Notice of General Meeting

Notice is hereby given that a General Meeting ("spill meeting") of shareholders of GLOBE INTERNATIONAL LIMITED ("the Company") will be held on **Tuesday, 20 October 2026 commencing at 12.00pm AEDT** or as soon as reasonably practical. This year's spill meeting will be held as a fully virtual meeting. Details on how to participate in the spill meeting are included in the attached Information for Shareholders. There will not be a physical meeting where shareholders can attend in person.

Shareholders should note that this spill meeting will only be held in the event that the spill resolution is put to shareholders and is passed by shareholders at the Company's 2026 Annual General Meeting ("AGM") to be held at 10:30am AEDT. If the spill resolution is not required to be put to shareholders at the AGM or is put to shareholders at the AGM but is not passed, this spill meeting will not be held.

This Notice of General Meeting must be read in conjunction with the Notice of the 2026 AGM enclosed for further details on the spill resolution. Also see Explanatory Note 1 below in relation to the background to this spill meeting.

1. Re-election of Mr Peter Hill as a director of the Company

To consider and if thought fit pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution:

*"That Mr Peter Hill, who will cease to hold office as a director of the Company immediately before the end of this general meeting pursuant to section 250V(1) of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) (**Corporations Act**), and being eligible, be re-elected as a director of the Company with effect from the end of the meeting".*

Information about the candidate to be re-elected as a director of the Company is set out in Explanatory Note 2.

2. Re-election of Mr Stephen Hill as a director of the Company

To consider, and if thought fit pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution:

"That Mr Stephen Hill, who will cease to hold office as a director of the Company immediately before the end of this general meeting pursuant to section 250V(1) of the Corporations Act, and being eligible, be re-elected as a director of the Company with effect from the end of the meeting".

Information about the candidate to be re-elected as a director of the Company is set out in Explanatory Note 2.

3. Re-election of Mr Harry Hodge as a director of the Company

To consider and, if thought fit, pass the following resolution as an ordinary resolution:

"That Mr Harry Hodge, who will cease to hold office as a director of the Company immediately before the end of this general meeting pursuant to section 250V(1) of the Corporations Act, and being eligible, be re-elected as a director of the Company with effect from the end of the meeting".

INFORMATION FOR SHAREHOLDERS

1. HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SPILL MEETING

Shareholders and proxyholders are invited to participate in the spill meeting virtually via our virtual spill meeting platform at <https://meetings.openbriefing.com/GLBGM26> by taking the following steps:

- Enter <https://meetings.openbriefing.com/GLBGM26> to a web browser on your computer or online device.
- Provide your details in order to be verified as a shareholder or proxyholder:
 - Shareholders will need their Shareholder Reference Number (SRN) or Holder Identification Number (HIN); and
 - Proxyholders will need their proxy code which MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited will provide via email within 24 hours prior to the spill meeting.
- Wait for the spill meeting to commence.

Further information on how to participate virtually (including how to vote and ask questions online during the General Meeting) is set out in this Notice and the Virtual Meeting Online Guide, which has been included in this Notice and is also available at <https://globecorporate.com/gm/>. It is recommended that you test access to the online platform on your computer or online device prior to the scheduled commencement of the General Meeting, and that you log in to the online platform at least 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time for the General Meeting.

2. VOTING

Resolutions 1, 2 and 3 are ordinary resolutions. Ordinary resolutions require the support of more than 50% of those shareholders voting in person, by proxy, representative or attorney.

All resolutions will be decided on a poll.

Shareholders may vote on resolutions considered at the spill meeting by either:

- voting online at least 48 hours prior to the meeting at by using the virtual spill meeting platform; or
- scanning the QR code (refer to Proxy form for more information);
- appointing a Proxy to attend and vote at the spill meeting on their behalf. Please follow the instructions below if you wish to appoint a Proxy.

Online voting will be open between the commencement of the spill meeting at 12.00pm AEDT or as soon as reasonably practical on 20 October 2026 and the time at which the Chair announces voting closure.

