The business of the Meeting affects your shareholding and your vote is important.

This Notice of Meeting should be read in its entirety. If Shareholders are in doubt as to how they should vote, they should seek advice from their professional advisers prior to voting.

The Directors have determined pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders at 7:00pm (Sydney time) on 25 October 2026.

Business of the Meeting

Agenda

1. Financial Statements and Reports

To table and consider the Annual Report of the Company and its controlled entities for the financial year ended 30 June 2026, which includes the Financial Report, the Directors' Report, the Remuneration Report and the Auditor's Report.

2. Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Annual Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2026."

Note: The vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the **voter**) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

3. Resolution 2 – Election of Director – Mr Gianfranco (Frank) Guerra

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of clauses 15.2 and 15.4 of the Constitution and ASX Listing Rule 14.4, and for all other purposes, Mr Gianfranco Guerra, a Director, retires, and being eligible, is elected as a Director."

4. Resolution 3 – Ratification of a prior issue – Placement – Listing Rule 7.1

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 30,434,783 Shares to sophisticated and/or professional investors under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution by or on behalf of any person who participated in the issue of Shares, or any associates of those persons.

5. Resolution 4 – Approval of 10% Placement Capacity

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as a **special resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, approval is given for the Company to issue Equity Securities totalling up to 10% of the issued capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement.”

6. Resolution 5 – Non-executive Directors’ remuneration

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of clause 15.8 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 10.17 and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve an increase of the maximum total aggregate amount of fees payable to non-executive Directors from \$250,000 per annum to \$600,000 per annum in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement.”

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution by or on behalf of a Director and any of their associates.

Voting Prohibition: A person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if the proxy is either a member of Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such a member and the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution. However, this prohibition does not apply if the proxy is the Chair and the appointment expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

7. Resolution 6 – Approval to issue Performance Rights to a Related Party – Mr Gianfranco Guerra

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 10.14 and for all other purposes, approval is given for the Company to issue to Mr Gianfranco Guerra (or his nominee(s)) 1,000,000 Performance Rights on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement.”

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution by or on behalf of a person referred to in ASX Listing Rules 10.14.1, 10.14.2 or 10.14.3 (being Mark Connell, Shannon Robinson, Davide Bosio, and Gianfranco Guerra, who are the Directors of the Company; and any of their respective associates; and any party whose relationship with the Company or with any of the Directors or their associates is deemed to be ASX to be such that the party’s acquisition of securities under the Equity Incentive Plan requires shareholder approval) who is eligible to participate in the Yojee Equity Incentive Plan, or any associates of those persons.

Voting Prohibition Statement: In accordance with section 250BD of the Corporations Act, a person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if:

- (a) the proxy is either:
 - (i) a member of the Key Management Personnel; or
 - (ii) a Closely Related Party of such a member; and
- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution.

However, provided the Chair is not a Restricted Party, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) the proxy is the Chair; and
- (b) the appointment expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Voting exclusion statements

Each Voting Exclusion Statement that applies to a Resolution as noted in the Agenda, does not apply to a vote cast in favour of that Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the Chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting by proxy

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

- (a) each Shareholder has a right to appoint a proxy;
- (b) the proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company; and
- (c) a Shareholder who is entitled to cast 2 or more votes may appoint 2 proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the member appoints 2 proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that changes to the Corporations Act made in 2011 mean that:

- (a) if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- (b) any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

Explanatory Statement

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. Annual Report

Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to discuss the Annual Report at the Meeting. The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Annual Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Annual Report is available on the Investor Centre page on its website at <https://www.yojee.com/investors-asx-announcements>.

There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report. However, the Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders to ask questions or make comments about the Annual Report and the management of the Company. Shareholders will also be given an opportunity to ask the auditor questions as permitted by the Corporations Act.

2. Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

The vote on Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Company or its directors. However, the Board will actively consider the outcome of the vote and comments made by Shareholders on the Remuneration Report when reviewing the Company's future remuneration policies and practices.

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Annual General Meeting.

3. Resolution 2 – Election of Director – Mr Gianfranco (Frank) Guerra

3.1 General

Clause 15.2(b) of the Constitution provides that there must be an election of Directors at each Annual General Meeting of the Company. Clause 15.2(a) of the Constitution provides that no Director (except a Managing Director) may hold office past the third Annual General Meeting following their appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Clause 15.2(b) of the Constitution provides that the requirement for holding an election of directors at the Annual General Meeting can be satisfied by persons who were appointed by the Directors as additional directors under clause 15.4 of the Constitution standing for election, or a person retiring in accordance with the three year tenure limitation under clause 15.2(a), or a person standing for election in accordance with clause 15.3. If no person is required to seek re-election under one of those provisions, then the director who has been in office the longest without re-election must stand for re-election, or if two or more directors have been in office for the same period, at least one director (as decided between them) must stand for re-election.

