Chair's voting intentions

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention.

If the Chair is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chair is to vote on any of the Resolutions by signing and returning the Proxy Form, you are considered to have provided the Chair with an express authorisation for the Chair to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chair's intention, even if the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel of the Company.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in connection with the business to be conducted at the Meeting to be held at Corporate Administration Services, Level 6, 10 Market Street, Brisbane Qld 4000 on Wednesday, 23 September 2026 at 11:00am (AEST).

The Explanatory Memorandum forms part of the Notice which should be read in its entirety. The Explanatory Memorandum contains the terms and conditions on which the Resolutions will be voted.

Background to the Placement

On 15 April 2026, the Company announced that it had received firm commitments from institutional and sophisticated investors to raise A\$2.645 million (before expenses) by the issue of approximately 58.8 million new fully paid ordinary shares (**Placement Shares**), at an issue price of \$0.045 per Placement Share (**Placement**).

Participants in the Placement will also be issued a total of approximately 29.4 million attaching options to acquire Shares (**Placement Options**) with an exercise price of \$0.08 and expiring 3 years from the date of issue, on the basis of one option for every two Shares issued, for nil additional consideration, subject to Shareholder approvals sought in this Notice.

The funds from the Placement will be used for:

- Identification and evaluation of critical minerals projects;
- Initial exploration activities for the Idaho tungsten and fluorspar projects, subject to completion of the acquisition;
- General Working Capital Purposes; and
- Costs of the Placement.

Following delayed settlements, the final amount raised was A\$2.595 million (before expenses) by the issue of approximately 57.7 million Placement Shares, with approximately 28.8 million Placement Options to be issued subject to Shareholder approval.

The Placement Shares were issued to those institutional and sophisticated investors who participated in the Placement (**Placement Participants**) as follows:

- (a) 23,222,224 Placement Shares were issued on 12-May-26 and 6,427,811 Placement Shares were issued on 1-Jun-26, under the Company's available placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 (the subject of Resolution 1); and
- (b) 3,572,189 Placement Shares were issued on 1-Jun-26 and 24,444,445 Placement Shares were issued on 11-Jun-26, under the Company's available Listing Rule 7.1A capacity (the subject of Resolution 2).

Resolutions 1 and 2 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of a total of 57,666,669 Placement Shares to the Placement Participants.

The Company also agreed, subject to obtaining the necessary shareholder approvals, to issue:

- (a) up to 28,833,335 Placement Options (exercisable at \$0.08 each and expiring three years from issue date) to the Placement Participants on the basis of one Placement Option for every two Placement Shares subscribed for under the Placement (the subject of Resolution 3);
- (b) up to 5,766,667 Options (**Fee Options**) to Oakley Capital Partners Pty Ltd (**Lead Manager**) in its capacity as the lead manager of the Placement (the subject of Resolution 4); and
- (c) up to 1,297,500 Shares (**Fee Shares**) to the Lead Manager (the subject of Resolution 5).

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 for the issue of the Placement Options to the Placement Participants.

Resolutions 4 and 5 seek Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 for, respectively, the issue of the Fee Options and the Fee Shares, to the Lead Manager.

Background to the Acquisition

On 15 April 2026, the Company also announced that it had entered into a binding agreement (subject to any shareholder approval required under the ASX Listing Rules) to acquire all of the shares in Freshwater Metals Pty Ltd (**Target**) which owns two critical minerals exploration projects located in Idaho, United States. The two projects are Big It (tungsten, antimony, gold) and Vaught-Peck Columbite (fluorspar, niobium, tantalum, rare earth elements)(**Acquisition**).

Conditions precedent to complete the acquisition include legal, financial and technical due diligence investigations in relation to the Target and the Tenements to the Company's satisfaction, execution of a full form sale and purchase agreement and any shareholder approvals required under the ASX Listing Rules. Due diligence will include understanding the scope of two NSR agreements with previous tenement owners with an aggregate 3% NSR covering some of the Tenements.

Consideration for the Acquisition comprises 6,666,667 Shares (**Consideration Shares**) valued at \$0.045 each (having an aggregate value of \$300,000), which will be (voluntarily) escrowed for 3 months (33.3% of the Consideration Shares), 6 months (33.3% of the Consideration Shares) and 9 months (33.3% of the Consideration Shares). Oakley Capital Partners Pty Ltd introduced the Acquisition and were paid a 10% (of the \$300,000 consideration) introduction fee payable in Shares (**Introduction Fee Shares**) at the Placement Price (\$0.045).

The Consideration Shares (the subject of Resolution 6) and the Introduction Fee Shares (the subject of Resolution 7) were issued on 19 August 2026, using the Company's ASX Listing Rule 7.1 capacity.

Resolutions 6 and 7 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for, respectively, the issue of the Consideration Shares and the Introduction Fee Shares.

