2 DETAILS OF THE OFFER

2.1 The Offer

At the Company's last extraordinary general meeting held on 25 May 2026, the Company received approval to raise \$3,000,000 before costs (**Initial Placement**) from the issue to Sophisticated and Professional Investors (**Placement Participants**) of:

- (a) 3,000,000,000 Shares, under Resolution 5 at the last extraordinary general meeting. On 3 June 2026, these 3,000,000,000 Shares were issued to Placement Participants for an issue price of \$0.001 per Share.
- (b) 1,500,000,000 free attaching options (**New Options**), under Resolution 6 at the last extraordinary general meeting. By this Prospectus, the Company is making the Offer for New Options, by invitation only, to the Placement Participants.

Each New Option will be exercisable at \$0.003 per New Option on or before 5:00pm (AEST) on 15 June 2029.

The New Options will be offered on a free attaching basis to the Placement Shares and no consideration will be payable. No funds will be raised as a result of the issue of the New Options, however, proceeds will be raised from the exercise of each New Option, if and when such New Option is exercised by the holder of the New Option.

As announced to the ASX on 26 May 2026, the Company advised it received firm commitments from Placement Participants to raise a total of \$4,000,000 before costs. This capital raise comprises of \$3,000,000 per the Initial Placement as described above, and an additional placement of \$1,000,000 through the issue of an additional 1,000,000,000 Shares together with 500,000,000 free-attaching options on the same terms as the Initial Placement (**Additional Placement**). The Additional Placement is not the subject of this Prospectus and will require Shareholder approval.

The Company engaged Clee Capital as lead manager and broker to assist with the Initial Placement and Additional Placement. In consideration for these services, the Company agreed to pay a fee of \$240,000 plus GST to the Lead Manager (being an amount equal to 6% plus GST of the funds raised under the Placement). The Company also agreed to issue a total of up to 1,500,000,000 options to the Lead Manager. These options are not the subject of this Prospectus and will require Shareholder approval. Refer to Section 7.6 for further details on the agreements between the Company and the Lead Manager.

The Offer is not open to the general public and a copy of this Prospectus together with instructions on how to access the electronic Application Form to apply for New Options will only be provided to the Placement Participants. Refer to Section 2.12 for further details on how Placement Participants can apply for New Options.

Where the determination of the Entitlement of any Placement Participant for New Options would result in a fraction of a New Option, such fraction will be rounded up to the nearest whole New Option.

All of the Shares issued upon exercise of the New Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 4 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the underlying Shares issued upon exercise of the New Options. The terms and conditions of the New Options to be issued pursuant to the Offer are detailed in Section 5.

2.2 Conditional Offer

The issue of the New Options is subject to Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

The Company obtained Shareholder approval for the issue of the New Options at an extraordinary general meeting held on 25 May 2026.

2.3 Purpose of this Prospectus

The offer of Shares under the Initial Placement can take place without the use of a prospectus. Issuing the New Options under this Prospectus will enable persons who are issued the New

Options to on-sell the Shares issued on exercise of the New Options without the need for any further disclosure under a prospectus or otherwise due to the operation of *ASIC Corporations (Sale Offers That Do Not Need Disclosure) Instrument 2026/94* which provides relief from the on-sale restrictions set out in section 707(3) of the Corporations Act.

The purpose of this Prospectus is to:

- (a) make the Offer;
- (b) subject to official quotation of the New Options being granted by the ASX, facilitate any potential secondary trading of New Options and to enable persons who are issued the New Options to on-sell the New Options within 12 months of their issue; and
- (c) ensure that the on-sale of the Shares issued on exercise of the New Options does not breach section 707(3) of the Corporations Act.

2.4 Overseas shareholders

Applicable laws may restrict the distribution of this Prospectus outside of Australia. Neither the Prospectus or any Application Form, constitutes an offer of New Options in any place or jurisdiction in which it would be unlawful or to any person to whom it would be unlawful to make such an offer or to issue this Prospectus or New Options under the Offer.

