Notice of 2026 Annual General Meeting

Notice is given that the 2026 Annual General Meeting (**AGM**) of Silex Systems Limited (the **Company**, **Silex**) will be held as a **hybrid meeting** providing Shareholders with the opportunity to either attend in person or to participate online.

The meeting will be held on Friday, 16 October 2026 at 11.00am (Sydney time).

To attend in person and engage with Directors, Shareholders are invited to attend Dentons Australia Limited, 77 Castlereagh Street, Sydney NSW 2000.

The AGM will also be accessible to Shareholders via a live webcast as well as providing an online platform which will include the facility for Shareholders to ask questions in relation to the business of the meeting and to vote in real time at the meeting. These processes are set out in this Notice of Meeting.

The Directors of Silex encourage Shareholders to participate in the meeting via the online platform. Whilst Shareholders will be able to vote online during the meeting, this carries inherent risks, including in relation to the quality of your internet connection to the AGM webcast. Accordingly, Shareholders are encouraged to lodge a proxy ahead of the meeting, even if they are participating online.

Please lodge your proxy vote online at: www.investorvote.com.au prior to 11.00am (Sydney time) on Wednesday, 14 October 2026.

The Explanatory Memorandum to this Notice provides Shareholders with additional information on matters to be considered at the Meeting. The Explanatory Memorandum and the Proxy Form are part of this Notice. Please consider them in their entirety.

We invite Shareholders to submit questions in advance of the meeting. Shareholders may also submit written questions to the Company's auditor, PricewaterhouseCoopers, in relation to the content of the Auditor's Report or the conduct of the audit of the 2026 financial report. Any questions must be submitted by 5.00pm (Sydney time) on Friday, 9 October 2026.

At the Meeting, Shareholders as a whole will have a reasonable opportunity to ask questions and make comments on all items of business set out in this Notice.

This Notice of Meeting, which includes the following Agenda, Additional Information and Explanatory Memorandum, details the formal business to be dealt with at the AGM. In summary, this includes the following items of business:

The Board of Silex has determined pursuant to regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered as Shareholders at 7.00pm (Sydney time) on Wednesday, 14 October 2026.

How to participate in the AGM online:

By participating in the Meeting online, Shareholders will be able to:

- hear from representatives of the Company and view the Meeting presentations;
- submit questions at the appropriate time whilst the Meeting is in progress. The Chair will announce the appropriate time during the Meeting; and
- vote during the Meeting.

If you choose to participate in the Meeting online, registration will open 30 minutes before the Meeting.

ITEM 2: RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF THE REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolution as a non-binding **ordinary resolution**:

“THAT the Remuneration Report for the year ended 30 June 2026 be adopted.”

Note: The Remuneration Report is set out on pages 30 to 43 of the Company's Annual Report.

Voting Exclusion Statement – Resolution 1

Pursuant to section 250R and in accordance with 250BD of the *Corporations Act 2001*, a vote must not be cast by, or on behalf of, a member of the Key Management Personnel, or closely related parties of such member (each, an **Excluded Person**).

However, the Excluded Person may cast a vote on this Resolution if:

- (a) the vote is not cast on behalf of another Excluded Person and they have been appointed as proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; or
- (b) the Excluded Person is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution, and expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

ITEM 3: RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECT MR CRAIG ROY AS A NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“THAT Mr Craig Roy, being a Director of the Company, who retires as a Director in accordance with Rule 6.1(f) of the Constitution of the Company and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election, is re-elected as a Director of the Company.”

ITEM 4: RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF INCREASE TO NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS' FEE CAP

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“THAT, approval be given for all purposes, including Rule 6.3(a) of the Company's Constitution and ASX Listing Rule 10.17, for the maximum aggregate remuneration that may be paid to all the Non-executive Directors of the Company in any financial year commencing on or after 1 July 2026, be increased by \$450,000 from \$750,000 per annum to \$1,200,000 per annum.”

Voting Exclusion Statement – Resolution 3

In accordance with ASX Listing Rules 14.11 and 10.17, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 3 by or on behalf of:

- (a) a Director; or
- (b) an associate of that person or those persons.

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of this resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 3, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on Resolution 3 in that way; or
- (b) the Chair of the Meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on Resolution 3, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on Resolution 3 as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on Resolution 3; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on Resolution 3 in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting Prohibition Statement – Resolution 3

Pursuant to section 250BD of the *Corporations Act 2001*, a vote must not be cast as proxy by, or on behalf of, a member of the Key Management Personnel, or closely related parties of such member (each, an **Excluded Person**).

However, the Excluded Person may cast a vote on Resolution 3 if:

- (a) the vote is not cast on behalf of another Excluded Person and they have been appointed as proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; or
- (b) the Excluded Person is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution, and expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Explanatory Memorandum following provides further details of the proposed resolutions.