Resolutions 1 and 2 – Ratification of prior issue of Placement Shares – Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

As set out in the *Background to the Placement* section above, on 12 May 2026, 1 June 2026 and 11 June 2026 the Company issued a total of 57,666,669 Placement Shares to the Placement Participants (being those institutional and sophisticated investors who participated in the Placement).

A total of 57,666,669 Placement Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's available capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 and Listing Rule 7.1A .

In accordance with Listing Rule 7.4, Shareholder approval is sought to ratify the issue and allotment of the 57,666,669 Placement Shares. The issue of the Placement Shares did not breach Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.1A at the time of issue.

Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12 month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, shareholders can give prior approval (by special resolution at an annual general meeting) to the issue of securities equivalent to an additional 10% of the entity's capital over a 12-month period. Shareholders gave their approval for the issue of additional shares under Listing Rule 7.1A at the last annual general meeting of the Company held on 26 November 2025.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval

under Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A for the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares under the Placement.

Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.1A (as appropriate) and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Placement Shares.

To this end, Resolution 1 and Resolution 2 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the 57,666,669 Placement Shares referred to above.

Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 1 and Resolution 2 are passed, the Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% placement limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

If Resolution 1 and Resolution 2 are not passed, the Placement Shares will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

Directors' recommendation

The Directors unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 1 and Resolution 2.

Resolution 3 - Approval to issue up to 28,833,335 Placement Options to Placement Participants

As set out in the *Background to the Private Placement* section above, the Company has completed a Placement raising \$2.595 million.

In connection with the Placement, the Company will, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, also issue one free-attaching option in the Company (**Placement Options**) for every two Placement Shares subscribed for under the Placement. The Placement Options are exercisable at \$0.08 per option and will expire on the date which is 3 years from their date of issue.

Resolution 3 is an Ordinary Resolution and seeks Shareholder approval to the issue of the Placement Options for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1.

A summary of the terms of the Placement Options is set out in Schedule 1 to this Explanatory Memorandum.

Listing Rule 7.1

As discussed above, subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12 month period (**15% Capacity**).

Equity Securities issued with shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 do not count towards an entity's 15% Capacity.

The Placement Options are Equity Securities under the Listing Rules, do not fall into any of the exceptions and exceed the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1. As a result, issue of the Placement Options requires approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

Further, under Listing Rule 7.2 (*Exception 9*), an issue of Equity Securities on the conversion of 'Convertible Securities' (including options) does not count towards the 15% Capacity provided that the entity issued the Convertible Securities:

- (a) before it was listed and disclosed the existence and material terms of the Convertible Securities in the prospectus, PDS or information memorandum lodged with ASX under the Listing Rule 1.1 condition 3;
or
- (b) after it was listed and complied with the Listing Rules when it did so.

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will issue up to a total of 29,388,889 Placement Options to the Placement Participants, on the basis of one Placement Option for every two Placement Shares issued to the participant. In addition, those Placement Options, and any Shares issued upon exercise of the Placement Options will be excluded from the calculation of the Company's 15% Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1, maintaining the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue of the Placement Options.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to issue the Placement Options in relation to the Placement.

Under the terms of an agreement entered into with the Lead Manager, the Company has agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue up to 5,766,667 options to subscribe for fully paid ordinary shares in the Company (**Fee Options**) to the Lead Manager in consideration for their services as lead manager in connection with the Placement.

The Fee Options are exercisable at \$0.08 per option and will expire on the date which is 3 years from their date of issue.

Resolution 4 is an Ordinary Resolution and seeks Shareholder approval to the issue of the Fee Options for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1.

Listing Rule 7.1

As described above, subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12 month period (**15% Capacity**).

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval to issue Options in satisfaction of payment of the Fee Options. Resolution 5 seeks Shareholder approval to issue Shares in satisfaction of payment of the Fee Shares, should the minimum raise condition be met.

The Company has agreed to reimburse Oakley in respect of expenses incurred incidental to Placement, and further indemnify Oakley and related persons against losses, liabilities and claims in respect of the Placement.

The Mandate Agreement makes provisions (inter alia) for certain covenants to be observed by the Company. Either the Lead Manager or the Company may terminate the Mandate Agreement at any time by notice to the other party.

Directors' recommendation

Resolution 8 – Issue of Shares to Robert Cooper

Resolution 8 seeks Shareholder approval to issue up to 1,000,000 fully paid ordinary Shares in the Company to Mr Robert Cooper, the Managing Director of the Company (or his nominee) (**MD Shares**), as part of a remuneration bonus.

Approval for the issue of the MD Shares is sought in accordance with Listing Rule 10.11. As approval is being sought under Listing Rule 10.11, approval will not be required under Listing Rule 7.1.

1.1. MD Shares terms

The MD Shares are fully paid ordinary shares, on the same terms as all other existing ordinary shares on issue.

