The Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders of Shine Justice Ltd will be held at Level 13, 160 Ann Street, Brisbane, Queensland (Shine Lawyers) on Wednesday 14 October 2026 at 12pm (noon) (Brisbane time).

Ordinary business

Item 1 – Annual financial report, Directors’ report and auditor’s report

To receive and consider the annual financial report of the Company, together with the Directors’ report and the auditor’s report, for the financial year ended 30 June 2026.

Item 2 – Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an **advisory only resolution**:

That the Remuneration Report for the year ended 30 June 2026 be adopted.

Item 3 – Re-election of Director

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

That Teresa Dyson, who retires in accordance with rule 19.3(b) of the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4 and being eligible, offers herself for re-election, be re-elected as a Director.

Item 4 – Election of Director

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

That Simon Morrison, who retires in accordance with rule 19.3 of the Constitution, and being eligible, offers himself for election, be elected as a Director.

Voting exclusion statement

The Company will disregard any votes cast on item 2 by or on behalf of any member of Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report, or any Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, the Company need not disregard a vote if it is cast by a person appointed in writing as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote (in accordance with the directions as to how to vote on the proxy form) or by the person chairing the Meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote and the appointment as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the resolution and expressly authorises the person chairing the Meeting to exercise the proxy even if the resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Proxies

Please note that:

- (a) a Shareholder entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (b) a proxy need not be a Shareholder;
- (c) a Shareholder may appoint a body corporate or an individual as its proxy;
- (d) a body corporate appointed as a Shareholder's proxy may appoint an individual as its representative to exercise any of the powers that the body may exercise as the Shareholder's proxy; and
- (e) Shareholders entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise, but where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

The proxy form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging proxy forms. If a Shareholder appoints a body corporate as its proxy and the body corporate wishes to appoint an individual as its representative, a certificate of the appointment of corporate representative should be completed and lodged in the manner specified below. If proxy holders vote on a poll, they must vote all directed proxies as directed. Any directed proxies which are not voted on a poll will automatically default to the person chairing the Meeting, who must vote all proxies as directed.

To ensure your votes are counted, you are encouraged to direct your proxy as to how to vote on item 2 by indicating your preference (by completing any of the 'For', 'Against' or 'Abstain' boxes on the proxy form).

The person chairing the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of item 2.

If you appoint the person chairing the Meeting as your proxy but do not direct the person chairing the Meeting how to vote in respect of item 2, you will be directing the person chairing the Meeting to **vote in favour of item 2** and the person chairing the Meeting will vote in this way, even though those items are connected with the remuneration of Key Management Personnel.

Part 2: Explanatory Statement

1 Introduction

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in relation to the Annual General Meeting to be held at Level 13, 160 Ann Street, Brisbane, Queensland (Shine Lawyers) on Wednesday 14 October 2026, commencing at 12pm (noon) (Brisbane time).

The purpose of this Explanatory Statement is to provide Shareholders with the information known to the Company that the Board considers material to their decision on whether to approve the resolutions in the Notice. This document is important and should be read in conjunction with the Notice.

Capitalised terms are defined in section 3.

2 Ordinary business

Item 1 – Annual financial report, Directors’ report and auditor’s report

The first item of business of the Meeting is to receive and consider the financial report, together with the Directors’ and auditor’s reports for the financial year ended 30 June 2026.

No resolution is required for this item of business. However, as a Shareholder, you may submit a written question to the person chairing the Meeting about the management of the Company or to its auditor, PwC, prior to the Meeting, if the question to PwC relates to:

- the content of the auditor’s report; or
- the conduct of the audit of the financial report.

All written questions must be received by the Company no later than the fifth business day before the Meeting (by Wednesday 7 October 2026).

All questions must be sent to the Company, not directly to the auditor.

PwC will attend the Meeting and will answer written questions submitted before the Meeting.

PwC will also be available to answer questions from Shareholders relevant to:

- (a) the conduct of the audit;
- (b) the preparation and content of the auditor’s report;
- (c) the accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

Item 2 – Remuneration Report

Shareholders are entitled to vote on the question of whether the Remuneration Report contained in the Annual Report is adopted.

The Remuneration Report explains the Company’s remuneration policy and reports the remuneration arrangements for Key Management Personnel.

