QUE is a public company limited by shares that is incorporated and domiciled in Western Australia and has been listed on the Australian Securities Exchange (**ASX**) since November 1998. (ASX Code: QUE).

Queste's results incorporate the results of controlled entity, ASX-listed investment company (**LIC**), Orion Equities Limited ABN 77 000 742 843 (ASX:OEQ) (**Orion** or **OEQ**). The Company has a 59.86% (9,367,653 shares) shareholding interest in Orion (30 June 2025: 59.86% (9,367,653 shares)).

(a) Securities on Issue

At the Balance Date (and currently), the Company had 27,072,332 listed fully paid ordinary shares (2025: 27,072,332 fully paid ordinary shares) on issue.

All such shares are listed on ASX. The Company does not have other securities on issue.

(b) Unmarketable Parcel Share Buy-Back²

On 20 July 2026, Queste announced that it was undertaking a 'minimum holding buy-back' of ordinary shares for holders of less than a marketable parcel of shares in the Company (**Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back**) as at 7:00 pm (Perth time) on 16 July 2026 (**Record Date**). Under the ASX listing Rules, a marketable parcel of shares is a parcel worth \$500 or more, based on the closing price of the shares on ASX.³

The Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back will allow shareholders who hold less than a marketable parcel of shares (**Unmarketable Parcel**) in the Company (**Unmarketable Parcel Holders**) to sell their shares back to the Company at a price of \$0.052, being the Volume Weighted Average Price (**VWAP**) over the last 5 days in which the Company's shares traded on ASX up to and including the Record Date (**Buy-Back Price**) without incurring any brokerage costs.

The Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back is a 'minimum holding buy-back' under section 257B of the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)* and accordingly does not require shareholder approval, and any shares acquired by the Company under the Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back will be cancelled.

Based on the Buy-Back Price and as at the Record Date, there were 85 Unmarketable Parcel Holders (from a total of 221 shareholders) with an Unmarketable Parcel of Shares, representing in total 250,577 shares (0.93% of total shares on issue) and an aggregate value of \$13,030.

The Company recognises that an Unmarketable Parcel can be difficult and expensive (relative to their value) to sell; the Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back enables Unmarketable Parcel Holders to sell their small shareholdings without having to act through a broker or incurring any brokerage costs. The Company expects that undertaking the Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back will also reduce the ongoing administrative costs (including printing and mailing costs and share registry expenses) associated with maintaining Unmarketable Parcels on the Company's share register.

If Unmarketable Parcel Holders would like to opt-out of the Unmarketable Parcel Buy-Back and not have their Shares bought-back by the Company, they must complete and return a Share Retention Form to the Company by 5:00 pm (Perth time) on Friday, 4 September 2026.

1.3. Orion's Assets

(a) Bentley Capital Limited (ASX:BEL)

Bentley Capital Limited (**Bentley** or **BEL**) is an LIC with a current exposure to Australian equities.

Queste holds 1.61% (1,225,752 shares) of Bentley's issued ordinary share capital with Orion holding 26.95% (20,513,783 shares) of Bentley's issued ordinary share capital (2025: Queste held 1,225,752 shares (1.61%) and Orion held 20,513,783 shares (26.95%)).

(b) Strike Resources Limited (ASX:SRK)

As at 30 June 2026 and currently, Orion holds 10,000,000 shares (3.52%) (2025: 10,000,000 shares; 3.52%) in Strike Resources Limited (ASX:SRK) (**Strike** or **SRK**) while Associate entity, Bentley currently holds 53,739,857 Strike shares (18.94%) (30 June 2025: 56,739,857 shares). Therefore, Orion currently has a deemed relevant interest in 63,739,857 Strike shares (22.46%).

The SRK share price has traded within a range of 2.2 cents (on 24 June 2026) to 5.2 cents (on 30 September 2025) since 1 July 2025, with a bid price of 0.03 cents (on 30 June 2026) and a current price of 2.4 cents (as at 26 August 2026).

Strike is an ASX listed resource company which is advancing its high-grade Apurimac Iron Ore Project in Peru where it has previously exported "Apurimac Premium Lump" DSO product of ~65% Fe⁴.⁵

In March 2026, Strike entered into an agreement to sell a further 28.52% indirect minority interest in the Apurimac Project to JE United Ltd (**JEL**) for A\$5.5 million cash, with completion to occur after satisfaction of certain conditions precedent, which must be fulfilled or waived on or before 16 March 2027; post completion, Strike will own 51.48% and JEL will own 48.52% of the Apurimac Project.⁶

Strike also has a 27.7% (31.01 million shares) interest in LE Minerals Limited (formerly Lithium Energy Limited⁷) (ASX:LEL) (**LE Minerals** or **LEL**), which was spun-out of Strike under a \$9 Million IPO in May 2021.

Queste Chairman and Managing Director, Farooq Khan is the Executive Chairman of Strike and Queste Executive Director. Company Secretary, Victor Ho, is an Executive Director and the Company Secretary of Strike.