Mr Connell was re-elected at the 2025 Annual General Meeting, and Mr Bosio and Ms Robinson were re-elected at the 2024 Annual General Meeting, and therefore do not need to stand for re-election at this year's Annual General Meeting. Mr Gianfranco (Frank) Guerra was appointed as an additional director under clause 15.4 of the Constitution with effect from 1 January 2026 and has not previously been elected by Shareholders. Accordingly, Mr Guerra will be the director to stand for election at this year's Annual General Meeting.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Mr Guerra is a seasoned leader in international logistics, bringing more than 45 years of global industry experience and a distinguished track record in business management, strategic growth, and operational excellence. He has held senior leadership roles across several major freight-forwarding organisations, has deep operational and commercial expertise spanning international freight management, global distribution strategies, compliance, and end-to-end supply chain optimisation. He successfully founded and ran his own international forwarding business in Australia for 11 years before its acquisition by Mainfreight. He later became part-owner of a global logistics group prior to its sale and led a shipping business for two years within that organisation.

More recently, Mr Guerra has served as the Australasian CEO of Agility Logistics, a global publicly listed logistics services provider, where he oversaw more than 500 employees across three countries. He is widely recognised for his collaborative leadership style, informed decision-making, and ability to stabilise, reposition, and accelerate organisations during periods of change.

With extensive experience in executive management, governance, risk management, stakeholder engagement and long-term strategic planning, Mr Guerra has guided multiple complex transformation programs and business recovery initiatives that restored financial performance and strengthened organisational capability.

Across his four and a half decades in the sector, Mr Guerra has built a respected reputation as a thoughtful, results-driven leader with a globally informed perspective. His deep industry knowledge and international networks provide valuable strategic insight to the Yojee Board as the Company continues to expand and scale its platform offerings.

Mr Guerra is not currently a director of any other ASX-listed companies.

3.3 Independence

Mr Guerra is considered to be an independent director.

3.4 Board recommendation

The Board supports the re-election of Mr Guerra and recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

4. Background to Resolution 3 – Ratification of a prior issue – Placement – Listing Rule 7.1

4.1 General

On 3 August 2026, the Company announced a capital raising seeking to raise up to \$9 million through a placement to sophisticated and institutional investors of up to \$7,000,000 (**Placement**) and a Share Purchase Plan of up to \$2,000,000 (**SPP**). The Placement and SPP were both oversubscribed and a total of \$7,000,000 was raised under the Placement by the issue of 30,434,783 Shares, and, following acceptance of the oversubscriptions to the SPP, a total of \$3,452,495 was raised under the SPP by the issue of 15,010,848 Shares. All Shares issued were issued at a price of \$0.23 per Share. The Placement and SPP together are referred to as the **Capital Raising**.

The Placement was undertaken using the Company's Placement Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 (explained at Section 4.2 below).

708 Capital Pty Ltd (AFSL No. 386279) (**Lead Manager**) was engaged to act as lead manager to the Placement pursuant to a mandate (**Lead Manager Mandate**). The Company agreed to pay the Lead Manager fees of 6% (plus GST) of the amount raised under the Capital Raising. The engagement of the Lead Manager was otherwise on customary terms and conditions.

The issue of 30,434,783 Shares in the Placement was completed on 11 August 2026. Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval to ratify the issue of the Shares issued under the Placement.

The Shares issued under the SPP were issued pursuant to exception 5 in Listing Rule 7.2, and therefore did not use the Company's Placement Capacity and do not need to be ratified.

4.2 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 provides that a company must not, subject to specified exceptions, issue or agree to issue more equity securities during any 12-month period than that amount which represents 15% of the number of fully paid ordinary securities on issue at the commencement of that 12 month period (**Placement Capacity**).

4.3 ASX Listing Rule 7.4

ASX Listing Rule 7.4 sets out an exception to ASX Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1) those securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purpose of ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

4.4 Effect of the Resolution

The issue of the Shares in the Placement did not fit within any of the exceptions from ASX Listing Rule 7.1 and was not subject to prior Shareholder approval. The issue of the Shares the subject of Resolution 3 effectively used up a portion of the available Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12-month period following the date of their issue. At the time of issue,

sufficient placement capacity was available that the issue of the securities the subject of Resolution 3 did not breach ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

By ratifying the issue of the Shares the subject of Resolution 3, the Company will retain the flexibility to issue equity securities in the future up to the Placement Capacity set out in ASX Listing Rule 7.1 without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval. The base figure (referred to as variable "A" in the formula in ASX Listing Rule 7.1) from which the Company's Placement Capacity is calculated, will be a higher number, which in turn will allow a proportionately higher number of securities to be issued without prior Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, then the Company's Placement Capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 will not be refreshed; the result being that the Shares the subject of Resolution 3 will continue to be included in calculating the Company's use of the 15% limit under ASX Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without prior Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of their issue.