2.5 Purpose of the Offer and use of funds

The Offer is an opportunity for Placement Participants to further participate in the development of the Company, and will provide the Company with a potential source of additional capital if the New Options are exercised.

No funds will be raised from the issue of the New Options as they are being offered for nil consideration.

The Company will receive \$0.003 for each New Option exercised. If all New Options under the Offer are issued and exercised, the Company will receive approximately \$4,500,000 (before costs). There is no certainty that any of the New Options will be exercised.

Funds raised from the exercise of the New Options under the Offer are intended to be applied to fund general working capital, the costs of the Offer, and the commercialisation and redeployment of the Company's legacy WooBoard and Reffind HR and remote-working enterprise software suite, with a particular focus on enterprise, government and defence-related workforce application. 2.6 Transfer of entitlements under the Offer

The Offer is non-renounceable and therefore Placement Participants cannot offer to sell or transfer any of their Entitlement to participate in the Offer on ASX or via an off-market transfer (or any other exchange or private transfer).

2.7 Transfer of New Options

The New Options will be transferable subject to (i) meeting the ASX's minimum eligibility criteria for quotation (and actually being quoted, which cannot be guaranteed), (ii) the terms of the Corporations Act and the Listing Rules and (iii) any restriction or escrow arrangements imposed by ASX or under applicable Australian securities laws.

2.8 **Opening Date and Closing Date**

The Company will accept valid Applications in respect of the Offer from Placement Participants from the Opening Date until 5 the Closing Date or such other date as the Directors in their sole discretion determine.

The Company reserves the right, subject to the Corporations Act and the Listing Rules, to vary the Closing Date of the Offer without prior notice. If a closing date is varied, subsequent dates may also be varied accordingly.

2.9 **Issue Date**

It is expected that New Options will be issued on 15 June 2026, however, this is subject to change.

Holding statements for the New Options issued under the Offer will be despatched as soon as practicable after their issue.

2.10 **No general public offer**

There is no general public offer of New Options under this Prospectus.

Only Placement Participants are eligible to participate in the Offer. This Prospectus will be sent to Placement Participants only.

2.11 **No underwriting**

The Offer is not underwritten.

2.12 **Application for New Options**

The Prospectus, together with the Application Forms, will be sent to Placement Participants only. Placement Participants who have elected to receive communication electronically will be sent a link to access the Prospectus and the Application Form.

Completed Applications must be submitted to the Share Registry and received by the Company by the Closing Date.

Applications must comply with this Prospectus and the instructions on the Application Form. If the Application Form is not completed correctly, the Company may determine in its sole discretion the validity of such an Application Form, and the Directors' decision as to whether treat the acceptance as valid and how to construe, amend or complete any Application Form is final.

Placement Participants are not required to make any payment for the New Options as they are issued for nil consideration pursuant to the terms of this Prospectus.

An Application is an offer by the Applicant to the Company to apply for the amount of New Options specified in the Application, or any lesser number of New Options as determined by the Company, on the terms set out in this Prospectus. The Company's decision on the number of New Options to be issued to an Applicant under the Offer will be final.

2.13 **CHESS**

Under CHESS, the Company does not issue certificates to investors. Instead, security holders will receive a statement of their holdings in the Company, including New Options issued under this Prospectus. If an investor is broker sponsored, ASX Settlement Pty Limited will send you a CHESS statement.

The CHESS statement will specify the number of New Options issued under this Prospectus, provide details of your holder identification number, the participant identification number of the sponsor and the terms and conditions applicable to the New Options.

If you are registered on the issuer sponsored sub-register, your statement will be despatched by the Share Registry and will contain the number of New Options issued to you under this Prospectus and your security holder reference number.

A CHESS statement or issuer sponsored statement will routinely be sent to holders at the end of any calendar month during which the balance of their holding changes. New Option holders may request a statement at any other time, however, a charge may be made for additional statements.

2.14 Custodians, trustees and nominees

Nominees and custodians may not distribute this document, and may not permit any beneficial shareholder to participate in the Offer, in any country outside of Australia, New Zealand and Malaysia except, with the consent of the Company, to beneficial shareholders resident in other certain countries where the Company may determine it is lawful and practical to make the Offer.

