CCTEG-IEC**) for Coal Handling and Preparation Plant (**CHPP**) and Erdenet Rail Terminal (**ERT**) coal handling infrastructure became effective on 30 December 2025 following completion of the first advance payment.

During the Quarter, a 30% Design Review for the CHPP was completed in Tangshan, China in early February, followed by a 50% Design Review in Ulaanbaatar after quarter end. Reviews focused on refining designs submitted during tendering, with CCTEG-IEC and Aspire teams working collaboratively to address challenges whilst ensuring compliance with Mongolian standards.

CCTEG-IEC engaged Gobi Infrastructure Partners LLC (**GIP**) as its Main Subcontractor. GIP participated in both Design Reviews and will provide critical support in the expertising (localisation) of designs to ensure compliance with Mongolian standards, before taking responsibility for on-site construction under CCTEG-IEC's direction.

- **Murun–Uliastai Highway Project:** The Company successfully submitted tender for the Murun–Uliastai Highway Project, for which the Company is the main private sector proponent, by the 6 January 2026 deadline. Following review, the PPP Centre confirmed the submission met requirements and formally invited the Company to commence negotiation of the PPP Agreement on 23 March 2026. Negotiations between working groups established by both parties are ongoing.

The project featured prominently at "Public-Private Partnership: Investment Opportunities Week" (20–23 April), jointly organised by the MED and the MNCCI. Company management attended the event, where government-side parties expressed positive sentiment that the PPP Agreement is in the process of being finalised.

During the Quarter the Company commenced establishing entities in Singapore and Mongolia to implement the project. Singapore is a favoured holding company jurisdiction given its status as a global financial centre and its double taxation treaty with Mongolia, and this structure will support both equity investment and debt financing for road construction. The Company has also begun preparations to engage a Project Management Consultancy to assist with EPC tendering and contract management. It is intended to appoint a head EPC contractor under an Early Contractor Involvement (**ECI**) model, to expedite design and site mobilisation, with conversion to a fixed-price EPC arrangement thereafter.

- **Project Funding:** The Company plans to raise construction debt in 2026 by issuing bonds in the Mongolian OTC market from its subsidiary Khurgatai Khairkhan LLC. The Mongolian OTC market, regulated by the Mongolian Association of Securities Dealers (**MASD**), has developed into a robust financing hub for professional investors, with over USD 500 million raised in 2025 alone. Bank of Mongolia approval has been obtained to issue these bonds in USD denomination. This debt-led approach is consistent with the Company's objective of minimising shareholder dilution. The Company is also progressing preparation of an updated JORC-compliant Coal Reserve estimate reflecting its revised, lower-capex development plans.

In parallel, the Company has been supporting CCTEG-IEC in completing Sinosure's Know Your Customer (**KYC**) and related due diligence on Khurgatai Khairkhan LLC. Securing Supplier's Credit Insurance from Sinosure will enable CCTEG-IEC to finance the deferred 60% of the EPC contract price, payable over two years post-commissioning of the CHPP and ERT infrastructure. This process remains ongoing.

- **Community Relations:** The Company maintained an active community presence across Khuvsgul province during the Quarter, keeping residents informed of progress on the Ovoot Coking Coal Project. Local anticipation continues to build around near-term employment and procurement opportunities, and in anticipation of the Murun–Uliastai Highway Project proceeding, which will bring significant benefits to the region. Fodder harvested from within the Ovoot mining license area was distributed to local herders in February and March, providing timely support while natural pastures were depleted and under snow cover. Other activities included engagement with a local transportation union on freight opportunities related to upcoming construction, and sponsorship of the annual Khuvsgul Ice Festival.

## Corporate

The Company's financial position remained healthy at the end of the Quarter with USD 3.7 million held in cash and cash equivalents. The accompanying Appendix 5B summarises cash flows for the Quarter, including:

- Exploration and Evaluation expenditure of US\$316 thousand; and
- Development expenditure of US\$596 thousand under Property, Plant and Equipment, for which approximately half was attributable to a tax payment relating to the first advance payment against the EPC contract with CCTEG-IEC, and the other half supporting the progression of Detailed Design for other Ovoot site infrastructure.

Payments to related parties and their associates totalled US\$166 thousand, comprising Directors' fees and executive remuneration.

NordSteppe Private Investment Fund LLC (NordSteppe) completed the final tranche of an off-market transaction to purchase all remaining shares previously held by Talaxis Ltd (Talaxis) on 20 March 2026. Finalisation of this deal confirmed that Aspire has regained exclusive marketing and other rights over the Ovoot and Nuurstei projects as previously forecast.<sup>2</sup>

Following acquisition of shares from Talaxis, NordSteppe have further traded these off-market to other investors but have retained their right to sales royalties calculated on gross revenue from Ovoot coking coal sales.