4.5 Board Recommendation

The Directors recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

4.6 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 3:

- (a) the Shares were issued to sophisticated and professional investors introduced by the Lead Manager, the allottees being determined in consultation with the Directors. None of the subscribers were a related party of the Company or an associate of any of them, or a party to whom an issue of equity securities requires Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. None of the allottees was a person whose identity would be deemed to be material in terms of the criteria in ASX Listing Rules Guidance Note 21 (being members of Key Management Personnel, Company advisers, substantial shareholders, or associates of any of these parties, who were issued a number of shares equal to or greater than 1% of the Company's issued capital at the time);
- (b) the number of Shares issued was 30,434,783;
- (c) the Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (d) the Shares were issued on 11 August 2026;
- (e) the Shares were issued at an issue price of \$0.23 each;
- (f) the Company received \$7,000,000 (before costs) from the issue of the Shares, which it is applying towards funding the further rollout and development and ongoing commercialisation of the MOSAIC and TCMS platforms, business development and team expansion, and for general working capital; and
- (g) the Shares were issued pursuant to customary placement agreements between the Company and participants in the Placement.

5. Resolution 4 – Approval of 10% Placement Capacity

5.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, however, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%.

An "eligible entity" means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX300 Index and which has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less at the date of the Meeting. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes as at the Disclosure Date (425,452,150 Shares at a Share price of \$0.23 being a market capitalisation of \$97,853,994).

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue equity securities without Shareholder approval (**Additional Issuance Capacity**).

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the Additional Issuance Capacity and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing equity securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

The Board considers it is in the Company's best interests to have the opportunity to take advantage of the flexibility to issue additional securities provided under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A. As at the date of this Notice, no decision has been made by the Board to undertake any issue of securities under the Additional Issuance Capacity if Shareholders approve Resolution 4. The Board unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

The information below provides more background on ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and the disclosure required by ASX Listing Rule 7.3A.

5.2 Description of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A

(a) Securities which may be issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity

Under the Additional Issuance Capacity, the Company must issue Equity Securities belonging to an existing quoted class of the Company's Equity Securities. As at the date of this Notice, the Company has on issue one class of quoted Equity Securities, being fully paid ordinary shares (ASX Code: **YOJ**).

(b) Minimum issue price

The issue price of each Equity Security issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity must be no less than 75% of the volume weighted average price for the securities in that class, calculated over the 15 ASX trading days on which trades of securities in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the securities are to be issued is agreed by the Company and the recipient of the securities; or
- (ii) if the securities are not issued within 10 ASX trading days of the date in paragraph (i) above, the date on which the securities are issued.

The Company will disclose this information when Equity Securities are issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity.

(c) Period for which approval will be valid

Shareholder approval of the Additional Issuance Capacity will be valid for the period commencing on the date of the Meeting and expiring on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of this Meeting; or
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; or

- (iii) if the Company receives Shareholder approval for a proposed transaction under ASX Listing Rule 11.1.2 (significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or ASX Listing Rule 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking), the time and date of that approval.

(Additional Issuance Period).

(d) Dilution risks

If Equity Securities are issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity, there is a risk of economic and voting dilution of existing Shareholders, including the following risks:

- (i) the market price for Equity Securities in the class of securities issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity may be significantly lower on the issue date than on the date of the approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A (that is, the date of the Meeting, if Resolution 4 is approved); and
- (ii) the Equity Securities may be issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity at a discount to the market price for those Equity Securities on the issue date,

which may have an effect on the amount of funds raised by the issue of the Equity Securities.

The below table shows the dilution of existing Shareholders on the basis of the market price of Shares and the number of ordinary securities for variable "A" calculated in accordance with the formula in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2, as at the Disclosure Date.

The table also shows:

- (i) two examples where variable "A" has increased, by 50% and 100%. Variable "A" is based on the number of ordinary securities the Company has on issue as at the Disclosure Date. The number of ordinary securities on issue may increase as a result of issues of ordinary securities that do not require Shareholder approval (for example, a pro rata entitlement offer or securities issued under a takeover offer) or future specific placements under Listing Rule 7.1 that are approved at a future general meeting; and
- (ii) two examples of where the issue price of ordinary securities has decreased by 50% and increased by 50% as against the market price as at the Disclosure Date.

3. The Company issues the maximum possible number of Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Capacity.
4. The Company has not issued any Equity Securities in the 12 months prior to the Meeting that were not issued under an exception in ASX Listing Rule 7.2 or with approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.
5. The issue of Equity Securities under the Additional Issuance Capacity consists only of Shares and the consideration provided for those Shares is cash. It is assumed that no Options are exercised into Shares before the date of issue of the Equity Securities.
6. The calculations above do not show the dilution that any one particular Shareholder will be subject to. All Shareholders should consider the dilution caused to their own shareholding depending on their specific circumstances.
7. This table does not set out any dilution pursuant to approvals under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.
8. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.