If any nominee or custodian is acting on behalf of a foreign person, that holder, in dealing with its beneficiary, will need to assess whether indirect participation by the beneficiary in the Offer is compatible with applicable foreign laws.

2.15 ASX Quotation

Subject to meeting the ASX's minimum eligibility criteria for quotation, the Company intends to seek quotation of the New Options, and at such time, the New Options, once quoted, shall be transferable. If the New Options do not meet the ASX's eligibility criteria for the quotation of options at the time of issue, the New Options may remain unquoted and non-transferable until such time as the ASX's minimum eligibility criteria can be met.

If the New Options meet the ASX's eligibility criteria for the quotation the Company will make an application for quotation with the ASX within 7 days after the date of the Prospectus.

If the ASX does not grant permission for quotation of the New Options within three (3) months after the date of this Prospectus (or any later date permitted by law), none of the New Options will be issued and if any have been issued, the issue will be void in accordance with section 723 of the Corporations Act, unless ASIC grants an exemption permitting the issue.

ASX takes no responsibility for the contents of this Prospectus. The fact that ASX may grant official quotation is not to be taken in any way as an indication of the merits of the Company or the New Options.

2.16 Rights and liability attaching to Shares and New Options

The Shares issued on the exercise of the New Options will be on a fully paid basis and will rank equally in all respects with existing Shares. Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Company's Constitution, a copy of which may be downloaded from the Company's website at <https://www.thrivetribetech.com.au/>, or is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

A summary of the important rights attaching to the Shares is contained in Section 4.1 of this Prospectus. The terms and conditions of the New Options are described in Section 5.

3.2 Potential effect on control of the Company

The issue of the New Options themselves will have no effect on the control (as defined by section 50AA of the Corporations Act) of the Company. No investor or existing Shareholder will have a

Voting Power greater than 12.12% as a result of the completion of the Offer and the exercise of any New Options issued under the Offer.

There will be no change to any Shareholders' Voting Power as a result of the issue of New Options. Where New Options are exercised into Shares, the Voting Power of the Shareholders who exercise the New Options will increase. The likelihood of New Options being exercised is dependent on the price of the Shares from time to time until the New Options expire.

The maximum number of New Options proposed to be issued under the Offer is 1,500,000,000 options. If all the New Options are exercised and the underlying Shares issued, the Shares issued on exercise will represent approximately 23.99% of the Shares on issue following completion of the Offer (assuming no Shares are issued or convertible Securities exercised or converted into Shares prior to the issue of the New Options).

3.3 Financial effect of the Offer

4 RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO THE SHARES

4.1 Rights attaching to the Shares

The Company is incorporated in Australia and is subject to the Corporations Act. As a company listed on ASX, the Company is also regulated by the Listing Rules.

This summary is qualified by the full terms of the Constitution, and does not purport to be exhaustive, or to constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. These rights and liabilities can involve complex questions of law arising from an interaction of the Constitution with statutory and common law requirements. For a Shareholder to obtain a definitive assessment of the rights and liabilities which attach to Shares in any specific circumstances, the Shareholder should seek legal advice.

A full copy of the Constitution is available from the Company on request free of charge or available on the ASX website, www.asx.com.au under the Company's code "1TT".

(a) General Meetings and Notice

Each Shareholder is entitled to receive notice of all general meetings of the Company and to receive all notices, accounts and other documents required to be sent to Shareholders under the Constitution, the Corporations Act or the Listing Rules. Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company. Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act.

(b) Voting Rights

Subject to any rights or restrictions attached to any class or classes of Shares, from time to time, at general meetings of Shareholders or classes of Shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder entitled to vote has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder entitled to vote shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him or her, or in respect of which he or she is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for every fully paid Share, but in respect of partly paid Shares shall have a fraction of a vote equal to the proportion that the amount paid (not credited nor paid in advance of a call) is of the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) for the Share.