(c) **LE Minerals Limited (ASX: LEL)**

- (a) Bentley has a 134,843 shareholding (0.13%) in LE Minerals (30 June 2025: 134,843 shares; 0.13%).
- (b) Strike is the largest shareholder of LE Minerals with 31,010,000 shares (27.7%) (30 June 2025: 31,010,000 shares; 27.7%).

LEL shares were reinstated to quotation on ASX on 16 March 2026⁸, after being suspended since 25 October 2024⁹ due to the sale of the Solaroz Lithium Brine Project in Argentina¹⁰.

The LEL share price has traded within a range of \$0.295 (on 25 May 2026) to \$0.455 (on 16 March 2026) since LEL shares were reinstated to quotation on ASX on 16 March 2026, with a bid price of \$0.31 (on 30 June 2026) and a current price of \$0.32 (as at 26 August 2026).

LE Minerals changed its name from "Lithium Energy Limited" after receipt of shareholder approval on 28 May 2026¹¹. LE Minerals' ASX Code remains as "LEL".

LE Minerals is an ASX listed battery minerals company with the following exploration/evaluation and development projects currently¹²:

- Capricorn Gold-Copper Belt Project (LEL:51%, increasing to 100% on completion of tranche 2 acquisition by April 2027¹³) in Central Queensland, where LE Minerals is undertaking an extensive program of exploration over identified priority areas, targeting multiple large-scale gold, copper, molybdenum and zinc mineralised systems¹⁴.

- Burke¹⁵/Mt Dromedary^{16,17} and Corella¹⁸ Graphite Projects (**Graphite Projects**) (LEL:100%) in Queensland, which contains high grade JORC Indicated and Inferred Mineral Resources of graphite; and
- White Plains Lithium Brine Project (LEL:100%) in Utah, United States, where LE Minerals has encountered near surface lithium brine mineralisation in an upper aquifer¹⁹.

In December 2025, LE Minerals completed the sale of the balance (tranche 2) of its interest in the Solaroz Lithium Brine Project in Argentina, receiving US\$21.7 million cash²⁰. LE Minerals has received a total of US\$55.5 million cash from the Solaroz sale, with a further US\$3 million held in escrow and US\$4.5 million contingent deferred payment possible.²⁰

On 26 May 2026, LE Minerals announced that it had entered into a share sale and purchase agreement (**SPA**) with M Battery Materials Limited (**MBM**) for the sale of the Graphite Projects for consideration totalling \$20 million, comprising \$5 million cash and \$15 million in shares in MBM (**Consideration Shares**) (the **Graphite Sale**).²¹ MBM plans to raise a minimum of \$15 million under an Initial Public Offering (**IPO**) and seek admission to the Official List of the ASX as a specialist battery materials company focused on developing and supplying minerals and materials that are critical to the global energy transition (proposed ASX Code : MBM). LE Minerals will seek shareholder approval to distribute the Consideration Shares in-specie to shareholders, subject to whether and to what extent ASX imposes escrow on these shares and after the lodgment of MBM's IPO Prospectus. If the SPA proceeds to completion after the successful IPO of MBM and LE Minerals shareholders approve the in-specie distribution of the (\$15 million) Consideration Shares, Strike's 27.7% shareholding in LE Minerals will mean its entitlement under the in-specie distribution will be \$4.155 million of MBM shares.

Queste Chairman and Managing Director, Farooq Khan is the Executive Chairman of LE Minerals and Queste Executive and Director Company Secretary, Victor Ho, is an Executive Director and the Company Secretary of LE Minerals.

3. Material Business Risks

Risks facing the Company can be divided into the broad categories of operations, market and compliance risks:

- Operations risk refers to risks arising from day-to-day operational activities which may result in direct or indirect loss from inadequate or failed internal processes, people or systems or external events. The Company has clear accounting and internal control systems to manage risks to the accuracy of financial information and other financial risks. The Executive Chairman/Managing Director and Executive Director (also the Company Secretary) have delegated responsibility from the Board for identification of operations risks generally, for putting processes in place to mitigate them and monitoring compliance with those processes.
- Market risk encompasses risks to the Company's performance from changes in equity prices, interest rates, currency exchange rates, capital markets and economic conditions generally. Management represents the first line in managing this risk, under the supervision of the Board. The Board retains final responsibility to assess the Company's exposure to these risks and set the strategic direction for managing them.
- Compliance risk is the risk of failure to comply with all applicable legal and regulatory requirements and industry standards and the corresponding impact on the Company's business, reputation and financial condition. The Company's compliance risk management strategy ensures compliance with key legislation affecting the Company's activities. The Company Secretary has oversight responsibility for managing the Company's compliance risk. The Company Secretary takes external legal and other professional advice as necessary. Comprehensive advice is taken from appropriate external professionals when establishing an operation in a new country and standing relationships are maintained with relevant external advisers, whose brief includes alerting the Company to material changes in law and government policy.

