

Victory Awarded \$350,000 Federal Trailblazer grant One of the largest in the program's history

Victory Metals Limited (ASX:VTM) is pleased to announce that it has been awarded A\$350,000 in cash funding from the Resources Technology and Critical Minerals (RTCM) Trailblazer to support the Company's rare earth processing research and development program over the next two years.

The RTCM Trailblazer is led by Curtin University, in partnership with The University of Queensland and James Cook University and is supported by the Australian Government's Department of Education Trailblazer Universities Program.

Over the two-year term, the funding will embed dedicated full-time researchers at Curtin University working alongside Victory's technical team to further develop and optimise the Company's rare earth processing flowsheet and the metallurgical work that underpins its 100% owned North Stanmore Heavy Rare Earth Project near Cue in Western Australia. The program is focused on strengthening the recovery and separation of the high value heavy rare earth elements, including dysprosium, terbium and yttrium, that distinguish North Stanmore as one of Australia's largest heavy rare earth-enriched regolith deposits.

Importantly, while the program runs over two years, it is fully integrated with Victory's broader development pathway and is designed to facilitate, not delay the Company's move into commercial production.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Victory has secured A\$350,000 in cash funding from the Resources Technology and Critical Minerals (RTCM) Trailblazer, the Federal Government backed program led by Curtin University, to support the Company's rare earth processing research and development over the next two years.
- The funding is non-dilutive and leverages Victory's existing commitments to Curtin University and to its recently commissioned rare earths pilot plant in Burswood, Perth.
- The grant will fund dedicated full-time research staff at Curtin working alongside Victory to advance and help commercialise its heavy rare earth processing technology.
- It follows the recent commissioning of Victory's North Stanmore rare earths pilot plant in Perth, officially opened by the Honourable Madeleine King MP, Federal Minister for Resources.
- The award deepens Victory's partnership with Curtin and the Federal Government as Australia builds a secure, Western-aligned rare earths supply chain.

Victory Metals Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director Brendan Clark commented: *"This grant is an important moment for Victory Metals. To receive this support from the Resources Technology and Critical Minerals Trailblazer is a powerful validation of our team's work and the national importance of what we are building. We are deeply grateful for the support of the Trailblazer, Curtin University and the Federal Government, and we were honoured to have the Honourable Madeleine King officially open, our pilot plant last week. This funding allows us to deepen our partnership with Curtin University and dedicate full-time researchers to advancing our rare earth processing technology and accelerate our path to commercialisation."*

Victory is dedicated to the exploration and development of its flagship North Stanmore Heavy Rare Earth Elements (HREE), and critical minerals project located in the Cue Region of Western Australia. The Company is committed to advancing this world-class project to unlock its significant potential.

In August 2025, Victory Metals announced a robust Mineral Resource Estimate (MRE) for North Stanmore, totalling 320.6 million tonnes, with most of the resource, classified in the indicated category. This positions the North Stanmore Project as Australia's largest indicated clay heavy rare earth resource, underscoring its pivotal role as a future supplier of critical materials.
