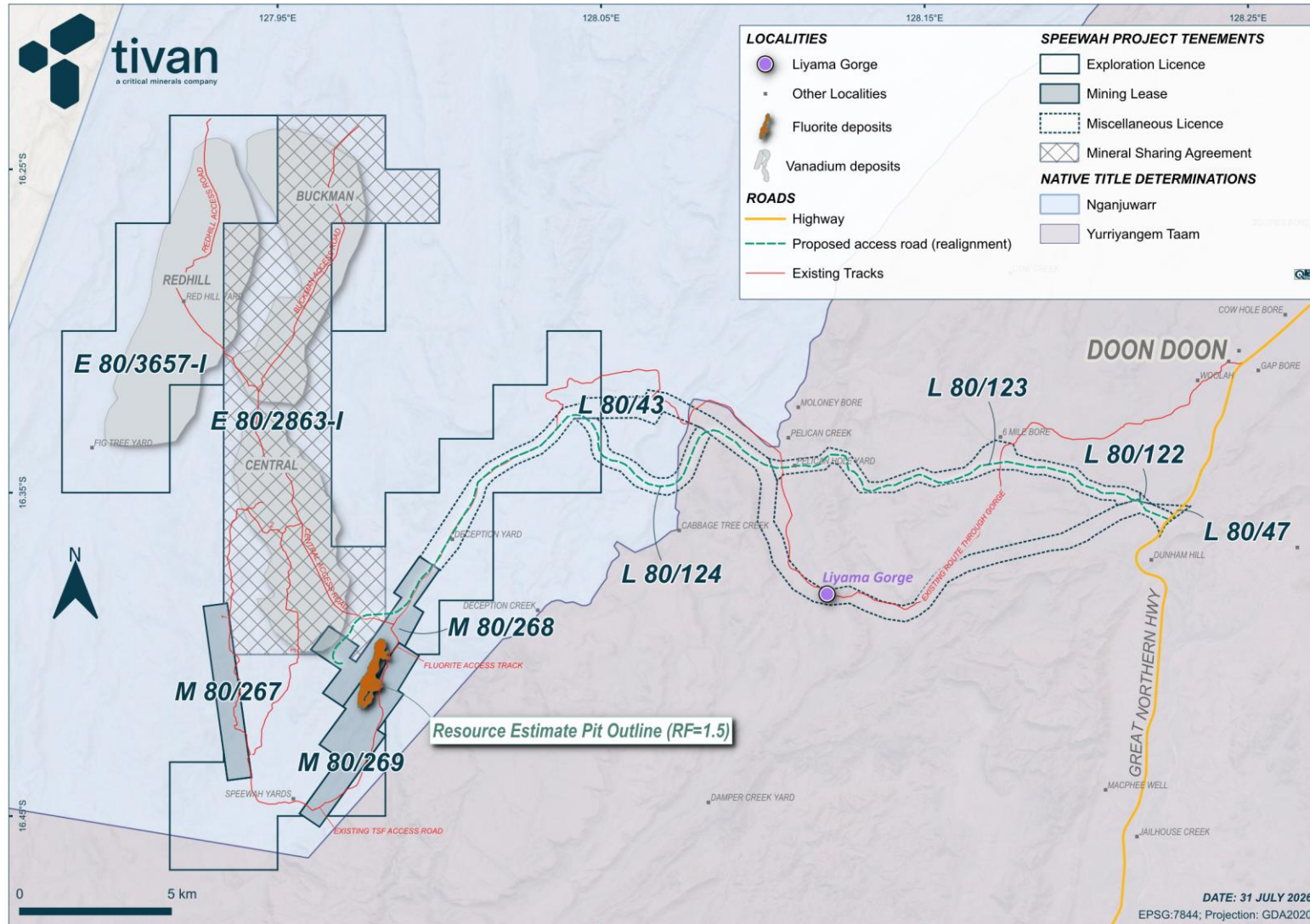
Where is Speewah?



