Quarterly Activity Report: April – June 2026

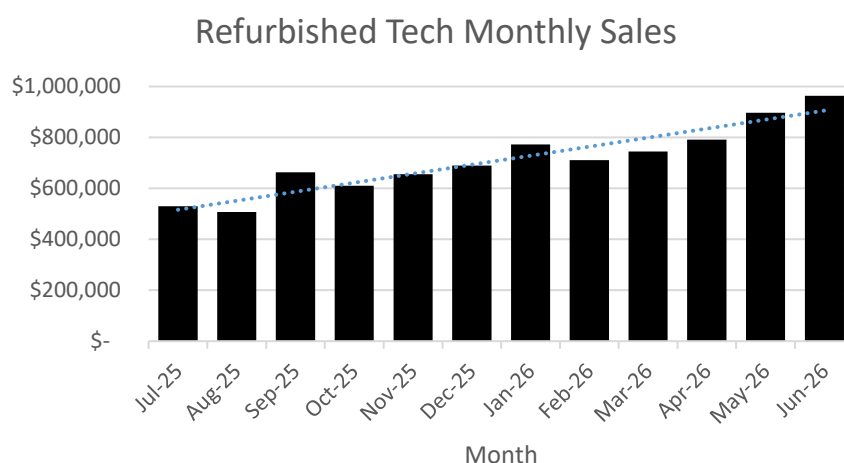

Pure-play online retailer Harris Technology Group Limited (ASX: HT8) ("Harris Technology" or the "Company") is pleased to present its activity report for the June 2026 quarter (Q4 FY26).

Operations Update

Harris Technology generated sales revenue of \$4.3M in the June 2026 quarter, taking the 12 months YTD sales to \$17.8M which represents a 29% increase on FY25 (\$13.8M). Sales growth has continued to be powered by refurbished tech sales: the Refurbished category generated approximately \$2.5M in Q4 FY26 — representing approximately 58% of quarterly revenue — and \$7.8M for the full year, making it the Company's largest category by both revenue and net profit contribution.



The June quarter delivered net operating cash flow of \$0.1M, taking YTD to \$0.9M.

The Refurbished division's rise to category leadership reflects a strategic pivot executed over the past 18 months. Monthly Refurbished revenue has grown from approximately \$530K in July 2025 to a record \$966K in June 2026 — an approximately 82% increase — driven by disciplined expansion of product sourcing, supplier relationships and quality assurance capabilities.

The category's margin profile is materially superior to the Group's legacy IT products: Refurbished generated an average gross margin of approximately 36% across FY26, compared with approximately 22% for the IT category, and accounted for the substantial majority of the Group's net trading profit for the year.

As Harris Technology builds on this established platform, the Company is advancing initiatives to enhance the customer purchase and unboxing experience and reward brand loyalty, reinforcing its ambition to become Australia's most trusted destination for refurbished technology.

As of 30 June 2026, inventory on hand was \$2.9M, lower than \$3.7M reported at the end of March.

Harris Technology closed the quarter with \$1.9M in cash on hand and \$1.8M undrawn on its finance facility.

Harris Technology CEO, Garrison Huang, commented, "As the Refurbished tech division has blossomed over the past two years, the scale of our supply chain and sales has become self-sustaining which will create opportunities for us to target growth both vertically into more supply chain elements, and horizontally into more product categories.

"Setting Harris Technology apart in the long-term will be our market leadership as consumers know they can trust tech products refurbished by HT as we roll out strategic initiatives to enhance the customer experience of purchasing, receiving and 'out of box' experience, rewarding brand loyalty.

"We are delighted to also welcome FSP Technology as a strategic shareholder, being a highly respected global technology company with an extensive track record of innovation and manufacturing excellence. Their decision to convert \$897k preference shares into equity reflects confidence in our business model, our growth strategy and the significant opportunity we see within the refurbished technology sector."

Corporate Update

Harris Technology increased equity by approximately \$897,000 during the June quarter after FSP Technology Inc ("**FSP**") converted its existing redeemable shares, resulting in the issue of 44,870,322 fully paid ordinary shares at a conversion price of \$0.02 per share.

The strategic investment further strengthens the relationship between Harris Technology and FSP as the Company continues to expand its position within Australia's rapidly growing refurbished technology market.

Founded in Taiwan and listed on the Taiwan Stock Exchange (TPE: 3015), FSP is a globally recognised technology manufacturer with a market capitalisation of approximately A\$500 million. The company is a leading supplier of power supply solutions, computer components and energy technologies, serving many of the world's largest technology brands across the computing, industrial and consumer electronics sectors.