(c) Dividend Rights

While there is no guarantee of any dividends or distributions by the Company, the Directors may from time to time declare dividends in compliance with the Corporations Act. The Board may declare that a dividend is payable and fix the amount, time for payment and method of payment. The Board may direct payment of a dividend wholly or partly by the distribution in kind of specific assets. Notice of a dividend declared must be given to Shareholders.

(d) Winding Up

Subject to the rights of the holders of Securities in the Company issued on special terms, if the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the sanction of a special resolution of the Company, divide among the Shareholders in kind all or any part of the Company's assets and for that purpose determine how the liquidator will carry out the division between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders and/or vest all or any of the Company's assets in a trustee on trusts determined by the liquidator for the benefit of the contributories.

(e) Transfer of Shares

Subject to the Company's Constitution, the Corporations Act or any other applicable laws of Australia and the Listing Rules, the Shares are freely transferable, subject to formal requirements,

and so long as the registration of the transfer does not result in a contravention of or failure to observe the provisions of a law of Australia and the transfer is not in breach of the Corporations Act or the Listing Rules.

(f) **Variation of Rights**

The rights attached to any class of Shares may, unless their terms of issue state otherwise, be varied or abrogated with the written consent of the holders of 75% of the votes in the class, or with sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of the class of holders holding Securities in the class.

(g) **Increases in capital**

The Company must not issue Shares or grant options if the issue or grant would result in a breach of the Listing Rules.

(h) **Amendments to the Constitution**

The Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution in accordance with section 136(2) and 136(5) of the Corporations Act.

6 RISKS

The New Options offered under this Prospectus are considered highly speculative. In addition, there are risks inherent in investing in the share market in general. The business activities of the Company are subject to risks and there are many risks which may impact on the Company's future performance. Some of these risks can be mitigated by the use of safeguards and appropriate systems and controls, but many are outside of the control of the Company and cannot be mitigated.

Eligible Shareholders should be aware that an investment in the Company involves risks. Prospective investors should carefully consider the risk factors described below, together with information presented elsewhere in this Prospectus, and should consult their professional advisors before deciding whether to apply for Securities.

The key risks identified by the Company are set out below but these are not an exhaustive list of the risks associated with an investment in the Company shares. There may be other risks which the Directors and/or management of the Company are unaware which may impact upon the Company, its operations and/or the value and performance of the New Options and the Company generally.

6.1 Risks associated with the Company

(a) Technology

The Company's business is solely based around its 'Mytribe' e-commerce marketplace (**Platform**). The attraction of the Platform to users is its simple, new age and engaging user interface which facilitates ease of effective communication between employer and employee. There is a risk that the Platform technology may be superseded by a new technology which has advantages over the Company's offerings and delivers employer to employee communications in a more practical, efficient, engaging and reliable manner.

(b) Loss of customers

The Company's future revenue prospects are heavily reliant on the conversion of its clients trialling the Platform into paying clients, and the delivery of additional product offerings to those paying clients. Accordingly, the Company must maintain and support its existing customer relationships (whether trialling customers or paying customers) to ensure they continue using the Platform into the future. The loss of customers may adversely affect the operating results of the Company.

(c) Increase in competition

The human resources technology market is highly competitive. The actions of an existing competitor or the introduction of a new competitor in this market may make it difficult for the Company to attract new users, expand its user base and subscribe for each of its product offerings. Further, customers may cancel their contracts with the Company. This will materially affect the Company's ability to grow its revenue, which in turn, may have an adverse effect on its profitability. If the Company's platform proves to be less successful than its competitors' products, the whole business of the Company could be adversely affected.

(d) Sales and marketing success

The commercial success of the Platform will be contingent on the success of the sales and marketing campaigns. By its nature, there is no guarantee that the Company's sales and marketing campaigns will be successful. In the event that they are not, the Company may encounter difficulty commercialising its product, which would have an impact on the Company's future sales and profitability.

(e) Growth strategies

The Company has adopted a new business strategy being a new agency model which emphasizes delivering top-tier digital and social media strategies, advertising, content development and training services to businesses using technology. There is a risk that the implementation of these strategies will be subject to delays or cost overruns and there is no guarantee that this strategy will generate the full benefits anticipated or result in future

sales and earnings growth. Failure of this strategy would result in non-existent or negligible growth for the Company.