- 110km SW of Kununurra
- Wholly within the Shire of Wyndham East Kimberly (SWEK)
- Wholly within the Doon Doon Pastoral Lease (subleased by Glen Hill Aboriginal Corporation)
- Access road through Yurriyangem Taam Native Title Determined Area
- Mine Site and Infrastructure located within Nganjuwarr Native Title Determination

Speewah Fluorite Project at a glance

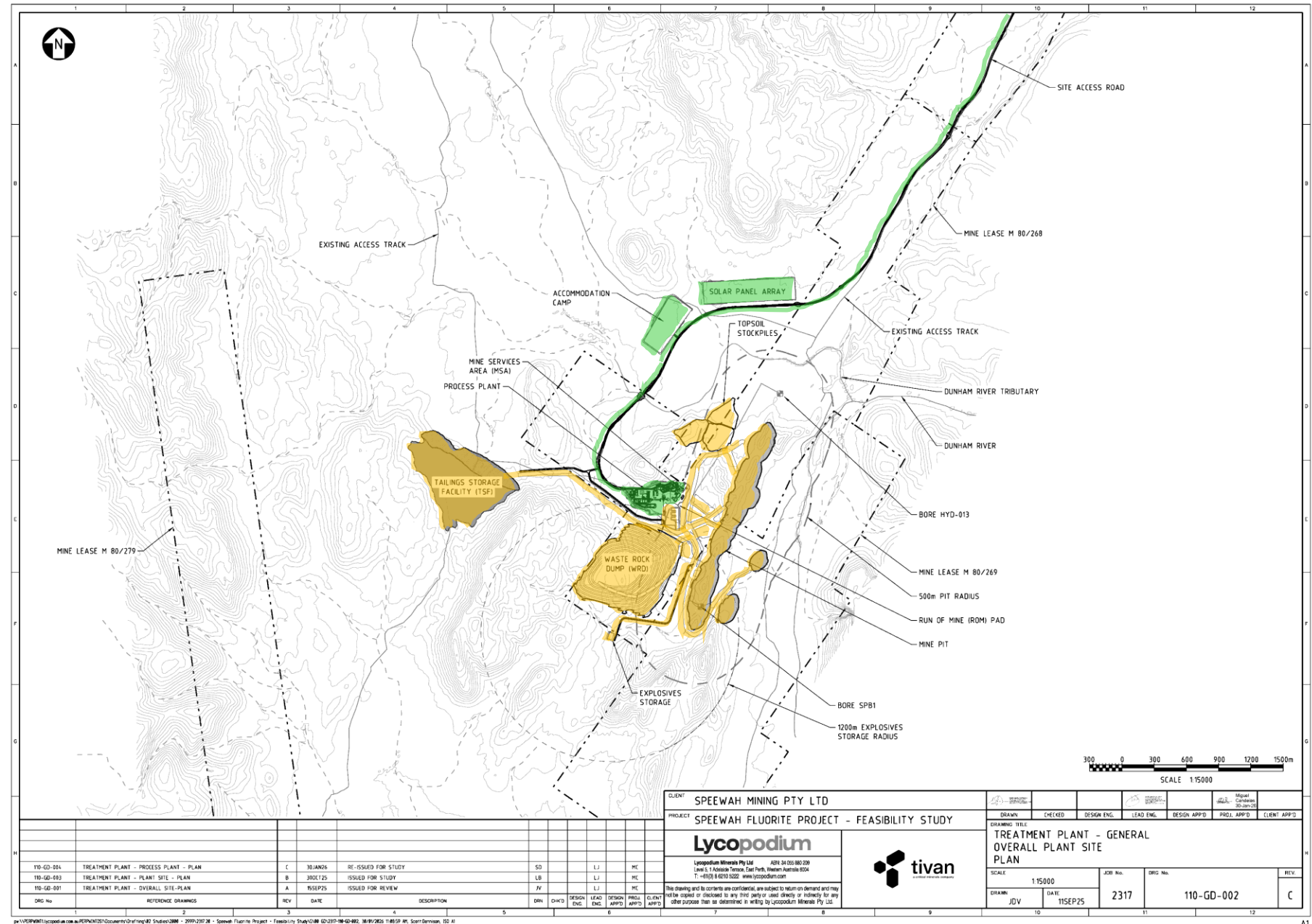


- **Australia's first** – the most advanced fluorite development project and a recognised Federal Major Project.
- **Proposed operation** – An open-pit mine with onsite processing to produce high-quality acid-grade fluorspar—a critical mineral used in advanced manufacturing.
- **World-class resource** – favourable mineralogy, very low impurities and product quality validated by customers.
- **Transport and export** – Product will be hauled by road to Wyndham Port and shipped to international customers.
- **Project partners** – Developed through a landmark joint venture with Sumitomo Corporation and Japanese Government agency JOGMEC.