The Company also has policies on responsible business practices and ethical behaviour including a Statement of Values, Board Charter, Code of Conduct, Continuous Disclosure Policy, Anti-Bribery and Anti-Corruption Policy, Whistleblower Policy, Share Trading Policy and its Corporate Governance Statement (which is updated and released on ASX annually) to maintain confidence in the Company's integrity and ensure legal compliance.

The Company's approach to risk management is not stationary; it evolves constantly in response to developments in operations and changing market conditions.

1.1 Background

This financial report covers the consolidated financial statements of the consolidated entity consisting of Queste Communications Ltd, its subsidiary (controlled entity, Orion Equities Limited ABN 77 000 742 843 (ASX:OEQ) (**Orion** or **OEQ**) and Orion's controlled entities) and an investment in its associate entity Bentley Capital Limited (ASX:BEL) ABN 87 088 128 218 (**Bentley** or **BEL**) (the **Consolidated Entity** or **Questa**). The financial report is presented in the Australian currency.

Questa Communications Ltd (ASX:QUE) (the **Company** or **QUE**) is a company limited by shares, incorporated in Western Australia, Australia and whose shares are publicly traded on the Australian Securities Exchange (**ASX**).

1.2. Basis of preparation

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, Australian Accounting Interpretations and the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)*, as appropriate for for-profit entities.

Compliance with IFRS

The consolidated financial statements of the Consolidated Entity also comply with International Financial Reporting Standards (**IFRS**) as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board (**IASB**).

Reporting Basis and Financial Statement Presentation

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals and going concern basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, and financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Going concern

The Directors have a reasonable belief that the going concern assumption for the Consolidated Entity is appropriate based on, inter alia, the following matters:

- (a) the current cash and liquid investments position of the Consolidated Entity relative to its fixed and discretionary expenditure commitments;
- (b) the ability of the QUE Directors to suspend or reduce personnel, corporate and administration expenses, including their cash-based remuneration (or convert to equity, with prior shareholder approval) to conserve the Consolidated Entity's cash;
- (c) the ability of QUE to dispose of shares in ASX listed Orion and Bentley; and
- (d) the potential for Orion to undertake distributions to their shareholders.

The Directors are not aware of any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt upon the Consolidated Entity's ability to continue as a going concern.

1.3. Principles of Consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the assets and liabilities of the Company as at 30 June 2026 and the results of its subsidiaries and investments in associates for the year then ended. The Company and its subsidiaries are referred to in this financial report as Queste or the Consolidated Entity.

All inter-company balances and transactions between entities in the Consolidated Entity, including any unrealised profits or losses, have been eliminated on consolidation.

1.4. Comparative Figures

Where required by the Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial period.

1.5. New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Consolidated Entity has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

1.6. New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet mandatory or early adopted

Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations that have recently been issued or amended but are not yet mandatory, have not been early adopted by the Consolidated Entity for the annual reporting period ended 30 June 2026. The Consolidated Entity's assessment of the impact of these new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations, most relevant to the Consolidated Entity, are set out below.

AASB 18 Presentation and Disclosure in Financial Statements

This standard is applicable to annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2027 and early adoption is permitted. The standard replaces IAS 1 'Presentation of Financial Statements', with many of the original disclosure requirements retained and there will be no impact on the recognition and measurement of items in the financial statements.

The standard will affect presentation and disclosure in the financial statements, including introducing five categories in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income: operating, investing, financing, income taxes and discontinued operations.

The standard introduces two mandatory sub-totals in the statement: 'Operating profit' and 'Profit before financing and income taxes'.

There are also new disclosure requirements for 'management-defined performance measures', such as earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortisation ('EBITDA') or 'adjusted profit'.

The standard provides enhanced guidance on grouping of information (aggregation and disaggregation), including whether to present this information in the primary financial statements or in the notes.

The Consolidated Entity will adopt this standard from 1 July 2027 and it is expected that there will be a significant change to the layout of the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

(a) Market risk

Market risk is the risk that the fair value and/or future cash flows from a financial instrument will fluctuate as a result of changes in market factors. (i) Price risk

The Consolidated Entity is exposed to equity securities price risk. This arises from investments held by the Consolidated Entity and classified in the Statement of Financial Position at fair value through profit or loss. The Consolidated Entity is not exposed to commodity price risk, save where this has an indirect impact via market risk and equity securities price risk.

The value of a financial instrument will fluctuate as a result of changes in market prices, whether those changes are caused by factors specific to the individual instrument or its issuer or factors affecting all instruments in the market. By its nature as an investment company, the Consolidated Entity will always be subject to market risk as it invests its capital in securities that are not risk free - the market price of these securities can and will fluctuate. The Consolidated Entity's business activities do not necessitate the requirement for collateral as a means of mitigating the risk of financial loss from defaults.