VOTING ENTITLEMENT

In accordance with regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth), the Directors have determined that shareholders will be eligible to vote at the spill meeting if they are registered holders of ordinary shares in the Company as at 7.00pm (AEDT), on Sunday, 18 October 2026.

3. PROXIES

A shareholder who is entitled to attend and vote at the spill meeting may appoint a proxy to attend and vote at the spill meeting on their behalf. A proxy need not be a shareholder and can be either an individual or a body corporate. Should you appoint a body corporate as your proxy, that body corporate will need to ensure that it:

- appoints an individual as its corporate representative to exercise any of the powers the body corporate may exercise at general meetings of the Company, in accordance with section 250D of the Corporations Act; and
- provides satisfactory evidence of the appointment of its corporate representative prior to commencement of the meeting.

If satisfactory evidence of appointment as corporate representative is not received before the spill meeting, then the body corporate (through its representative) will not be permitted to act as your proxy.

If a shareholder is entitled to cast two or more votes at the spill meeting, they may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the proxy appointments do not specify the proportion or number of the shareholder's votes that each proxy may exercise, each proxy may exercise half of the shareholder's votes.

INFORMATION FOR SHAREHOLDERS (CONT'D)

The proxy form (and, if the appointment is signed by the appointer's attorney, the authority under which it was signed or a certified copy of the authority) must be received by the Company's share registry, MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited by 12.00pm AEDT on Sunday 20 October 2026.

Instructions for completing the proxy form are outlined on the form. The completed proxy form may be returned by:

- a) (preferred) lodging it online at <https://au.investorcentre.mpms.mufg.com/voting/GLB> in accordance with the instructions provided on the website. You will need your HIN or SRN to lodge your proxy form online;
- b) posting it in the reply-paid envelope provided;
- c) posting it to Globe International Limited c/- MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited, Locked Bag A14, Sydney South NSW 1235;
- d) faxing it to MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited on +61 2 9287 0309;
- e) hand delivering it to MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited Parramatta Square, Level 22, Tower 6, 10 Darcy Street, Parramatta NSW 2150 during business hours of 9.00 am – 5.00 pm.

If a shareholder appointing a proxy directs a proxy how to vote on an item of business, the proxy may only vote on that item, in accordance with that direction. If a proxy is not directed how to vote on an item of business, the proxy may vote how he/she thinks fit.

The Company's constitution provides that where the appointment of a proxy has not named the proxy or proxies in whose favour it is given, the Chair may either act as proxy or complete the instrument of proxy by inserting the name or names of one or more directors or secretary of the Company.

If a shareholder appoints the Chair of the meeting as the shareholder's proxy and does not specify how the Chair is to vote on an item of business, the Chair will vote, as a proxy for that shareholder, in favour of the item on a poll.

MUFG Corporate Markets (AU) Limited will contact proxyholders via email within 24 hours prior to the spill meeting to provide them with the proxy code that they will need to enter into the virtual spill meeting platform.

4. CORPORATE REPRESENTATIVES

A corporate shareholder may elect to appoint an individual to act as its representative in accordance with section 250D of the Corporations Act in which case the Company will require a certificate appointing the Corporate Representative to be executed in accordance with the Corporations Act. The certificate must be lodged with the Company before the spill meeting. The Company will retain the certificate.

5. SPILL MEETING CONSIDERATIONS AND SHAREHOLDER QUESTIONS

A discussion will be held on all items to be considered at the spill meeting.

All shareholders attending the spill meeting will have a reasonable opportunity to ask questions during the spill meeting via the virtual spill meeting platform or orally by using the phone dial-in facility. Please refer to the attached Virtual Meeting Online Guide for further details.