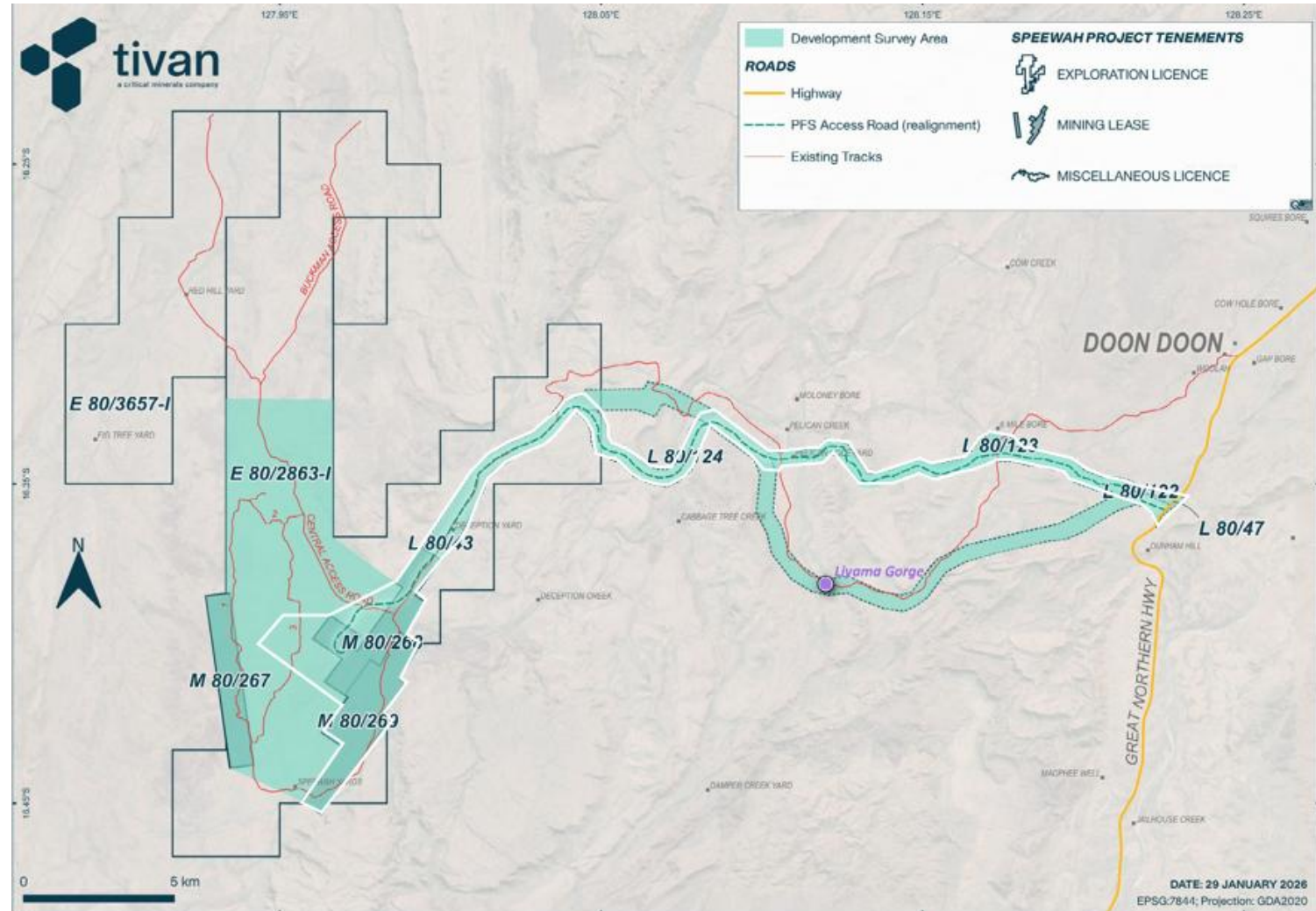

Environmental Approvals: Baseline Surveys

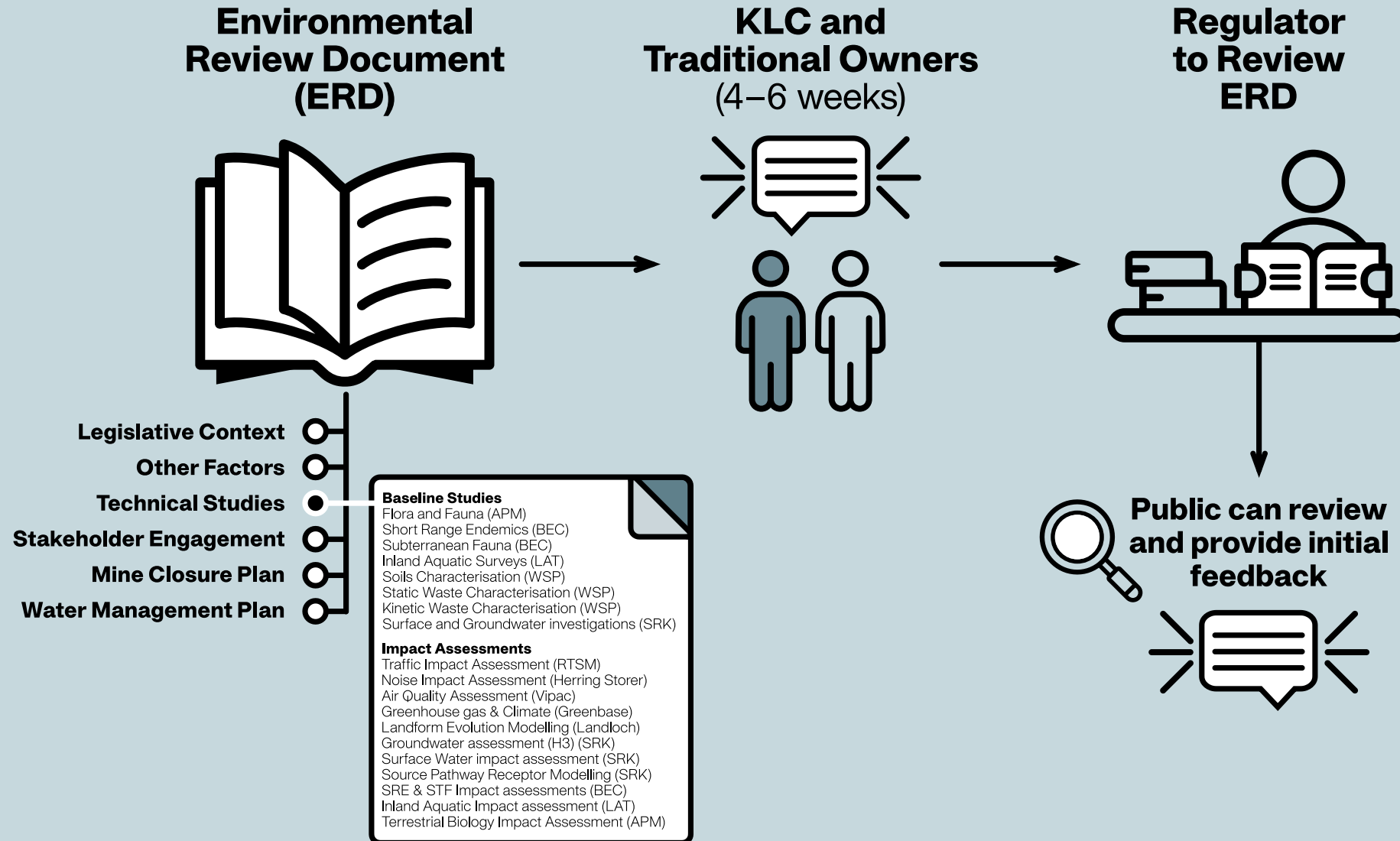
- **Assessment area – 9,650 ha:** Area covered by environmental baseline surveys and technical impact assessments.
- **Development envelope – 4,006 ha:** Area within the white outline where project elements may be refined, provided this does not create additional or different significant impacts.
- **Key mine activities – 255 ha:** Open pit, processing plant, waste rock dump and tailings storage facility.
- **Supporting activities – 268 ha:** Roads, accommodation, solar infrastructure, stockpiles, laydown areas, firebreaks and landfill.