1. For the purposes of this meeting, Shares will be taken to be held by the persons who are registered as Shareholders at 7.00pm (Sydney time) on Wednesday, 14 October 2026. Accordingly, transactions registered after that time will be disregarded in determining Shareholders entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting.
2. A Shareholder entitled to attend and vote is entitled to appoint no more than two (2) proxies.
3. Votes may be cast “For”, “Against” or not voted on a resolution (“Abstain”). A Shareholder may direct a proxy how to vote on any resolution by placing a mark (e.g., a cross) in the appropriate box on the Proxy Form and their votes may only be exercised in that manner.
4. If a Shareholder is entitled to cast two (2) or more votes at the AGM, the Shareholder may appoint two (2) proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise on a poll. If the appointment does not specify the proportion or the number of the Shareholder’s votes that each proxy may exercise, each proxy is entitled to exercise half of the Shareholder’s votes on a poll. Fractions will be disregarded. A proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company.
5. The form of proxy must be signed by the Shareholder or the Shareholder’s attorney. Proxies given by corporations must be signed either under seal or under the hand of a duly authorised officer, representative or attorney. In the case of joint holders, the form of proxy should be signed by all holders.
6. To be valid, the form appointing the proxy and the power of attorney or other authority (if any) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power of attorney must be lodged at the registered office or the share registry of the Company, Computershare Investor Services Pty Limited, GPO Box 242, Melbourne Victoria 3001 (or by facsimile to 1800 783 447 within Australia or +61 3 9473 2555 outside Australia) at least 48 hours prior to the AGM (that is, by no later than 11.00am (Sydney time) on Wednesday, 14 October 2026). A form of proxy accompanies this Notice of AGM.
7. Alternatively, you may appoint a proxy using an electronic facility available at the website www.investorvote.com.au. At the website, Shareholders will be able to view an electronic version of the Proxy Form, which will accept proxy appointments and register them accordingly.
8. Custodian voting – For Intermediary Online subscribers only (custodians) please visit www.intermediaryonline.com to submit your voting intentions.
9. Please refer to the accompanying Proxy Form for further detailed information regarding how to vote on items of business.
10. The Chair intends to call a poll on each of the resolutions set out in this Notice of Meeting.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders to help them determine how to vote on the Resolutions set out in the Notice of Meeting.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

Under the *Corporations Act 2001*, the Company's 2026 Annual Report to Shareholders, which includes the Financial Report, as well as the Directors' Report (which includes the Remuneration Report) and the Auditor's Report, must be laid before the Meeting. The Company's 2026 Annual Report is available on the Company's website at www.silex.com.au and has been distributed.

Shareholders are not required to vote on the Financial Report or the Directors' and Auditor's Reports. However, an opportunity for Shareholders to discuss these reports will be provided at the Meeting. Shareholders may also submit questions in advance of the meeting as outlined on page 1 of this Notice of Meeting.

Shareholders will also have a reasonable opportunity to ask the Company's auditor questions relevant to the conduct of the audit, the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report, the accounting policies adopted by the Company in preparing the financial statements, and the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF THE REMUNERATION REPORT

The Directors' Report for the year ended 30 June 2026 contains the Remuneration Report, which sets out the policy for the remuneration of the Directors and other Key Management Personnel. The Remuneration Report is set out on pages 30 to 43 of the Company's 2026 Annual Report which is available from the Company's website at www.silex.com.au. An opportunity to discuss the Remuneration Report will be provided at the Meeting.

The Company's remuneration strategy is designed to provide a link between the achievement of the Company's strategic objectives and executive rewards. It is designed to reward, motivate and retain the Company's executive team through market competitive remuneration and benefits, to support the success of the Company's business and ultimately to create shareholder value.

The *Corporations Act 2001* requires that a resolution be put to the vote that the Remuneration Report be adopted. The *Corporations Act 2001* expressly provides that the vote is advisory only, and does not bind the Directors or the Company. The Board of the Company will take into account the discussion on this Resolution and the outcome of the vote when considering the future remuneration arrangements of the Company.

The *Corporations Act 2001* provides Shareholders with the opportunity to remove the whole board (except the CEO/Managing Director) if the Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more (**Strike**) at two consecutive annual general meetings. The Company's Remuneration Report did not receive a Strike at the 2025 AGM. If the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at this Meeting, Shareholders should be aware that if a second Strike is received at the Company's 2027 AGM, this may result in a re-election of the Board.

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution. The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of Resolution 1. If the Chair is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chair is to vote on Resolution 1, by signing and returning the Proxy Form, you are considered to have provided the Chair with an express authorisation for the Chair to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chair's intention, even though the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel of the Company.