To ensure an orderly conduct of the spill meeting, Shareholders are requested to observe the following protocols:

- all shareholder questions should be stated clearly and should be relevant to the business of the spill meeting, which is the election of directors;
- if a shareholder has more than one question on an item, all questions should be asked at the one time; and
- shareholders should not ask questions at the spill meeting regarding personal matters or those that are commercial in confidence.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. BACKGROUND TO THE SPILL MEETING

Under the “two strikes” legislation set out in the Corporations Act, if at least 25% of the votes cast on the adoption of the remuneration report of the Company at two consecutive AGMs are against the adoption of the remuneration report the Company must put to the shareholders a “spill resolution” at the second AGM. If the spill resolution is passed, the Company must hold another general meeting of shareholders (“spill meeting”) within 90 days of the passing of the resolution. All of the directors of the Company who were in office when the directors’ report (including the remuneration report) was approved (and who remain in office at the spill meeting), cease to hold office immediately before the end of the spill meeting and may stand for re-election.

At the Company’s 2025 AGM, the Company received a “first strike” because more than 25% of the votes cast on the resolution to adopt the Company’s resolution to adopt the 2025 Remuneration Report were cast against its adoption. If at the 2026 AGM (due to be held immediately before this spill meeting), at least 25% of the votes cast on the resolution to adopt the 2026 Remuneration Report are cast against its adoption, the Company will receive a “second strike” and shareholders will be required to vote on the spill resolution.

Please see the accompanying Notice of 2026 AGM for further information regarding the spill resolution and spill meeting.

This spill meeting will only take place if the spill resolution is put to shareholders and is passed by shareholders at the 2026 AGM. If the spill resolution is not required to be voted on by shareholders at the 2026 AGM, or if it is voted on but is not passed by shareholders at the 2026 AGM, the resolutions proposed to be voted on at this spill meeting will not be required and will be withdrawn. If the spill resolution is put to shareholders at the 2026 AGM and is passed, each of the Company’s current directors, who were in office when the directors resolved to approve the Remuneration Report (being Mr Peter Hill, Mr Stephen Hill and Mr Harry Hodge), will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the spill meeting and will stand for re-election. Those directors elected or re-elected at the spill meeting will commence holding office at the end of the spill meeting.

If a director is re-elected in these circumstances, the Corporations Act provides that the term of office of the director will not be affected and directors will be subject to retirement and re-election at an AGM of the Company as if the cessation and appointment at the spill meeting had not occurred.

There is no voting exclusion applicable to the resolutions to be put to the spill meeting.

The Chair intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of all the proposed resolutions in Items 1 to 3.

Mr Peter Hill and Mr Stephen Hill who are the founders and major shareholders of the Company and who collectively hold over 60% of the Company’s issued share capital as at the date of this notice of spill meeting, have advised the Company that it is their intention to vote in favour of the resolutions in Items 1 to 3.

Under the Corporations Act, a public company such as Globe International Limited must have a minimum of three directors appointed at all times. Accordingly, if, after the spill meeting, there are fewer than three directors of the Company elected, in accordance with the Corporations Act, the unsuccessful nominees with the highest proportion of favourable votes will be appointed as directors, to make up the minimum number of three directors required under the Corporations Act. This will result in the same three directors being appointed.

2. INFORMATION ABOUT THE CANDIDATES TO BE RE-ELECTED AS DIRECTORS

Mr Stephen Hill

Mr Stephen Hill co-founded the Company in 1985, remains a shareholder in the business, and has expertise in the development of growth initiatives, brand development and market positioning strategies for the Company. Stephen is a former skateboarding champion and remains an active skateboarder, snowboarder and surfer.

The Board believes that Stephen brings a wealth of relevant industry experience to the Company, particularly as he is a co-founder of the Company.

Board recommendation: Other than Mr Stephen Hill, the Board unanimously recommends that shareholders vote in favour of the re-election of Mr Stephen Hill as, due to his skills and experience mentioned above, he adds significant value to the Board and is a major contributor to the success of the Company.

Mr Peter Hill

Mr Peter Hill co-founded the Company in 1985 and remains a major shareholder in the business. He is a major contributor to the strategic market direction and brand development of the business with a particular emphasis on Asian sourcing and distribution where is based. Peter is a former skateboarding champion and maintains an extensive interest in extreme action sports and motorsports.

The Board believes that Peter brings a wealth of relevant industry experience to the Company, particularly as he is a co-founder of the Company.