Total planned activity footprint:
approximately 523 ha within the
4,006 ha development envelope.

Environmental Review Process



Listening & Responding: Liyama Spring and Gorge

- **What we heard:** Through engagement facilitated by the KLC, Traditional Owners and Native Title Holders asked that the new access road avoid Liyama Spring and Liyama Gorge.
- **What we changed:** Tivan redesigned the road to avoid these culturally significant areas and bypass the Doon Doon community.
- **Our commitment:** Tivan will work with Traditional Owners and specialists to develop a culturally appropriate and environmentally sustainable plan to rehabilitate the existing tracks through Liyama Spring and Gorge once the Project becomes operational.

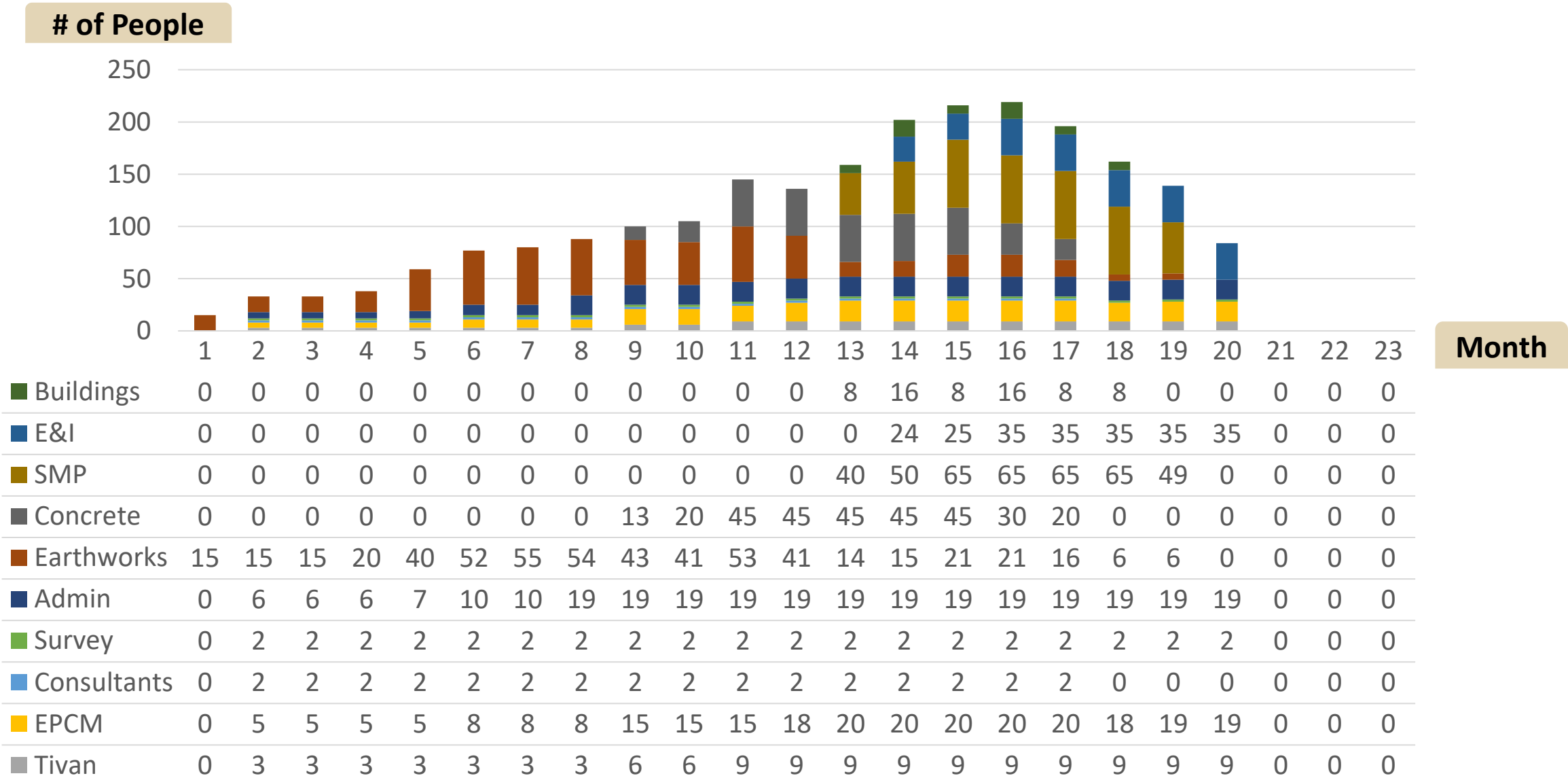
Rehabilitation of Liyama Spring and Liyama Gorge