In particular, the Company is an early-stage start up, and as such its future success and profitability is modelled on accelerated growth and an expansion plan to achieve the objective of obtaining a large user footprint (both domestically and globally) for its Platform. The Company's growth and expansion prospects are dependent upon a number of factors, including user take up and the success of its marketing and sales campaigns. If the Company fails to execute any expansion plan and cannot attract users for its Platform or product offerings, its financial performance is likely to be negatively affected.

(f) Intellectual property

There is a risk that other parties may claim to have an interest in the intellectual property used by the Company, particularly in relation to the use of open-source coding in the Platform. The intellectual property may be challenged by other parties and defending such actions may adversely impact the Company's earnings. In addition, the Company may be required to develop or support new technology and intellectual property which may require significant capital expenditure by the Company. The Company will likely acquire trade secrets and other intellectual property rights that are important assets and critical for the development of the Platform and the Company's product offerings in the future. The Company may therefore rely on a combination of confidentiality and licence agreements with its consultants and third parties with whom it has relationships, as well as domain name, trade secret, copyright and patent laws, to protect its brand and other intellectual property rights. However, various events outside of the Company's control could pose a threat to its intellectual property rights, as well as to its products and the Platform.

(g) Reliance on key personnel

The Company relies heavily on the experience and knowledge of its management team, which consists of strong experience in software development, recruitment and human resources management. The Company is also dependent on its ability to recruit and retain suitably qualified personnel such as those in its business development, customer success and support team. In the event that such key personnel leave the Company and the Company is unable to recruit suitable replacements, such loss could have a materially adverse effect on the Company, particularly given its size.

(h) Programming errors

The Company's Platform contains complicated programming. The Company's products may therefore contain, now or in the future, errors, bugs or vulnerabilities. Any errors, bugs or vulnerabilities discovered could result in (amongst other consequences) damage to the Company's brand, loss of users, loss of platform partners, falls in revenues or liability for damages, any of which could adversely affect the Company's business and operating results.

(i) Reliance on application platform providers and search engines

Should the Company's brand or products fail to attract a high level of internet search ranking, direction of users or potential new customers to its products could be limited and its business and operating results could be adversely affected. The Company relies on application marketplaces to facilitate downloads of its Platform. Should any operators of application platforms utilised by the Company make changes to limit or make accessing or using the Platform more difficult, the Company's business and operating results may be affected. The Company's search result rank is outside of its control and competitors' search engine procedures may result in their website or applications receiving a higher search result ranking. Reduced numbers of potential users directed to the Company's Platform could adversely affect its business and operating results.

(j) Maintenance of database

The Company will maintain an extensive and highly confidential database of its candidates and key client contacts. All interactions with both candidates and clients are recorded on the database, with such information shared across the Company for the benefit of all

consultants. Any disruption to the database would have a detrimental impact on the way the Company conducts its day-to-day business.

6.2 Industry specific risks

(a) Reliance on SaaS-based models

The Company's future growth is dependent on the increasing adoption of software as a service-based document productivity solution. If the Company's solution is not accepted and used by more organisations, or if the market for such solutions fails to grow as expected, the Company's platform could be adversely affected, slowing revenue growth and future expansion opportunities.

(b) Cybersecurity

Customers' confidential information may be held by the Company through its customers' ordinary use of the Platform. By their nature, technological systems, including the Company's, are susceptible to cyber-attacks, with third parties seeking unauthorised access to data, financial theft and disruption to the ordinary use of services. These events could materially disrupt the Company's business and undermine users' trust in technology platforms such as the one provided by the Company. Any accidental or deliberate breach of the Company's systems may result in reputational damage, a loss of confidence in the services provided, a disruption of services to customers, claims by customers, loss of customers, legal action, regulatory fines, investigation or scrutiny. The Company may also expend costs to rectify any of its system's vulnerabilities. Furthermore, security or data issues afflicting the Company's third-party suppliers could also adversely impact the Company's business operations, service offering and reputation.

