Diamond Drilling Commences at Beatty Park Sth

HIGHLIGHTS

- **Diamond drilling underway** at the Beatty Park Sth gold prospect., located 160km north of Meekatharra in the Peak Hill district of Western Australia.
- **Five diamond drillholes** planned for a total of **~1500m** (including precollars).
- **Targeting high-grade depth extensions** up to 250m below remarkable near-surface 2025 aircore intercepts, including¹:
 1. **6m at 25.8g/t Au from 30m, including 1m at 126g/t Au from 30m in BPAC016**
 2. **10m at 38.9g/t Au from 22m, including 1m at 169g/t Au from 25m in BPAC028**
- **Structural Data:** Early diamond drilling in an area of zero outcrop will provide vital orientation data on structural elements and hydrothermal alteration zones to unlock regional scale targets.

Tambourah Metals (ASX:TMB) is pleased to advise that its Exploration Incentive Scheme (EIS) co-funded diamond drilling program is officially underway at the Beatty Park Sth prospect.

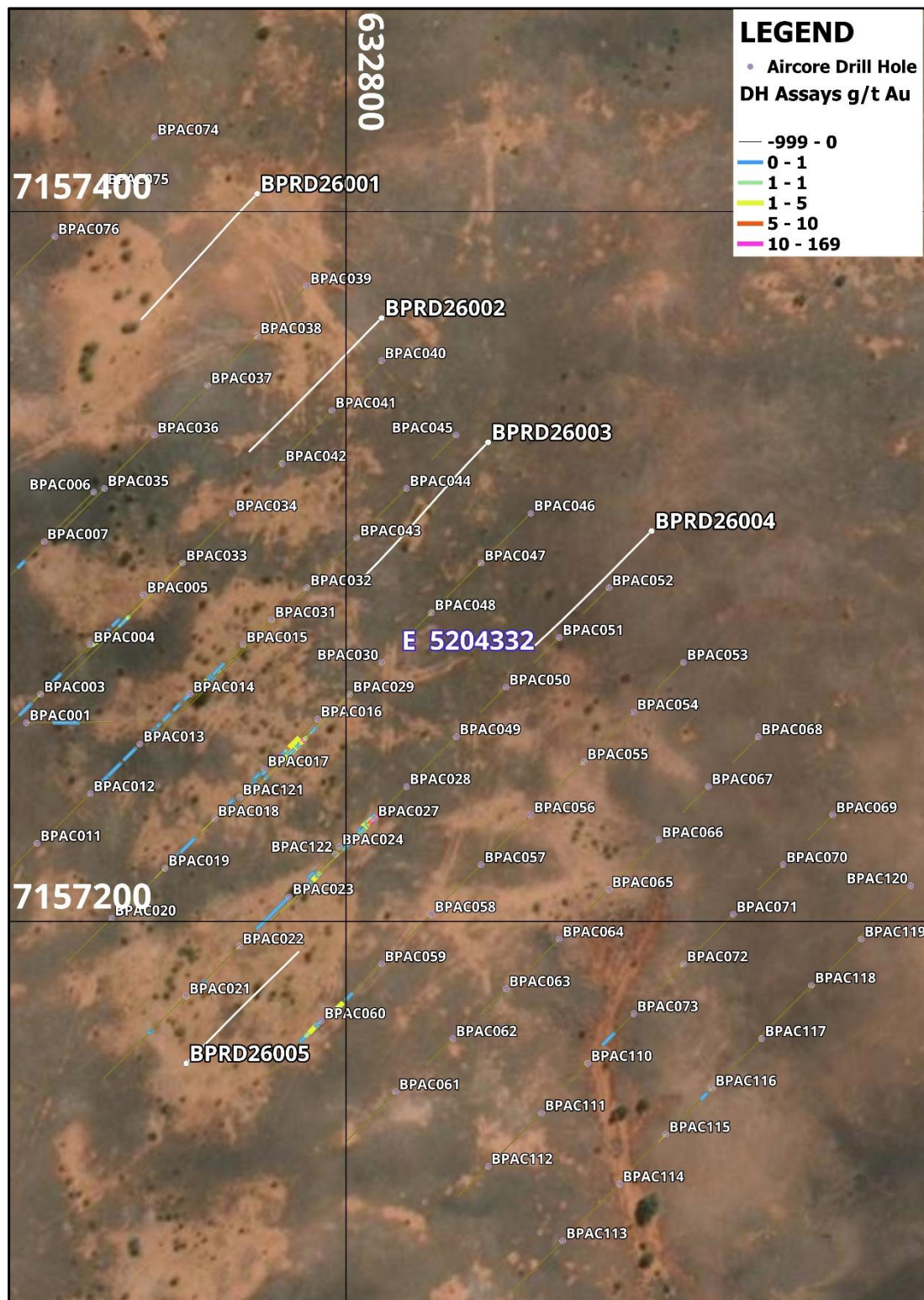


Figure 2 Beatty Park Sth Diamond Drill Hole Collar Locations (MGA94 Zone 50).

The campaign (see Table 1 and Figure 2) is designed to test the host sequence up to 250m down-dip and below outstanding, very high-grade gold intersected during prior aircore drilling campaigns². Notable historical intercepts earmarked for immediate follow-up include 6m at 25.8g/t Au from 30m in hole BPAC016 and 10m at 38.9g/t Au from 22m in hole BPAC028.

GEOLOGY AND STRUCTURAL ANALYSIS

At Beatty Park Sth, gold mineralisation is hosted within strongly altered ultramafic rocks of the Narracoota Formation. Extensive chlorite, carbonate, sericite, silica and pyrite alteration observed across preceding aircore and RC drilling campaigns is consistent with hydrothermal alteration footprints characteristic of major orogenic gold systems.

Because the target area features zero surface outcrop and highly constrained legacy drilling data, this early-stage diamond core will deliver crucial data regarding structural orientation, fluid conduits, and

potential traps. These structural insights will be applied to systematically target subsequent drilling campaigns across the prospect.

Preliminary logging is currently being completed on-site. Following initial assessments, the core will be securely transported to Perth for comprehensive structural logging, cutting and assay sampling.