(e) **Purpose of issue under Additional Issuance Capacity**

The Company may issue Equity Securities under the Additional Issuance Capacity to raise cash to fund the following:

- (i) general working capital expenses;
- (ii) activities associated with its current assets;
- (iii) repayment of debt; or
- (iv) the acquisition of new assets and investments (including any expenses associated with such an acquisition).

The Company will comply with the disclosure required by ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.4 on issue of any Equity Securities issued pursuant to the approval sought by Resolution 4.

(f) **Allocation policy under Additional Issuance Capacity**

The Company's allocation policy and the identity of the recipients of Equity Securities issued under the Additional Issuance Capacity will be determined on a case-by-case basis at the time of issue and in the Company's discretion.

No decision has been made in relation to an issue of Equity Securities under the Additional Issuance Capacity, including whether the Company will engage with new investors or existing Shareholders, and if so the identities of any such persons.

However, when determining the allocation policy and the identity of the recipients, the Company will have regard to the following considerations:

- (i) prevailing market conditions;
- (ii) the purpose for the issue of the Equity Securities;
- (iii) the financial situation and solvency of the Company;
- (iv) impacts of the placement on control;
- (v) other methods of raising capital; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

Recipients may include existing Shareholders or new investors, but not persons who are related parties or associates of related parties of the Company.

(g) **Previous approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A**

Shareholder approval for the Additional Issuance Capacity was most recently obtained at the 2025 AGM held on 28 November 2025 (**Previous Approval**).

The Company did not issue any Equity Securities under the Previous Approval.

5.3 Voting exclusion

At the time of dispatching this Notice, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under the Additional Issuance Capacity, and a voting exclusion statement is therefore not included in this Notice.

6. Resolution 5 – Non-executive Directors’ remuneration

ASX Listing Rule 10.17 provides that an entity must not increase the total aggregate amount of directors’ fees payable to all of its non-executive directors without the approval of holders of its ordinary securities.

Clause 15.8 of the Constitution also states that the total aggregate fixed sum per annum to be paid to Directors (excluding salaries of executive Directors) may only be varied by ordinary resolution of Shareholders in general meeting.

The maximum aggregate amount of fees payable to all of the non-executive Directors is currently set at \$250,000, and has not been increased since the Company’s listing on ASX. Resolution 5 seeks Shareholder approval to increase this figure by \$350,000 to \$600,000.

This amount includes superannuation contributions made by the Company for the benefit of non-executive Directors and any fees which a non-executive Director agrees to sacrifice for other benefits. It does not include reimbursement of genuine out of pocket expenses, genuine “special exertion” fees paid in accordance with the Constitution, or securities issued to a non-executive Director under ASX Listing Rule 10.11 or 10.14 with approval of Shareholders.

The maximum aggregate amount of fees proposed to be paid to the non-executive Directors per annum has been determined after reviewing similar companies listed on ASX and the Directors believe that this level of remuneration is in line with corporate remuneration of similar companies.

The proposed limit is requested to ensure that the Company:

- maintains its capacity to remunerate both existing and any new non-executive directors joining the Board;
- remunerates its non-executive Directors appropriately for the expectations placed upon them both by the Company and the regulatory environment in which it operates; and
- has the ability to attract and retain non-executive directors whose skills and qualifications are appropriate for a company of the size and nature of the Company.

In the 3 years prior to the date of the Meeting, the Company has issued non-executive Directors a total of 6,000,000 Performance Rights with prior Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rules 10.11 and 10.14. These Shareholder approvals were obtained at the Company’s general meeting held on 23 April 2025; with the issue occurring on 23 April 2025.

If Resolution 5 is approved, the Company will have the ability to increase the remuneration of non-executive Directors up to the increased limit of \$600,000.

If Resolution 5 is not approved, the Company’s limit on remuneration of non-executive Directors will remain at \$250,000.

Given the interest of the non-executive Directors in this Resolution, the Board makes no recommendation to Shareholders regarding this Resolution.

7. Resolution 6 – Approval to issue Performance Rights to a Related Party – Mr Gianfranco Guerra

7.1 General

The Company has considered the issue of incentive securities to employees and executives under its Equity Incentive Plan (**Plan**). As part of this process, the Company has agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue Performance Rights to Non-Executive Director Mr Gianfranco Guerra (or his nominee/s) (**Director Performance Rights**).

The Board is committed to incentivising and retaining Key Management Personnel (including Directors) and other employees in a manner which promotes alignment of their interests with the interests of the Company and its shareholders. The Board proposes, subject to Shareholder approval, to issue 1,000,000 Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra, which is intended to incentivise him in his ongoing role with the Company. Mr Guerra joined the Board with effect from 1 January 2026 and has not previously been issued any Equity Incentive Securities by the Company.

