March 2026 Quarter Activities Report

Operations Review

The property leasing business remained stable in March 2026 Quarter. Leasing revenue totalled RMB1.1 million (AUD 227k) during the March 2026 Quarter, unchanged from RMB1.1 million (AUD 238k) in the December 2025 Quarter. The slight difference in the AUD equivalent is attributable to exchange rate movements between the two quarters.

The status of the exhibition centre remained unchanged from the December 2025 Quarter.

The existing vacancy (including areas subject to negotiation) rate being:

Warehouse (41,750m ²)	77%	(77% in December 2025)
Factories (17,784m ²)	67%	(67% in December 2025)
Exhibition Centre	95%	(95% in December 2025)
Administrative Building	46%	(46% in December 2025)

New tenancies of floors of the office building and a factory were signed in the March quarter. Other new tenancies of the exhibition centre are actively negotiated.

During the March 2026 Quarter CAQ's receipts from customers was \$0.23m (RMB1.1 million) which was decrease from the December 2025 Quarter \$0.24m (RMB1.1 million).

Financial

At the end of the Quarter the Group had cash at bank of \$0.205m.

Payments to director related parties and their associates during the quarter totalled \$Nil.