1.2. Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 requires that an entity must obtain the approval of Shareholders to issue securities to any of the following persons:

- (i) a Related Party;
- (ii) a person who is, or was at any time in the six months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%) holder in the entity;
- (iii) a person who is, or was at any time in the six months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the entity and who has nominated a director to the board of the entity (in the case of a trust, to the board of the responsible entity of the trust) pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or the expectation to do so;
- (iv) an associate of a person referred to in items (i) to (ii); or
- (v) a person whose relationship with the entity or a person referred to in items (i) to (iv) is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by security holders,

(individually referred to as an **Allottee** and jointly as **Allottees**), and in doing so must provide the information specified in Listing Rule 10.13, unless an exception applies.

Mr Robert Cooper is the managing director of the Company, and accordingly, a Related Party of the Company.

Resolution 8 seeks the required Shareholder approval to proceed with the issue of the MD Shares under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11.

If Resolution 8 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the MD Shares to Mr Cooper (or his nominee) and he will be remunerated accordingly.

If Resolution 8 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the MD Shares to Mr Cooper (or his nominee) and the Company may need to consider other forms of remuneration and incentive remuneration.

If Resolution 8 is passed, the MD Shares must be issued within one month of that approval or else the approval will lapse.

1.3. Listing Rule 7.1 - Issues exceeding 15% of capital

Listing Rule 7.1 prohibits a listed company, except in certain cases, from issuing, in the 12 month period immediately preceding the date of the issue or agreement, new Equity Securities equivalent in number to more than 15% of the total number of ordinary securities on issue at the beginning of that period (**15% Capacity**) without either the prior approval of a majority of disinterested shareholders, or the issue otherwise falls within one of the prescribed exceptions to Listing Rule 7.1 (**15% Rule**).

However, Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 14) provides that where an issue of securities is approved by Shareholders for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11, then it will be excluded from the calculation of the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Board is not seeking Shareholder approval to the issue of the MD Shares under Listing Rule 7.1.

1.4. Information for Shareholders

For the purposes of Listing Rule 10.13 and for all other purposes the following information is provided to Shareholders:

- (i) the MD Shares are proposed to be issued to Mr Robert Cooper (or his nominee), as a bonus to form part of his remuneration as Managing Director of the Company;
- (ii) Mr Cooper is a related party of the Company by virtue of being the Managing Director and falls into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.1. In the event the MD Shares are issued to a nominee, that person will fall into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.4;
- (iii) 1,000,000 MD Shares will be issued to Mr Robert Cooper (or his nominee);
- (iv) the MD Shares will all be issued on the same terms as all other ordinary shares on issue;
- (v) subject to Shareholder approval, the MD Shares will all be issued no later than one month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules);
- (vi) the MD Shares will be issued for nil cash consideration as they will be issued as part of the Director's remuneration package, and therefore no funds will be raised as a result of the issue;
- (vii) the current total remuneration paid to Mr Cooper during the year ended 30 June 2025 (and disclosed in the 2025 Annual Report) was \$55,668 (inclusive of superannuation contributions), noting that Mr Cooper was appointed CEO on 26 May 2025 and Managing Director on 2 July 2025. Mr Cooper's current remuneration is \$2,500 per day (plus 12% superannuation) for 15 days per month (ie. \$37,500 per month (plus 12% superannuation) for 75% time commitment). Following shareholder approval at the 2025 AGM, Mr Cooper was issued 5,000,000 Options to subscribe for fully paid ordinary Shares in the Company, exercisable at \$0.045 each and expiring 3 years after the date of issue.
- (viii) the MD Shares are not being issued under any agreement; and
- (ix) a voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

1.5. Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

A public company is also prohibited under Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act from giving a Financial Benefit (as that term is defined below) to a Related Party of the company unless shareholder approval is obtained or unless the benefit falls within one of various exceptions to the general prohibition. The process for and requirements that need to be met for the convening of the shareholder's meeting are set out in Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act.

A "Financial Benefit" for the purposes of the Corporations Act has a very wide meaning. It includes the public company paying money or issuing securities to the Related Party. In determining whether or not a financial benefit is being given, it is necessary to look to the economic and commercial substance and effect of what the public company is doing (rather than just the legal form). Any consideration which is given for the financial benefit is to be disregarded, even if it is full or adequate.

The issue of the MD Shares will confer a Financial Benefit on Robert Cooper as a Related Party of the Company. Under Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act, the Company is not required to obtain the approval of Shareholders if the Financial Benefit is reasonable remuneration on the basis of the circumstances of the Company and also of the recipient, Robert Cooper (including the responsibilities involved in his role).

The Board (Mr Cooper excluded) is of the view that the "remuneration" exception in section 211 of the Corporations Act is available to the Company. The Board believes that the MD Shares are an effective remuneration tool and incentive tool, which preserves the cash reserves of the Company whilst providing valuable remuneration and incentive to Mr Cooper. Accordingly, the Company is not seeking shareholder approval for Resolution 8 for the purposes of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act.

1.6. Board recommendation

Resolution 8 is an ordinary resolution.

On the basis of Mr Cooper's skills, qualifications and experience, the Board (other than Mr Cooper) recommends Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 8.