The Director Performance Rights are divided into separate classes, and vesting of each class is subject to the satisfaction of the appropriate vesting condition linked to operational achievements and/or continued service, as follows:

- (a) **Class L:** (500,000 Performance Rights): successful commercial launch of the MOSAIC Platform, and the holder continuing to be an Eligible Participant under the Equity Incentive Plan (**Eligible Participant**) at the time; and
- (b) **Class M:** (500,000 Performance Rights): achievement of at least AUD1M cumulative software revenue over a three consecutive month period, and the holder continuing to be an Eligible Participant at the time.

The full terms and conditions of the Performance Rights are set out in Schedule 1. The Class L and Class M Performance Rights are on the same terms and conditions as existing Performance Rights in those classes that were issued to employees (including, pursuant to shareholder approval obtained at the 2025 AGM, the Chief Executive Officer) in December 2025.

Trading Restrictions on Classes L and M of Director Performance Rights

The Rules of the Plan enable the Board to impose additional trading restrictions on securities or rights issued pursuant to the Plan. The Classes L and M Director Performance Rights, and any shares issued on conversion thereof, will also be subject to additional trading restrictions (escrow) imposed under the Rules of the Plan, for the following periods of time from the date of issue of the Director Performance Rights:

- Class L: until 12 December 2027; and
- Class M: until 12 December 2028.

Resolution 6 seeks Shareholder approval for the issue of these Director Performance Rights.

This Section 7 sets out further information in relation to the proposed issue of the Director Performance Rights.

7.2 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

For a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The issue of the Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra constitutes giving a financial benefit. Mr Guerra is a related party of the Company by reason of being a Director.

Section 210 of the Corporations Act provides that shareholder approval under section 208 is not required if the financial benefit to be provided to the related party is on terms that would be reasonable in the circumstances if the company and the related party were dealing at arm's length, or are less favourable than those terms.

Section 211 of the Corporations Act provides that shareholder approval under section 208 is not required if the financial benefit to be provided to the related party is remuneration as an officer or employee of the company and to give remuneration would be reasonable given the circumstances of the company giving the remuneration and the related party's circumstances (including responsibilities involved in the office or employment).

The Directors (other than Mr Guerra, who has a material personal interest in the proposed issue, and therefore did not participate in the making of the decision) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of the Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra, as the issue constitutes reasonable remuneration.

7.3 ASX Listing Rule 10.14

ASX Listing Rule 10.11 provides that a listed company must not issue equity securities without prior shareholder approval to a related party or an associate of a related party, or to various other categories of shareholder having a relationship of influence with the Company. ASX Listing Rule 10.12 Exception 8 makes an exception from ASX Listing Rule 10.11 for issues of equity securities to related parties who participate in the issue of securities under an employee incentive scheme with shareholder approval.

ASX Listing Rule 10.14 provides that a listed company must not permit any of the following persons to acquire equity securities under an employee incentive scheme:

- (a) a director;
- (b) an associate of a director; or
- (c) a person whose relationship with the company, or with a director or associate of a director, is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders.

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

As the issue of the Director Performance Rights constitutes the issue of equity securities to a director of the Company, Shareholder approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 10.14 is required.

The Company therefore seeks the required Shareholder approval for the issue of the Director Performance Rights under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.14.

7.4 ASX Listing Rule 7.1

A summary of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 4.2.

As per ASX Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 14), approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Director Performance Rights the subject of Resolution 6 if approval is obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.14. Accordingly, the issue of Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra, if approved, will not be included in the use of the Company's Placement Capacity pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

7.5 Effect of the Resolution

The effect of Resolution 6 will be to allow the Company to issue the Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra if the Resolution is passed.

If Resolution 6 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra. In that case, the Company may have to consider alternatives in respect of Mr Guerra's remuneration, which may include increasing his cash remuneration.

7.6 Board Recommendation

Directors Mark Connell, Shannon Robinson and Davide Bosio recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 6. Given his material personal interest in the Resolution, Mr Guerra does not make a recommendation on how to vote on Resolution 6.