(c) Disruption of technology systems

The Company relies on technology solutions and infrastructure (such as the internet, hosting services etc) to provide a satisfactory user experience for customers. There is a risk these systems may be adversely affected by disruption, service outages, malware, cyber-attacks, disruption, power surges or similar events. These may be caused by events outside of the Company's control and disrupt access to the Platform for lengthy periods, in turn damaging its reputation.

(d) Change in regulation

There is a general risk that laws and regulations pertaining to sharing of information, privacy of consumers and security of personal information may be imposed or strengthened, in a manner that could affect the Company's service delivery and future growth development opportunities. Potential regulations may impose restrictions on how the Company stores data, protects customers' data, uses customer data or communicates usage, storage and protection of that data to customers.

6.3 Risks associated with the Offer

(a) Value of New Options

The New Options that are issued require the exercise price of \$0.003 per New Option to be paid at the time of exercise. If the prevailing trading price of Shares is lower than the Exercise Price, then it is likely that the New Options will not be exercised. In this case, for investors, the unexercised New Options will not have value and will lapse on the Expiry Date of the New Options.

If the New Options are not exercised, or only some of the New Options are exercised, then the Company may not receive the proceeds that would otherwise be generated if New Option holders pay the Exercise Price. This possibility may reduce the amount of capital that the Company would receive if all of the New Options are exercised on or before the Expiry Date of the New Options.

(b) Nature of the New Options

The Company will seek quotation of the New Options and therefore, the New Options will be transferrable following quotation, subject to meeting the ASX's minimum eligibility criteria for quotation (and actually being quoted, which cannot be guaranteed). Even if ASX grants Official Quotation of the New Options, the market for the New Options may be illiquid. The market for Shares may be illiquid.

There is no certainty that New Options will trade above the exercise price and accordingly there is no certainty that New Option holders will realise any value from the New Options. In the event that the New Options are exercised, this will dilute the holdings of existing Shareholders.

6.4 General risks

(a) Potential for dilution

A shareholder's percentage holding in the Company will be diluted by not participating in the Offer, assuming New Options are exercised. It is not possible to predict what the value of the Company or its Shares will be following the completion of the Offer and the Directors do not make any representation as to such matters. The historical trading price of the Shares on ASX prior to the date of this Prospectus is not a reliable indicator as to the potential trading price of Shares after completion of the Offer.

(b) General economic and investment risks

As with all stock market investments, there are risks associated with an investment in the Company. The trading price of the Company's Shares may fluctuate with movements in equity capital markets in Australia and internationally, and may also be influenced by a number of factors, some of which are specific to the Company and its operations and some of which may affect listed companies generally. Generally applicable factors that may affect the market price of Shares include: i) general movements in Australian and international securities markets; ii) investor sentiment; iii) Australian and international economic conditions and outlook; iv) changes in interest rates and the rate of inflation; v) changes in government regulation and policies (including in relation to taxation); vi) announcement of new technologies; vii) and geopolitical instability. General economic conditions may also negatively affect the Company's performance and the performance of the Company's Shares. Any protracted slowdown in economic conditions or factors such as movements in inflation or interest rates, the cost and general availability of credit, and industrial disruption may have a negative impact on the Company.

(c) Taxation

The disposal or exercise of New Options will have tax consequences, which will differ depending on the individual financial affairs of each investor. All investors are urged to obtain independent financial advice about the consequences of disposing of or exercising New Options from a taxation viewpoint and generally. To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Company, its officers and each of their respective advisors accept no liability and responsibility with respect to the taxation consequences of disposing of or exercising the New Options under this Prospectus.

(d) Government and legal risk

Changes in government, monetary policies, taxation and other laws can have a significant impact on the Company's assets, operations and ultimately the financial performance of the Company and its Shares. Such changes are likely to be beyond the control of the Company and may affect industry profitability.

Changes in community attitudes on matters such as taxation, competition policy and environmental issues may bring about reviews and possibly changes in government policies. There is a risk that such changes may affect the Company's development plans. Any such government action may also require increased capital or operating expenditures and could prevent or delay certain operations by the Company the future performance of the Company or any return on an investment in the Company.