Board recommendation: Other than Mr Peter Hill, the Board unanimously recommends that shareholders vote in favour of the re-election of Mr Peter Hill as, due to his skills and experience mentioned above, he adds significant value to the Board and is a major contributor to the success of the Company.

Mr Harry Hodge

Harry Hodge was appointed to the Board of Directors and as Chairman on 16 June 2023. Harry has over 30 years' experience in senior executive and non-executive roles in organisations ranging from starts-ups, SME's, large and international organisations across women's and men's fashion, actions sports, youth culture as well as retail sectors. In an executive capacity as CEO/Executive Chairman, Harry played a pivotal role in establishing the Quiksilver, Roxy and DC brands in Europe. His additional executive and board level experience includes Executive Director of Quiksilver Inc (NYSE – ZQK), Executive Chairman of Quiksilver Asia-Pacific as well as Deputy Chairman of Surfing New South Wales. In these roles, Harry implemented strong corporate governance and risk management policies and successfully led several merger and acquisition transactions.

Board recommendation: Other than Mr Harry Hodge, the Board of the Company strongly recommends that the shareholders vote in favour of the re-election of Mr Harry Hodge as, based on his skills and experience listed above, he adds significant value to the Board.

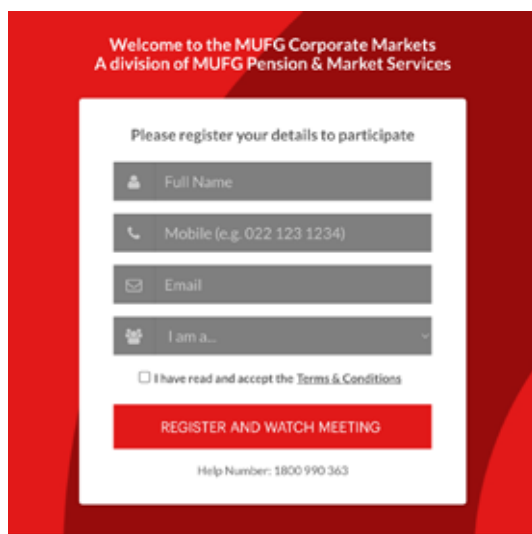

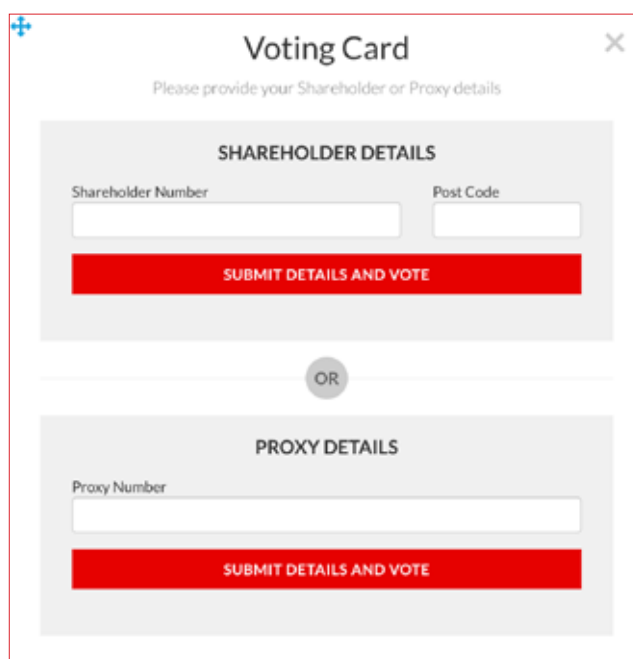

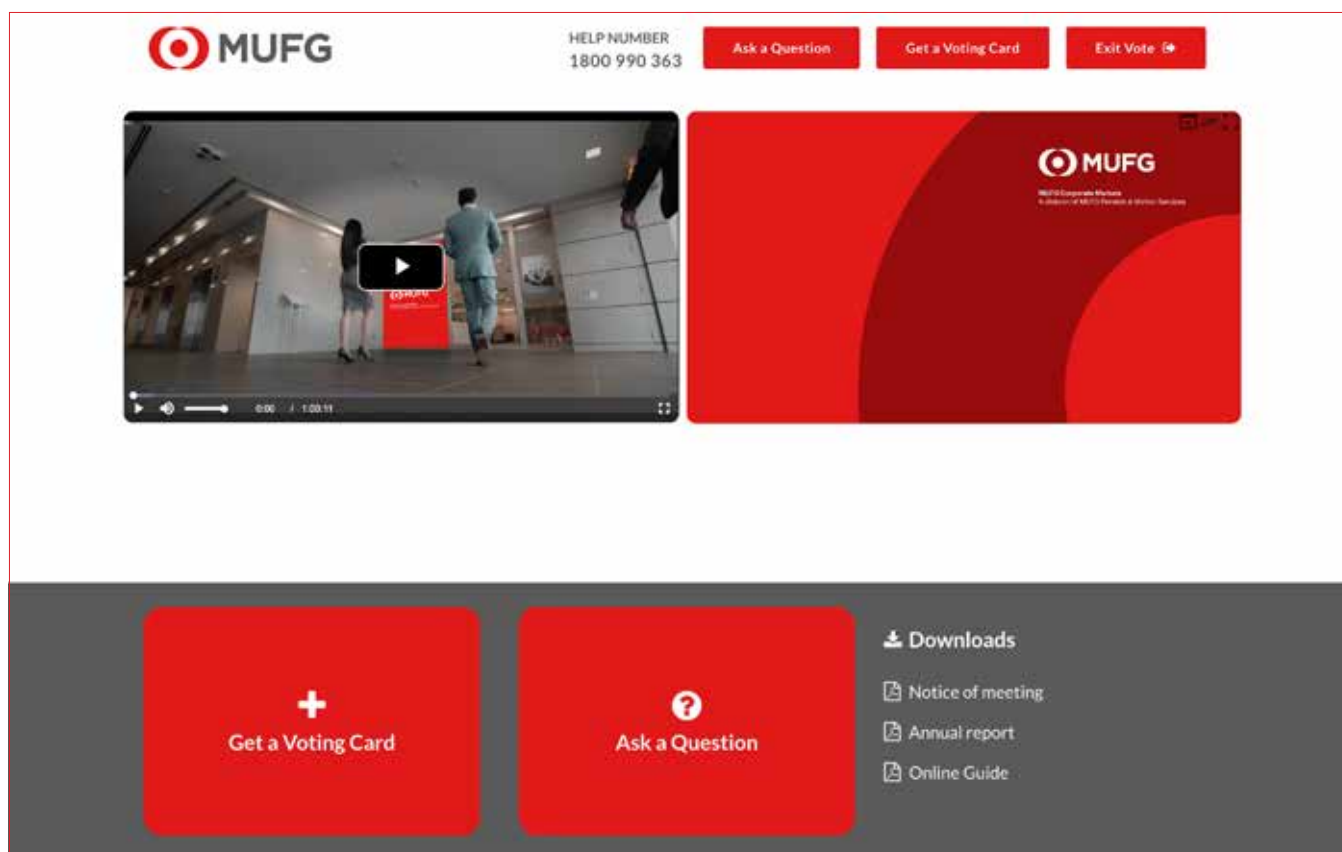

If you are an individual or joint shareholder you will need to register and provide validation by entering your shareholder number and postcode.

Full Votes

To submit a full vote on a resolution ensure you are in the **'Full Vote'** tab. Place your vote by clicking on the **'For'**, **'Against'**, or **'Abstain'** voting buttons.

Partial Votes

To submit a partial vote on a resolution ensure you are in the **'Partial Vote'** tab. You can enter the number of votes (for any or all) resolution/s. The total amount of votes that you are entitled to vote for will be listed under each resolution. When you enter the number of votes it will automatically tally how many votes you have left.

Note: If you are submitting a partial vote and do not use all of your entitled votes, the un-voted portion will be submitted as No Instruction and therefore will not be counted.

Once you have finished voting on the resolutions scroll down to the bottom of the box and click on the **'Submit Vote'** or **'Submit Partial Vote'** button.