7.7 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 10.14

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 10.15, the following information is provided in relation to the issue of the Director Performance Rights the subject of Resolution 6:

- (a) the Director Performance Rights will be issued to Mr Gianfranco Guerra or his nominee(s);
- (b) Mr Guerra is a Director of the Company, bringing him within the category set out in Listing Rule 10.14.1;
- (c) the maximum number of Director Performance Rights to be issued to Mr Guerra is 1,000,000, divided into two tranches;
 - (i) 500,000 Class L Director Performance Rights, with the vesting conditions being successful commercial launch of the MOSAIC Platform, and the holder continuing to be an Eligible Participant under the Equity Incentive Plan (**Eligible Participant**) at the time;
 - (ii) 500,000 Class M Director Performance Rights, with the vesting conditions being achievement of at least AUD1M cumulative software revenue over a three consecutive month period, and the holder continuing to be an Eligible Participant at the time;
- (d) the current total annual remuneration package of Mr Guerra for the current financial year (1 July 2026 - 30 June 2027, before the issue of the Performance Rights the subject of Resolution 6 is as follows:

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- (e) Mr Guerra has not previously been issued any equity incentive securities by the Company;
- (f) the terms and conditions of the Director Performance Rights are set out in Schedule 1. Each Director Performance Right entitles the holder to acquire a share in the Company subject the fulfilment of the vesting and exercise conditions;
- (g) the Director Performance Rights are being offered as an incentive component of Mr Guerra's remuneration package. The Company has chosen to seek Shareholder approval for the issue of Director Performance Rights as part of Mr Guerra's remuneration package in order to provide a performance-linked incentive component, and to motivate and reward his performance in the achievement of the vesting conditions within the relevant time periods. This is considered a cost-effective remuneration practice and will allow the Company to spend a greater proportion of its cash reserves on its operations than it would if alternative cash forms of remuneration were given. It is considered reasonable given the vesting conditions will align the interests of the Director with those of Shareholders;
- (h) the total value that the Company attributes to the Director Performance Rights is as follows, based on a Black-Scholes valuation model, discounted to reflect assumptions of the probability of the performance-based vesting criteria of the Class L and M Performance Rights being satisfied:

- (i) the Director Performance Rights will be issued as soon as practicable after the date of the Meeting, and in any case no later than 3 years after the date of the Meeting, and it is intended that the Director Performance Rights will all be granted on the same date;
- (j) the Director Performance Rights will be issued at a price of nil cash consideration per Director Performance Right. Accordingly, no capital will be raised from the issue of the Director Performance Rights, as the purpose of the issue is to provide an equity incentive as part of the remuneration package for Mr Guerra;
- (k) a summary of the material terms of the Equity Incentive Plan is set out at Schedule 2;
- (l) no loan will be made in connection with the grant of the Director Performance Rights;
- (m) the Board acknowledges that the issue of Performance Rights to a non-executive director is contrary to Recommendation 8.2 of the Corporate Governance Principles and Recommendations (4th Edition) published by the ASX Corporate Governance Council. However, the Board (excluding Mr Guerra, who did not consider the issue as he has a material personal interest) considers that the proposed grant of Performance Rights to Mr Guerra is appropriate in the circumstances for the following reasons:
 - (i) the non-cash form of the benefit will allow the Company to devote its cash reserves to its operations that it would if alternative forms of cash remuneration were to be offered;
 - (ii) the grant of Director Performance Rights to Mr Guerra will align the interests of the Director with those of Shareholders. It is noted in this regard that the performance criteria for vesting of the Director Performance Rights are the same as for the Class L and Class M Performance Rights issued to employees (including, pursuant to Shareholder approval obtained at the 2025 AGM, the Chief Executive Officer) in December 2025, and that these criteria were determined by the Board to embody appropriate milestones consistent with successful implementation of the Company's plans;
 - (iii) it is not considered that there are any significant opportunity costs to the Company or benefits foregone by the Company in granting the Director Performance Rights upon the terms proposed; and
 - (iv) in forming their reasoning and determining the number of Director Performance Rights to be granted to Mr Guerra, the Board considered the experience and role of Mr Guerra, his cash remuneration, the price of the Company's Shares and the valuation of the Performance Rights, and current market practices.
- (n) details of any securities issued under the Equity Incentive Plan will be published in the Annual Report relating to any year in which they are issued, along with a statement that approval for the issue was obtained under Listing Rule 10.14; and
- (o) any additional persons covered by Listing Rule 10.14 who become entitled to participate in

an issue of securities under the Equity Incentive Plan after the Resolution is approved, and who were not named in the Notice, will not participate until approval is obtained under that Rule.

(g) **Notice of Exercise**

The Performance Rights may be exercised during the Exercise Period by notice in writing to the Company in the manner specified on the Performance Rights certificate or otherwise in the rules of the Plan (**Notice of Exercise**).

(h) **Timing of issue of Shares on exercise**

Following the date of receipt of a validly issued Notice of Exercise and within the time period specified by the ASX Listing Rules, the Company will:

- (i) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Performance Rights specified in the Notice of Exercise; and
- (ii) if admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the Performance Rights.

Also, if required, the Company will give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act (**Cleansing Notice**), or, if the Company is unable to issue a Cleansing Notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A (11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors. If a Cleansing Notice for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 Business Days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A (11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(i) **Shares issued on exercise**

Shares issued on exercise of the Performance Rights rank equally with the then issued Shares of the Company.