Shareholders should note that the resolution is ‘advisory’ only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.



However, the Corporations Act provides that if 25% or more of the votes that are cast are voted against the adoption of the remuneration report at two consecutive annual general meetings, Shareholders will be required to vote at the second of those meetings on a resolution (a 'spill' resolution) that another meeting be held within 90 days at which all of the company's directors (other than the managing director) who were in office at the date of the approval of the later directors' report must stand for re-election.

The resolution to approve the remuneration report was passed on a poll by 97.8% of the votes cast at the Company's 2025 annual general meeting. Following consideration of the Remuneration Report, the person chairing the Meeting will give Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask questions or make comments about the Remuneration Report.

The Directors unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of item 2, noting that Directors, other Key Management Personnel and their Closely Related Parties are excluded from voting on the item.

Item 3 – Re-election of Director

The third item of business of the Meeting relates to the re-election of a Director.

The Constitution and the Listing Rules require the Company to hold an election of Directors each year. No director (who is not a managing director) may hold office without re-election beyond the third annual general meeting following the meeting at which the director was last elected or re-elected.

Teresa Dyson was last elected by Shareholders at the Company's 2023 annual general meeting and now offers herself for re-election. Set out below are details of the candidate for re-election, together with the recommendation of the Board.

David Bayes was also last elected by Shareholders at the Company's 2023 annual general meeting and has advised the Board that he will retire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting and will not seek re-election.

Teresa Dyson BA, LLB (Hons), MTax, MAppFin, CPA, FAICD

Teresa Dyson was appointed as an independent Non-executive Director by the Board in February 2020 and was elected by Shareholders at the Company's 2020 and 2023 annual general meetings.

In accordance with the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4, Teresa Dyson holds office until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting and, being eligible, offers herself for re-election.

Teresa is an experienced company director whose career has spanned both the public and private sectors. Teresa is an admitted lawyer and has previously been a partner at a global law firm and professional services firm.

Teresa is currently chair of Southern Cross Media Group Limited (following its acquisition of Seven West Media Limited of which Teresa was a director), chair of Humm Group Limited, deputy chair and chair of the audit & risk committee of Invest Gold Coast and director of Australian Athletics. Teresa is also a member of the Takeovers Panel. Teresa is a former director of Genex Power Limited, Brighter Super, Energy Queensland, UN Women National Committee Australia Ltd, Opera Queensland, National Housing Finance and Investment Corporation and Gold Coast Hospital and Health Board, a former chair of each of the Board of Taxation and the Business Law Section of the Law Council of Australia and a former member of the Foreign Investment Review Board.

Teresa chairs the Audit & Risk Management Committee of the Board and is a member of the Nomination and Remuneration Committee of the Board.

The non-candidate Directors unanimously recommend that Mrs Dyson be re-elected as a Director.



Item 4 – Election of Director

The fourth item of business of the Meeting relates to the election of Simon Morrison as a Director.

Simon Morrison was appointed as a Director in 2013. Mr Morrison ceased to hold the position of Managing Director in April 2026. As a result, he is no longer exempt from the retirement and election provisions in clause 19.3 of the Constitution.

In accordance with the Constitution, Simon Morrison holds office until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting and being eligible, offers himself for election.

Simon Morrison LLB

In April 2026, Simon transitioned from Managing Director to Executive Director to focus on advancing the Group's international growth agenda, including its International Mass Torts program.

Simon has long held an interest in international mass torts and righting wrong throughout the world when injustice has been evident. His leadership of Shine's international business reflects his passion to stand up for the little guy, leading an experienced team of lawyers to right wrongs for clients internationally.

Simon has represented Australia on the Board of Governors of the American Association for Justice, the peak body for plaintiff lawyers in the US and is a member of The Melvin M. Belli Society, an invitation only global organisation of trial lawyers.

Simon is a former National President of the Australian Lawyers' Alliance. He is also an acknowledged leader in workers' compensation matters and is a Queensland Law Society Accredited Specialist in personal injury law. Simon served as a non-executive director of Brisbane Festival from 2016 to 2025.

The non-candidate Directors unanimously recommend that Mr Morrison be elected as a Director.