Note: You can close your voting card without submitting your vote at any time while voting remains open. Any votes you have already made will be saved for the next time you open up the voting card. The voting card will appear on the bottom left corner of the webpage. The message **'Not yet submitted'** will appear at the bottom of the page.

You can edit your voting card at any point while voting is open by clicking on **'Edit Card'**. This will reopen the voting card with any previous votes made.

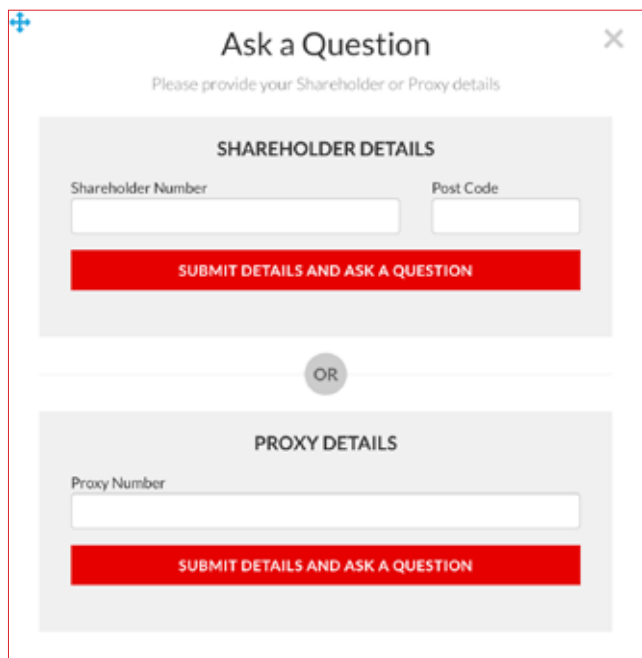
2. How to ask a question

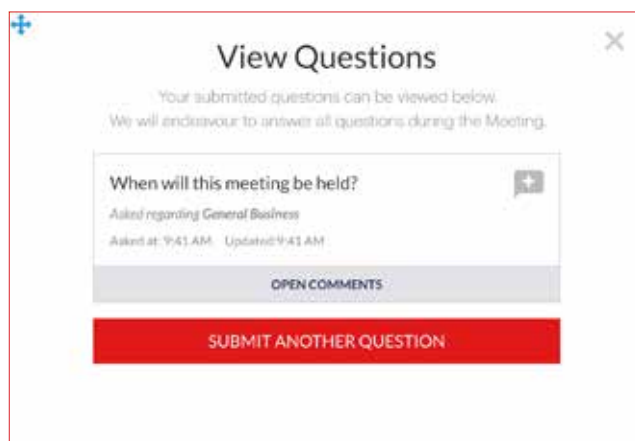

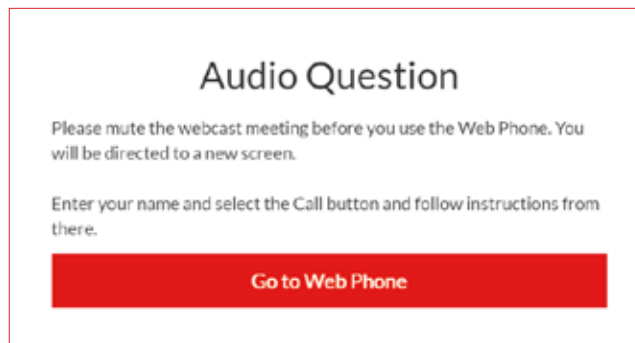

Your line will be muted once your question or comment has been asked / responded to

Step 7

You can hang up and resume watching the meeting via the online platform. If you would like to ask a question on another item of business, you can repeat the process above.

Please ensure you have muted the webcast audio.

4. Voting closing

Voting will end 5 minutes after the close of the Meeting.

At the conclusion of the Meeting a red bar with a countdown timer will appear at the top of the Webcast and Slide screens advising the remaining voting time. If you have not submitted your vote, you should do so now.

Once voting has been closed all submitted voting cards cannot be changed.