(j) **Reconstruction of capital**

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of a holder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(k) **Participation in new issues**

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the Performance Rights and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Performance Rights without exercising the Performance Rights.

(l) **Change in number of underlying securities**

A Performance Right does not confer a change in the number of underlying securities over which the Performance Right can be exercised.

(m) **No voting or dividend rights**

A Performance Right does not carry any voting rights or entitle the holder to any dividends.

(n) **Rights on winding up**

A Performance Right does not confer any right to participate in the surplus profits or assets of the Company upon winding up of the Company. The Performance Rights do not confer any right to a return of capital, whether in winding up, upon reduction of capital or otherwise.

(o) **Transferability**

A Performance Right is not transferable other than in a manner consistent with the ASX Listing Rules and the rules of the Plan.

Schedule 2 – Key terms of Equity Incentive Plan

The key terms of the Plan are summarised below:

- (a) **Eligibility:** Participants in the Plan may be:
- (i) an employee or Director (whether executive or non-executive) of, or any individual who provides services to, the Company and any Associated Body Corporate of the Company (each a **Group Company**);
 - (ii) a prospective participant, being a person to whom the offer is made but who can only accept the offer if an arrangement has been entered into that will result in the person becoming an Eligible Participant under subparagraph (i); or,

- (a) **Offer:** The Board may, from time to time, in its absolute discretion, make a written offer to any Eligible Participant (including an Eligible Participant who has previously received an offer) to apply for up to a specified number of Equity Incentives, upon the terms set out in the Plan and upon such additional terms and conditions as the Board determines.
- (b) **Limit on Offers:** The Company must have reasonable grounds to believe, when making an Offer to which the limit on Offers as set out in section 1100V of the Corporations Act applies, that the number of Shares to be received on exercise of Equity Incentives offered under such an Offer, when aggregated with the number of Shares issued or that may be issued as a result of offers made as covered by section 1100V(1)(b) of the Corporations Act at any time during the 3 year period ending on the day the Offer is made, will not exceed, if the Constitution specifies an issue cap percentage, that percentage, otherwise, the greater of:
- (i) 5% of the total number of Shares on issue at the start of the day the Offer is made; or
 - (ii) such other percentage prescribed by the Corporations Regulations for the purposes of section 1100V(2)(b)(iii).
- (c) **Issue price:** Unless the Equity Incentives are Options quoted on the ASX, Equity Incentives issued under the Plan will be issued for nil cash consideration.
- (d) **Vesting Conditions:** An Equity Incentive may be made subject to vesting conditions as determined by the Board in its discretion and as specified in the offer for the Equity Incentive.
- (e) **Vesting:** The Board may in its absolute discretion (except in respect of a Change of Control occurring where Vesting Conditions are deemed to be automatically waived) by written notice to a Participant (being an Eligible Participant to whom Equity Incentives have been granted under the Plan or their nominee where the Equity Incentives have been granted to the nominee of the Eligible Participant), resolve to waive any of the Vesting Conditions applying to Equity Incentives due to:
- (i) Special Circumstances arising in relation to a Relevant Person in respect of those Equity Incentives; or
 - (ii) a Change of Control occurring; or
 - (iii) the Company passing a resolution for voluntary winding up, or an order is made for the compulsory winding up of the Company.

- (f) **Lapse:** An Equity Incentive will lapse upon the earlier to occur of:
- (i) an unauthorised dealing in, or hedging of, the Equity Incentive;
 - (ii) a Vesting Condition in relation to the Equity Incentive is not satisfied by its due date, or becomes incapable of satisfaction as determined by the Board in its sole discretion, unless the Board exercises its discretion to waive the Vesting Conditions and vest the Equity Incentive in the circumstances set out in paragraph (f) or the Board resolves, in its absolute discretion, to allow the unvested Equity Incentives to remain unvested after the Relevant Person ceases to be an Eligible Participant;
 - (iii) in respect of unvested Equity Incentives only, a Relevant Person ceases to be an Eligible Participant, unless the Board exercises its discretion to vest the Equity Incentive in the circumstances set out in paragraph (f) or the Board resolves, in its absolute discretion, to allow the unvested Equity Incentives to remain unvested after the Relevant Person ceases to be an Eligible Participant;
 - (iv) in respect of vested Equity Incentives only, a Relevant Person ceases to be an Eligible Participant and the Equity Incentive granted in respect of that person is not exercised within one (1) month (or such later date as the Board determines) of the date that person ceases to be an Eligible Participant;
 - (v) the Board deems that an Equity Incentive lapses due to fraud, dishonesty or other improper behaviour of the Eligible Participant;
 - (vi) in respect of unvested Equity Incentive only, the Company undergoes a Change of Control or a winding up resolution or order is made and the Board does not exercise its discretion to vest the Equity Incentive;
 - (vii) the expiry date of the Equity Incentive.
- (g) **Not transferrable:** Equity Incentives are only transferrable in Special Circumstances with the prior written consent of the Board (which may be withheld in its absolute discretion) or by force of law upon death, to the Participant's legal personal representative or upon bankruptcy to the participant's trustee in bankruptcy.
- (h) **Cashless exercise:** Subject to the terms of the Offer, a Participant may elect to exercise vested Options by way of a 'cashless exercise'. - (i) **Shares:** Shares resulting from the exercise of the Equity Incentives shall, subject to any Sale Restrictions (refer paragraph (l)) from the date of issue, rank on equal terms with all other Shares on issue except as regards any rights attaching to such Shares by reference to a record date prior to the date of their issue.
 - (j) **Quotation of Shares:** If Shares of the same class as those issued upon exercise of Equity Incentives issued under the Plan are quoted on the ASX, the Company will, subject to the ASX Listing Rules, apply to the ASX for those Shares to be quoted on ASX within 10 business days of the later of the