Board Recommendation

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECT MR CRAIG ROY AS A DIRECTOR

Rule 6.1(f) of the Company's Constitution requires an election of directors to take place each year with at least one director (excluding the CEO/Managing Director) retiring from office. The Director referred to in Resolution 2 (Mr Craig Roy) is retiring in accordance with Rule 6.1(f) and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Mr Craig Roy has been a Director of Silex since January 2019, and has served as Chair since his appointment. He also currently serves as Chair of the Company's Remuneration and Nomination Committee and is a member of the Audit and Risk Committee.

Mr Roy is an experienced company director and senior executive who has held a number of leadership roles in innovation and technology. He is currently Chair of the Australian Research Data Commons (ARDC), and a Non-executive Director of Australian Composites Manufacturing CRC Limited, and Omico, a medical oncology not-for profit organisation. He has held various director and Chair positions in several prominent Australian organisations with technology and big data specialisations including Data 61, the Australian National Commission of UNESCO, Sydney Water and the University of Technology, Sydney Vice Chancellor's Industry Board.

He was the Deputy Chief Executive Officer of CSIRO, Australia's pre-eminent national science and technology organisation from 2010 until 2018, and his main responsibilities included strategy, commercialisation and business development, innovation and entrepreneurship programs, growing the international business, environmental sustainability, communications and governance. Additionally, Mr Roy was responsible for overseeing CSIRO's science and diverse research portfolio of investments to ensure maximum benefits from an investment of approximately \$1 billion each year.

Mr Roy has also served as a Non-executive Director of the Company's US-based joint venture and exclusive licensee of the SILEX uranium enrichment technology, Global Laser Enrichment LLC (GLE), since January 2021. He commenced his second two-year term as Chair of GLE's Governing Board on 1 January 2026.

Mr Roy currently holds 130,000 Silex Shares. If elected, the Board considers Mr Roy will be an independent director.

Board Recommendation

The Board recommends (with Mr Roy abstaining and not voting) that Shareholders vote in favour of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF INCREASE TO NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS' FEE CAP

Under Rule 6.3(a) of Silex's Constitution, and ASX Listing Rule 10.17, the maximum aggregate amount of remuneration payable to Non-executive Directors of \$750,000 per annum was approved by Shareholders at the Company's AGM in 2011 (**NED Fee Cap**). Shareholder approval is sought to approve an increase in the maximum aggregate amount which may be paid as Non-executive Directors' fees in any financial year by \$450,000 from \$750,000 to \$1,200,000.

The Board considers that it is reasonable to seek Shareholder approval to increase the NED Fee Cap to create capacity to appoint further Non-executive Directors beyond the current three Non-executive Directors and expand the Board, where it is considered appropriate:

- in light of the increasing scope and complexity of Silex and GLE;
- to maintain the independence and increase the diversity of the Board; and/or
- to assist in ensuring appropriate and coordinated Board succession planning.

Resolution 3 therefore seeks the approval of Shareholders to increase the NED Fee Cap by \$450,000 from \$750,000 to \$1,200,000 per annum. These amounts are inclusive of superannuation. If approved, the increase will be treated as applying in respect of each financial year of the Company commencing on or after 1 July 2026. The Company will continue to set the actual level of remuneration of its Non-executive Directors within the NED Fee Cap after having regard to independent external advice, market practice, Board performance and other appropriate factors.

In the event the increase is approved, the Board does not intend to fully utilise the increased NED Fee Cap in the current year. However, it will provide the Board with flexibility to do so, where the Board considers it appropriate in light of the factors noted above.

Additional information required by Listing Rule 10.17

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.17, the following additional information is provided in relation to Resolution 3:

- i) No securities have been issued to any Non-executive Director under ASX Listing Rule 10.11 or 10.14 at any time in the preceding three years.
- ii) A voting exclusion statement for Resolution 3 is included in this Notice of Meeting.

If Shareholder approval is not obtained for Resolution 3, then the NED Fee Cap will remain at the current amount, being \$750,000.

Board Recommendation

Given the interest of each Non-Executive Director in Resolution 3, the Board does not consider it appropriate to make a recommendation to Shareholders regarding Resolution 3.

In the Notice of Meeting and Explanatory Memorandum the term Key Management Personnel has the same meaning as in the accounting standards issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board and means those persons having authority and responsibility for planning, directing and controlling the activities of the Company, or if the Company is part of a consolidated entity, of the consolidated entity, directly or indirectly, including any director (whether executive or otherwise) of the Company, or if the Company is part of a consolidated entity, of an entity within the consolidated group.

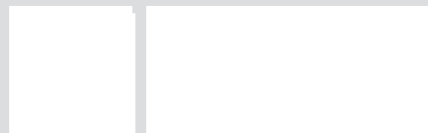