(e) Geopolitical conditions

The nature and extent of the effect of global conflicts on the performance of the Company remains unknown. The Company may be affected by the impact that geopolitical factors have on the world or Australian economies or on financial markets and investments generally or specifically, and governmental responses to such activities. The Company's Share price may be adversely affected in the short to medium term by the economic uncertainty caused by geopolitical factors.

(f) Data and cyber security risk

The integrity, availability and reliability of data within the Company's information technology systems may be subject to intentional or unintentional disruption. Given the level of increasing sophistication and scope of potential cyber-attacks, these attacks may lead to significant breaches of security which could jeopardise the sensitive information and financial transactions of the Company.

6.5 **Concluding Comment**

The above list of risk factors ought not to be taken as an exhaustive list of the risks faced by the Company or by investors in the Company. The above factors, and others not specifically referred to above, may in the future materially affect the financial performance of the Company and the value of the New Options or the Shares issued on the exercise of the New Options.

Investment in the Company must be regarded as highly speculative and neither the Company nor any of its Directors or any other party associated with the preparation of this Prospectus guarantee that any specific objectives of the Company will be achieved or that any particular performance of the Company or of the New Options, including those offered by this Prospectus, will be achieved.

2 Distribution conditions

The Offer of New Options under the Prospectus is being made to Placement Participants, who are sophisticated and professional investors (as defined in section 708(8) and 708(11) of the Corporations Act respectively) who committed to the Company's initial placement to raise A\$3,000,000 before costs (as approved at the Company's extraordinary general meeting held on 25 May 2026) and were issued a total of 3,000,000,000 Shares on 3 June 2026.

In the Prospectus, the Company has outlined key risks of investment in the New Options and emphasised that investment in the New Options should be regarded as speculative. This would make it not suitable for investors for whom such an investment is inappropriate.

The Company considers that these distribution conditions will ensure that persons who invest in the New Options fall within the target market in circumstances where personal advice is not being provided to those persons by the Company.

3 Review Triggers

The New Options are being offered for a limited period set out in the Prospectus, after the conclusion of which the New Options will no longer be available for investment by way of issue. It follows that the TMD will only apply in the period between the commencement of the offer of the New Options and the issue of New Options after the close of the Offer (**Offer Period**) after which the TMD will be withdrawn.

To allow the Company to determine whether circumstances exist that indicate this TMD is no longer appropriate to the Offer and should be reviewed, the following events and circumstances will be review triggers:

- (a) a material change to the New Options' key attributes that make it no longer consistent with the likely objectives, financial situation and needs of investors in the target market;
- (b) the Company lodges with ASIC a supplementary or replacement prospectus in relation to the Prospectus;
- (c) the occurrence of a significant dealing in New Options that is not consistent with this TMD. The Company does not consider that an on-sale of the New Options on market is a significant dealing;
- (d) a substantial divergence in how the New Options are being distributed and purchased from this TMD;

- (e) ASIC raises concerns with the Company regarding the adequacy of the design or distribution of the New Options or this TMD;
- (f) there is a significant increase in the number of complaints received in respect of the New Options; and
- (g) material changes to the regulatory environment that applies to an investment in the New Options.

The Company may also amend this TMD at any time.

4 Review Period

If a review trigger occurs during the Offer Period, the Company will undertake a review of the TMD in light of the review trigger (as applicable) as soon as reasonably practicable and, in any case, within 10 business days of the review trigger occurring.

The Company will otherwise conduct a review of the TMD prior to the issue of New Options under the Offer.

5 Reporting Requirements

As the Company is not appointing external distributors of New Options in respect of retail clients, the Company will consider any of the following matters:

- (a) complaints received by the Company in relation to the New Options;
- (b) a significant dealing of the New Options which is inconsistent with this TMD;
- (c) any dealings outside of the target market (to the extent the Company is aware of such dealings); and
- (d) the conduct of the Company under the TMD.

Where relevant, the Company will consider any of the above matters and determine the appropriate steps that will be taken, including, where appropriate, reporting matters to ASIC.