As a proactive measure to reflect the preferences of Traditional Owners and Native Title Holders, Tivan is advancing discussions with specialists in land rehabilitation, erosion control, and soil and water management across mining, agriculture and infrastructure sectors to progress rehabilitation planning for the existing access tracks through Liyama Spring and Liyama Gorge. Desktop and field-based investigations, along with stakeholder engagement workshops, are being planned to inform a proposal that supports culturally appropriate and environmentally sustainable rehabilitation outcomes.

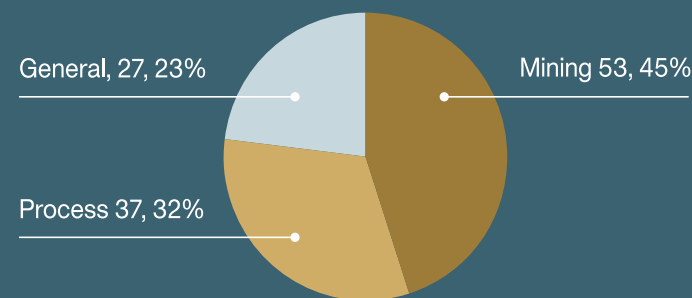

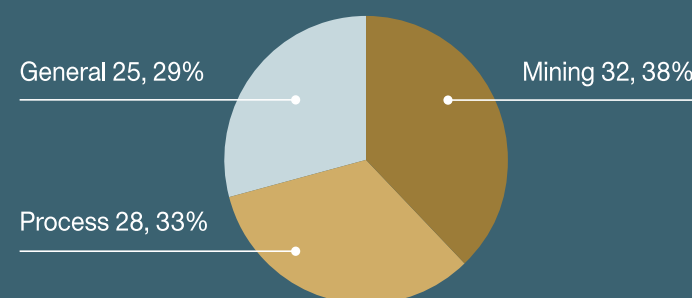

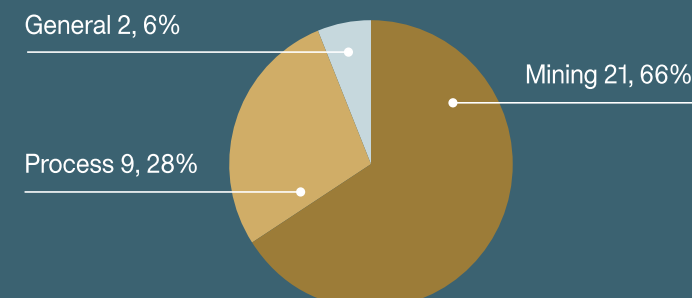