date the Shares are issued and the date any restriction period applying to the disposal of Shares ends.

- (k) **Sale Restrictions:** The Board may, in its discretion, determine at any time up until exercise of Equity Incentives, that a restriction period will apply to some or all of the Shares issued to an Eligible Participant (or their eligible nominee) on exercise of those Equity Incentives up to a maximum of fifteen (15) years from the grant date of the Equity Incentives. In addition, the Board may, in its sole discretion, having regard to the circumstances at the time, waive any such restriction period determined.
- (l) **No Participation Rights:** There are no participating rights or entitlements inherent in the Equity Incentives and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Equity Incentives.
- (m) **Change in exercise price of number of underlying securities:** Unless specified in the offer of the Equity Incentives and subject to compliance with the ASX Listing Rules, an Equity Incentive does not confer the right to a change in exercise price (if any) or in the number of underlying Shares over which the Equity Incentive can be exercised.
- (n) **Reorganisation:** If, at any time, the issued capital of the Company is reorganised (including consolidation, subdivision, reduction or return), all rights of a holder of an Equity Incentive are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reorganisation.
- (o) **Amendments:** Subject to express restrictions set out in the Plan and complying with the Corporations Act, ASX Listing Rules and any other applicable law, the Board may at any time by resolution amend or add to all or any of the provisions of the Plan, or the terms or conditions of any Equity Incentive granted under the Plan including giving any amendment retrospective effect.
- (p) **Trust:** The Board may, at any time, establish a trust for the sole purpose of acquiring and holding Shares in respect of which a Participant may exercise, or has exercised, vested Equity Incentives, including for the purpose of enforcing the disposal restrictions and appoint a trustee to act as trustee of the trust. The trustee will hold the Shares as trustee for and on behalf of a Participant as beneficial owner upon the terms of the trust. The Board may at any time amend all or any of the provisions of the Plan to effect the establishment of such a trust and the appointment of such a trustee.

Definitions: Capitalised terms used in the above summary are as defined in the Plan, including:

Associated Body Corporate means:

- (a) a related body corporate (as defined in the Corporations Act) of the Company;
- (b) a body corporate which has an entitlement to not less than 20% of the voting Shares of the Company; and
- (c) a body corporate in which the Company has an entitlement to not less than 20% of the voting shares.

Change of Control means:

- (a) a bona fide Takeover Bid is declared unconditional and the bidder has acquired a Relevant Interest in at more than 50% of the Company's issued Shares;
- (b) a court approves, under section 411(4)(b) of the Corporations Act, a proposed compromise or arrangement for the purposes of, or in connection with, a scheme for the reconstruction of the Company or its amalgamation with any other company or companies; or

- (c) in any other case, a person obtains Voting Power in the Company which the Board (which for the avoidance of doubt will comprise those Directors immediately prior to the person acquiring that Voting Power) determines, acting in good faith and in accordance with their fiduciary duties, is sufficient to control the composition of the Board.

Relevant Person means:

- (a) in respect of an Eligible Participant, that person; and
- (b) in respect of a nominee of an Eligible Participant, that Eligible Participant.

Special Circumstances means:

- (a) a Relevant Person ceasing to be an Eligible Participant due to:
 - (a) death or Total or Permanent Disability of a Relevant Person; or
 - (b) Retirement or Redundancy of a Relevant Person;
- (b) a Relevant Person suffering Severe Financial Hardship;
- (c) any other circumstance stated to constitute "Special Circumstances" in the terms of the relevant offer made to and accepted by the Participant; or

any other circumstances determined by the Board at any time (whether before or after the offer) and notified to the relevant Participant which circumstances may relate to the Participant, a class of Participant, including the Participant or particular circumstances or class of circumstances applying to the Participant.
